Typescript of a diary kept by Joseph Rogers Underwood from 1834-1850, in which he records his activities and family incidents in Bowling Green, Kentucky and in Washington, D.C., where he served in the U.S. House of Representatives, 1835-1843, and the U.S. Senate, 1847-1853. A few entries are made by his second wife, Elizabeth (Cox) Underwood, and one of his daughters. Also includes a document containing information about Thomas Rogers and an "Account of the Escape of Prisoners from Fort Warren, Boston Harbor" written by Douglas Gordon. Page numbers below refer to the pagination of the diary typescript.
