Unfinished Business

Bill 09-06-F Student Representatives Funding

Johnathon Boles read the entire legislation. The author, Jenna Haugen, was recognized. Haugen brought a letter from Destiny Smith, and she apologizes for not coming. We are trying to reestablish our organization. We go to high schools, attend O-A-R, and give tours. We did not have the organization established during Organization Aid; we know that going through Organizational Aid is much better. Boles

opened the floor for Technical Questions. Seth Norman: Where is the money coming from? Haugen: Don't know. Norman: Have you talked with the Administrative Vice-President? Haugen: Yes. Norman: The organization is new, but was previously here. How can you state it as vital? Haugen: It is vital to the Office of Admissions; we are coming back thanks to Destiny. We do more than Spirit Masters. And it is new because it's getting a new breath. Norman: \$631 is going towards boards at high schools, how will that help the students at Western? Haugen: During recruitment last year, we didn't have fancy display boards. 120 students go back to the counties. We need to be distinguished. It will bring more high quality students to WKU. Lucas Humble: What is the current enrollment of your organization? Haugen: 36, we want more before Christmas break. Rob Watkins: If you are vital to the Office of Admissions, why aren't they funding you? Haugen: They are busy with other things like O-A-R. Watkins: When were you reformed by Destiny? Haugen: Last year, our first meeting was last Tuesday. That was when we made the leadership; there was no leadership last year. Kendrick Bryan requested a point of information: Does the Constitution state that organizations must go through Organizational Aid? So if I started a group tomorrow, I could not get money? Watkins: The precedence is no, but it is not written in the Constitution. Bryan: No, it is not clearly stated. Amanda Allen asked: Did you receive Organizational Aid last year? Haugen: No. Allen: Have they in the past? Haugen: No. Watkins: Are you represented by the Office of Admissions? Haugen: No. Norman made a motion to table the bill because we don't know where the money will come from. The bill was tabled and will go through third reading next week.

Resolution 04-06-F Library Serials

Johnathon Boles read the entire legislation. Leah Keys was recognized as the author. I talked to Rob Watkins last week. Bryan Carson didn't write me back. Watkins said nothing has happened to restore. Funding has not been cut. During Questions, Joshua Fries asked: How much money do we want to give? Keys: No money. This is us (SGA) making a stand saying we don't approve with what the University is doing. Seth Norman moved to previous question, there was a second. Norman made a motion to retract to Technical Questions, there was a second and it was approved by the Senate. Jenna Haugen asked: What paperwork? Jeanne Johnson: Word changing, it is new. Norman: What will be changed? Ashley Gore, another author on the resolution: Not restore or reinstate but increase. Norman moved to previous question, there was a second. The resolution passed unanimously through the Senate.
