***ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY***

The Bowling Green Freight Depot was located at 18 East Main Street (the intersection of Main and Clay streets), near the Louisville and Nashville passenger depot, from the 1860's until the early 1960's. The passenger station was moved to Kentucky Street in 1925, but freight continued to be delivered downtown at the freight depot. The brick building included space for the Adams Express Company, an independent freight contractor.

***COLLECTION NOTE***

This collection of items was rescued from the Bowling Green, Kentucky freight depot. Of particular interest are two account books (Box 2) that record freight being received at the local depot; information includes recipient, sender, item description, cost, and freight charges. The collection also includes two "time books" (Box 1, Folder 3) listing workers by name, their position and the specific tasks performed and hours worked, i.e. derailment repair at Mile 76, 3 days, 1887 July 9-11 at \$1.00 per day. Ticket agent S.B. Glenn also records information about day-to-day happenings at the depot in notebooks found in Box 1, Folder 2.
