ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

The Ladies Literary Club is the oldest women's club in Bowling Green. It was organized in March, 1880 after a local teacher, Mrs. T. Sumner Stevens, conceived the idea of a women's counterpart to the XV Club, a recently formed men's club.

The club was formed for the study and discussion of literary, cultural and historical topics at twice-monthly meetings. A year's worth of programming on a particular theme is planned in advance. Membership was originally limited to twelve but over the years has risen to twenty. A history of the club, published in vol. 30 of the *Landmark Report*, can be downloaded [here](#).

COLLECTION NOTE

This collection consists of minute books of the Ladies Literary Club of Bowling Green, Kentucky, together with club correspondence, programs and miscellaneous materials, including historical sketches. The items in the collection have been organized into four series. Series I contains minute books commencing in 1885 (the first minute book has not survived), together with loose papers contained therein. Series II contains annual published lists of programs. Series III contains correspondence, and Series IV contains miscellaneous material and historical sketches about the club, usually produced on significant anniversaries of its formation.
