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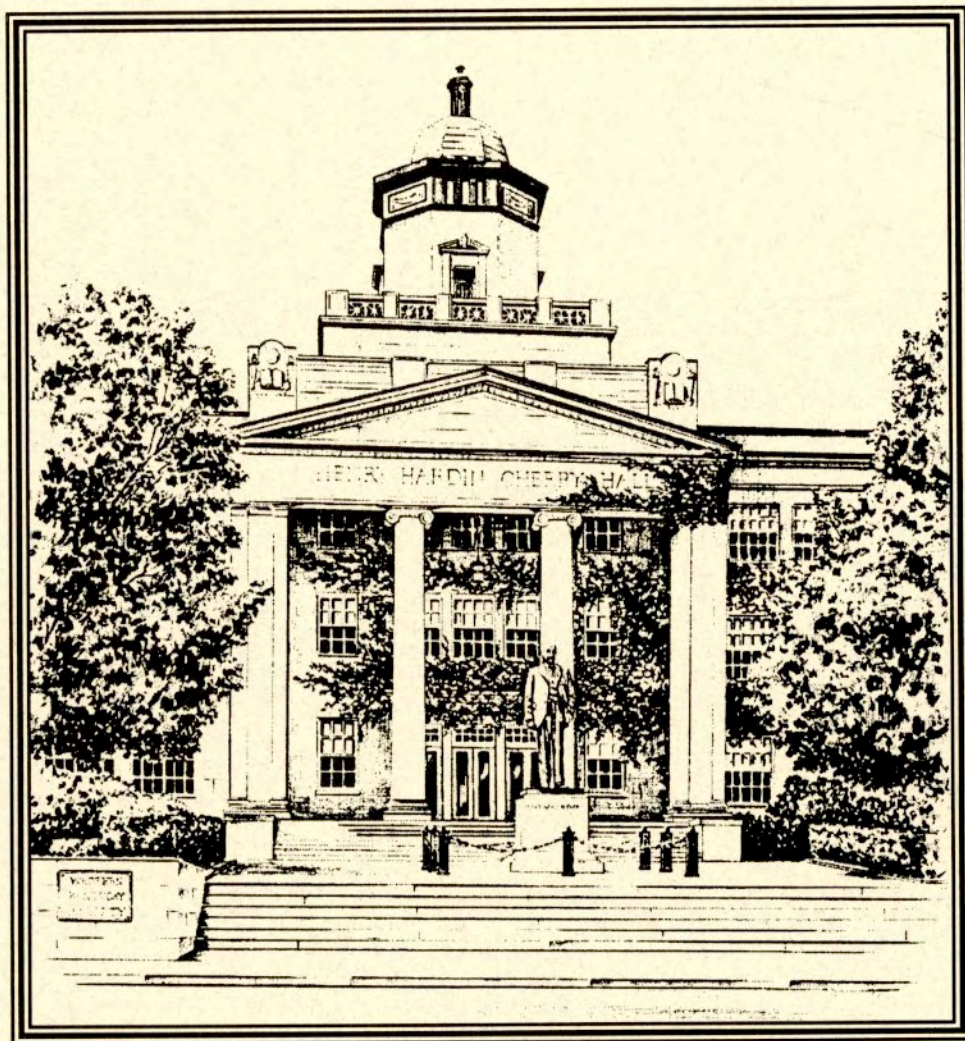

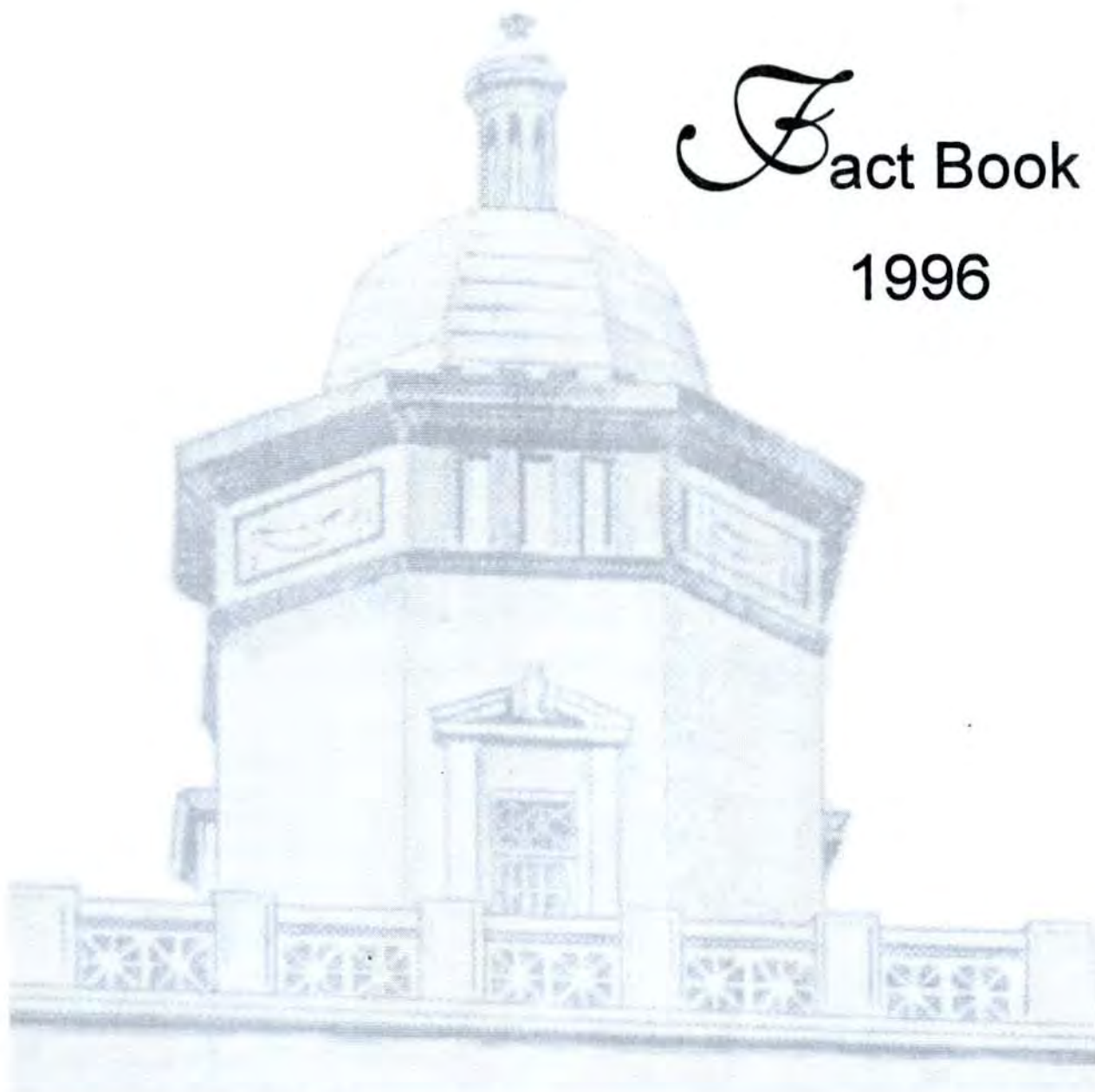

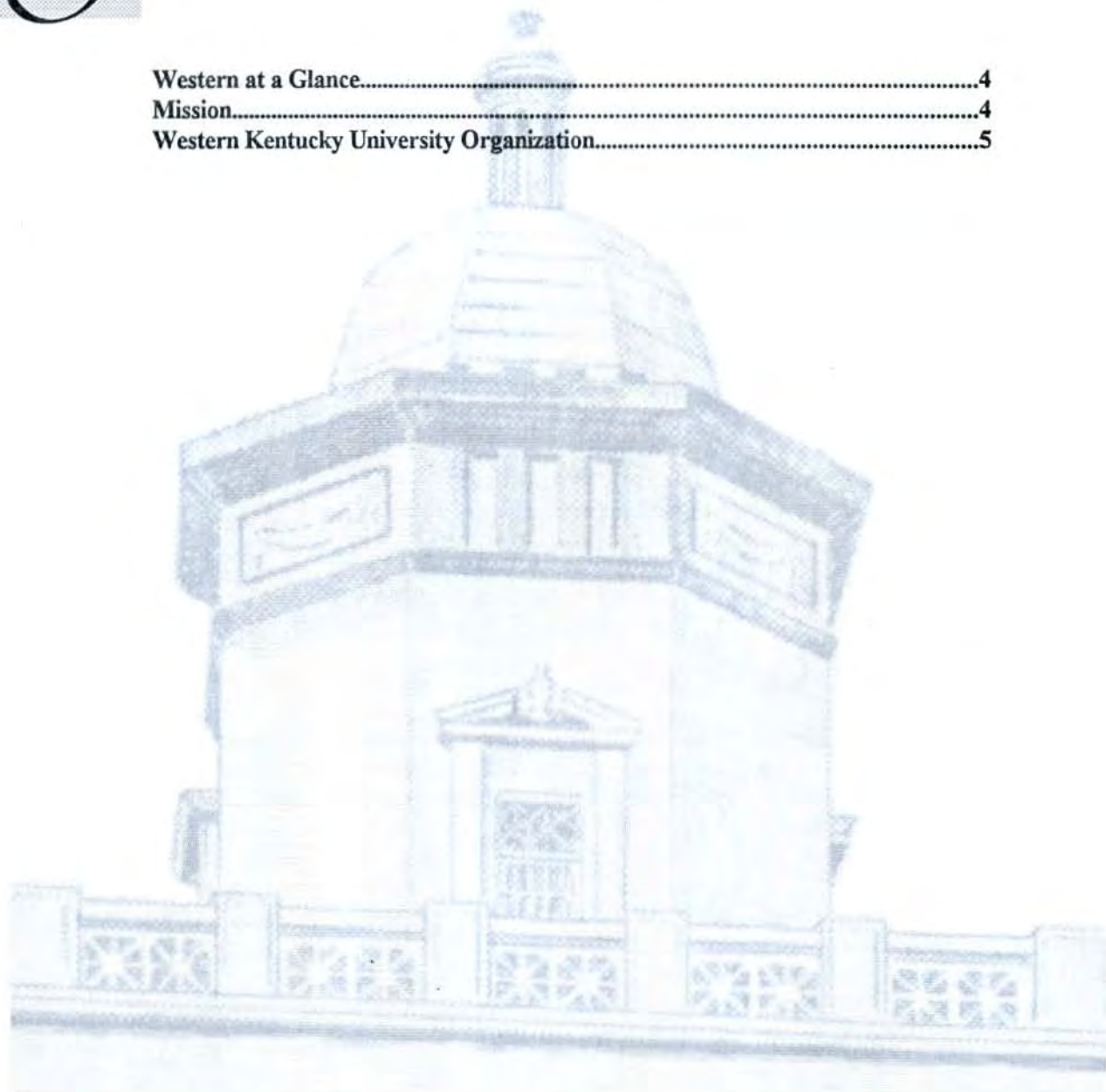

Western at a Glance

Western Kentucky University is part of the public Kentucky higher education system which includes eight, four-year institutions and 14 community colleges. By statute, Western Kentucky University is governed by its Board of Regents. Kentucky has no state-wide governing body; however, the Kentucky Council on Higher Education serves as a coordinating board for the system.

Western Kentucky University is located in Bowling Green, Kentucky, a city with a population of 50,000, and located approximately 110 miles south of Louisville and 65 miles north of Nashville, Tennessee.

Western's undergraduate division provides four-year programs leading

to the bachelor of arts, the bachelor of fine arts, the bachelor of general studies, the bachelor of science, the bachelor of science in nursing, and the bachelor of music degrees. Eighty-eight (88) academic majors and seventy-one (71) academic minors are available. A number of professional and pre-professional curricula provide additional options.

Nineteen (19) associate degree programs are offered leading to the associate of arts degree, associate of science degree, associate of applied science degree, and associate of general studies degree. Five certificate programs are also offered.

Graduate Studies offers the following degrees: the master of arts, master of

arts in education, master of science, master of business administration (fall 1996), and the master of public administration. Western also offers the specialist degree and rank I and rank II programs. Western participates in a joint-doctoral program in education with the University of Kentucky and in cooperative doctoral programs in education, aquatic biology, and fossil fuel chemistry with the University of Louisville.

Mission

Western Kentucky University offers a broad spectrum of instruction, scholarly activity, and professional service within an academic climate encouraging intellectual excellence.

Western Kentucky University provides instruction at the associate, baccalaureate, and graduate levels in the liberal arts and sciences, traditional pre-professional programs, and emerging career areas and professional fields including agriculture, business, communications, education, health,

and technology. The University supports diverse scholarship, including basic and applied research and creative activity, in order to expand knowledge, improve instruction, and serve its varied clientele. The University directly supports its constituents with professional and technical expertise, cultural enrichment, and educational assistance.

Western Kentucky University affords educational opportunities in a climate that recognizes human diversity. The

University is committed to increasing access for both traditional and non-traditional students, and to improving education at all levels. Finally, Western Kentucky University recognizes that its mission continues to evolve in response to regional, national, and global changes.

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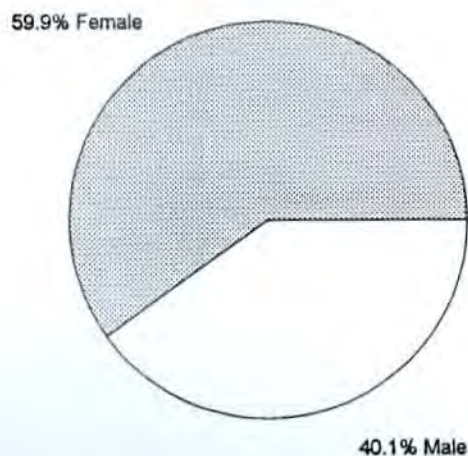

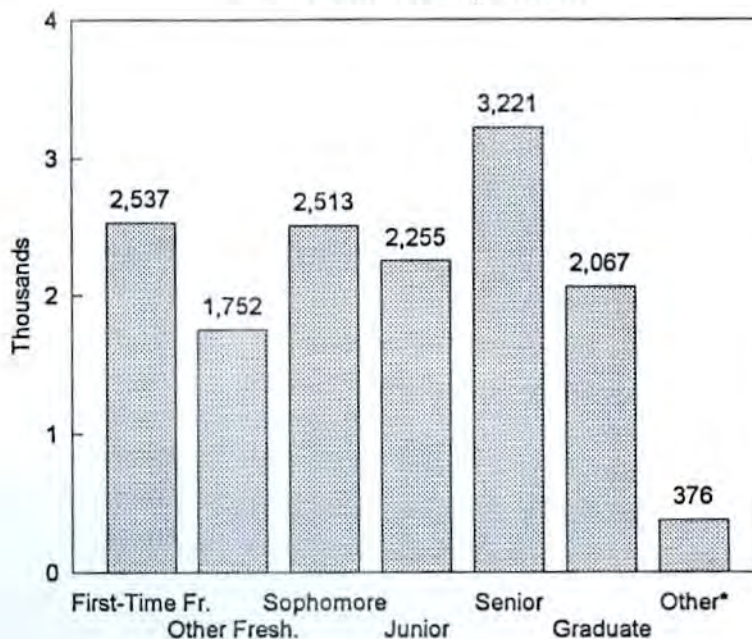

Enrollment by Gender

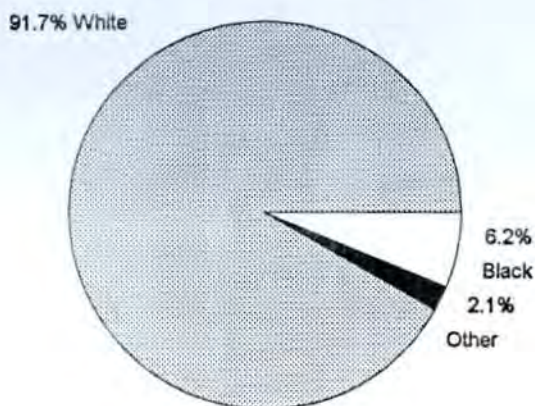


Enrollment by Level

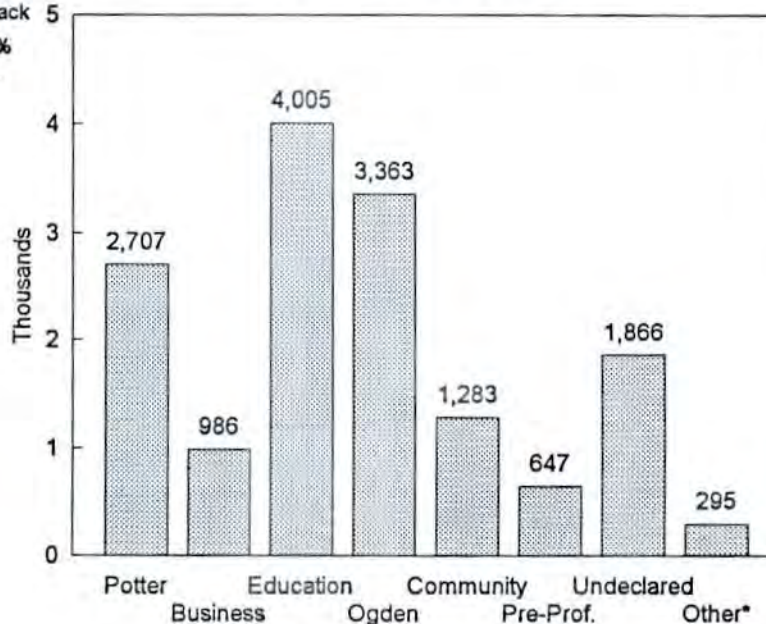

Enrollment by Race

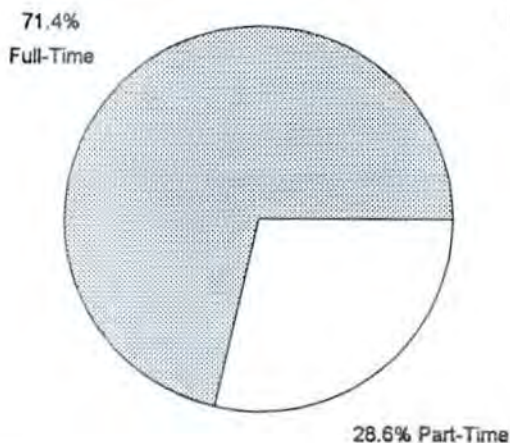


Enrollment by College

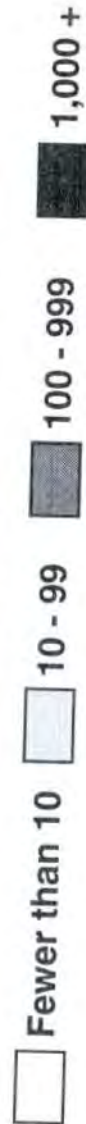

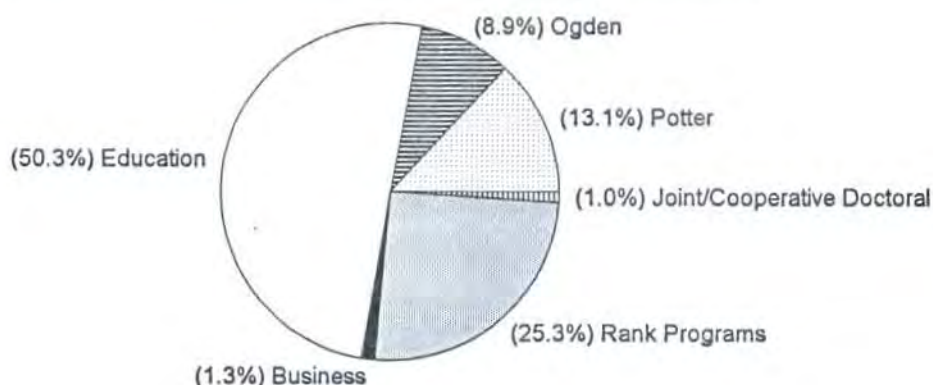

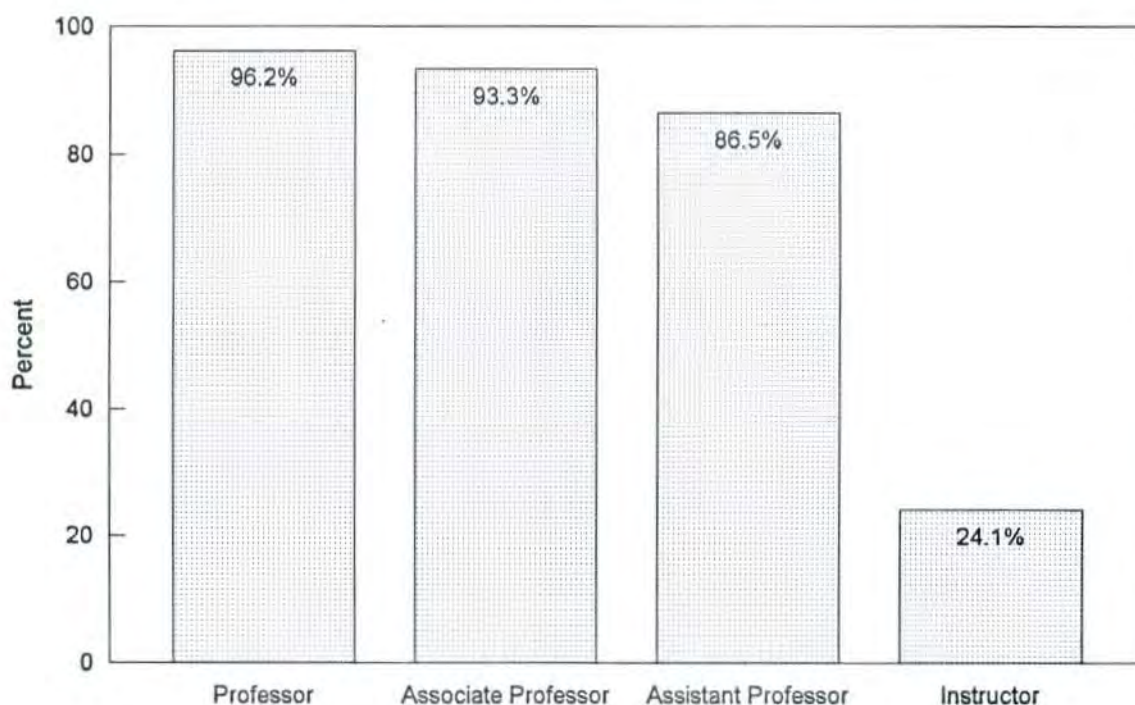

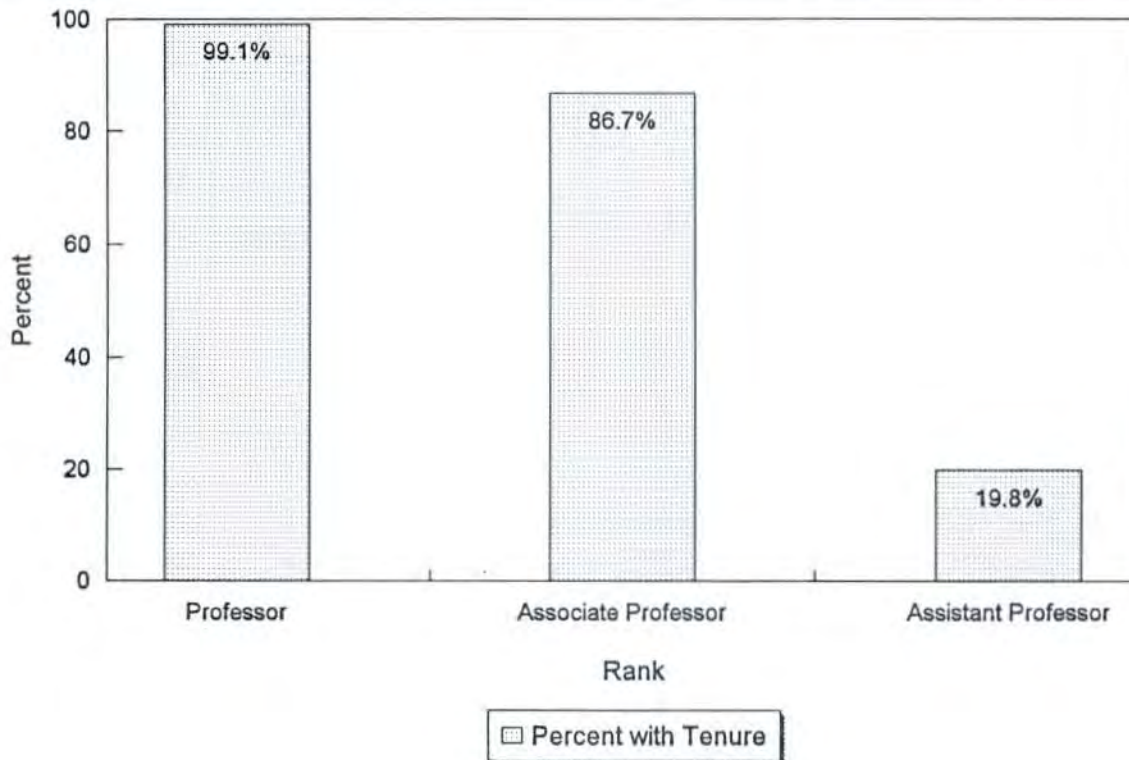
Faculty with a Terminal Degree by Rank

Percentage of Faculty with Tenure by Rank-Fall 1995



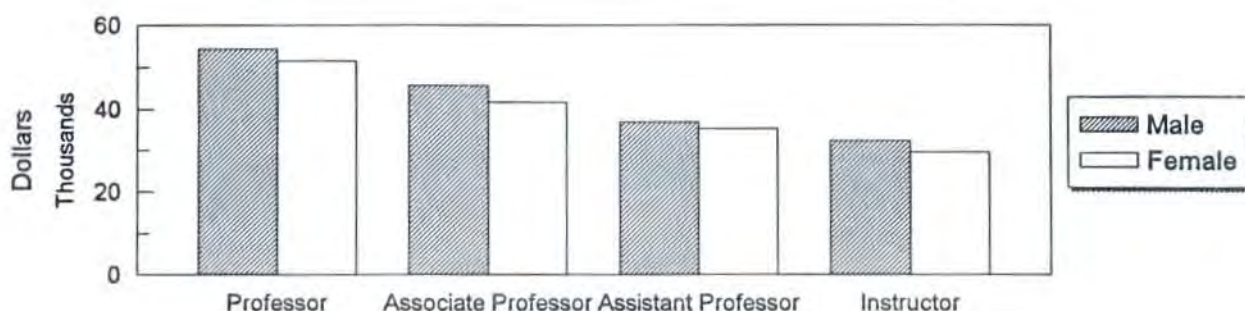

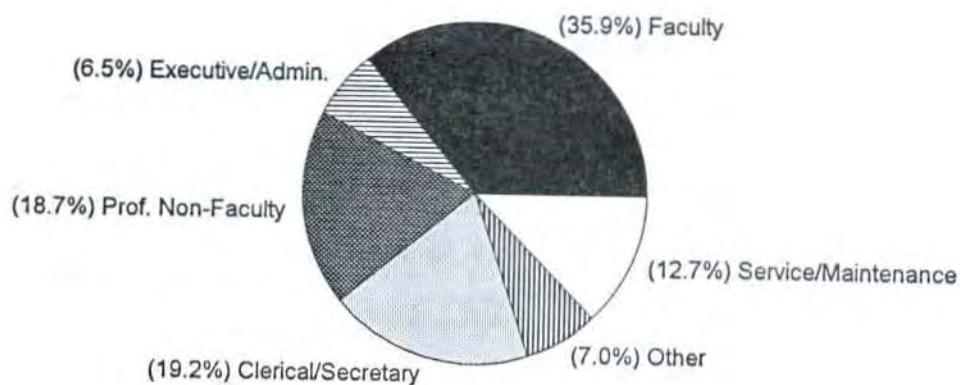

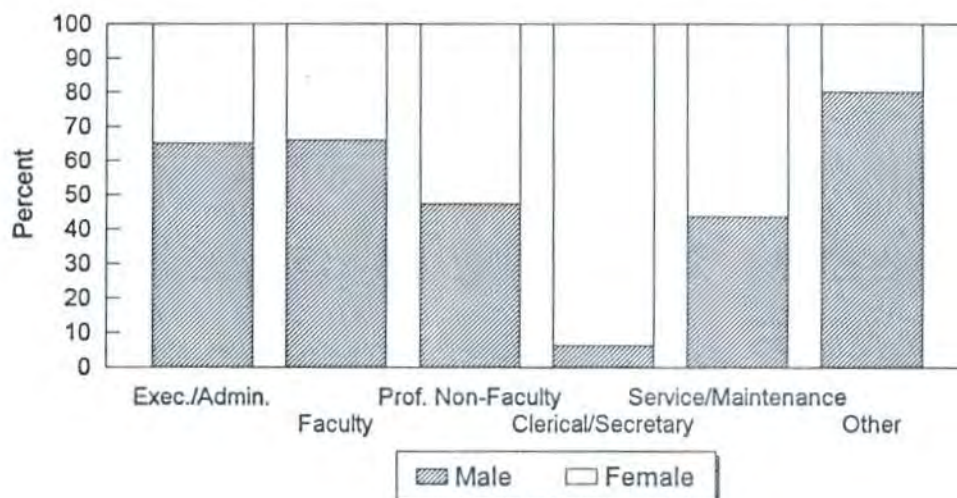

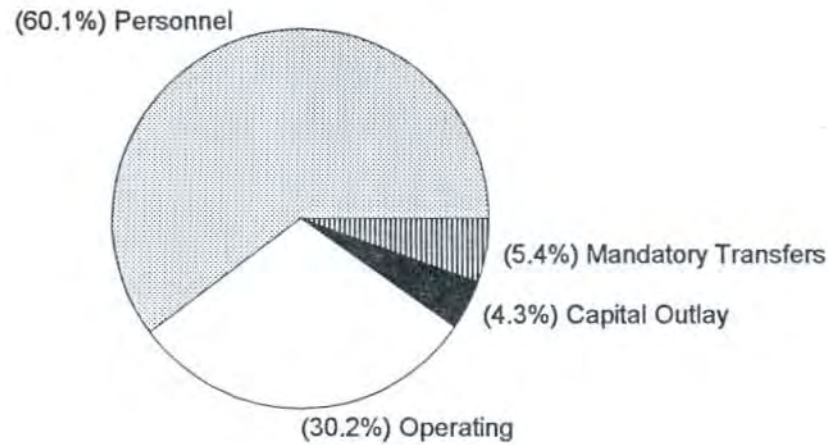

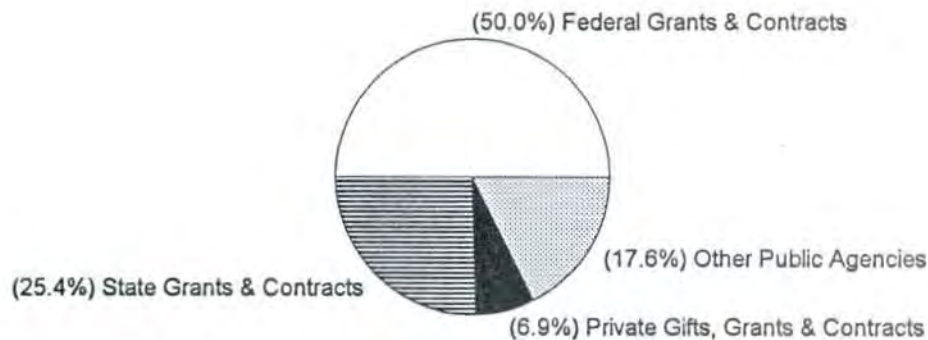

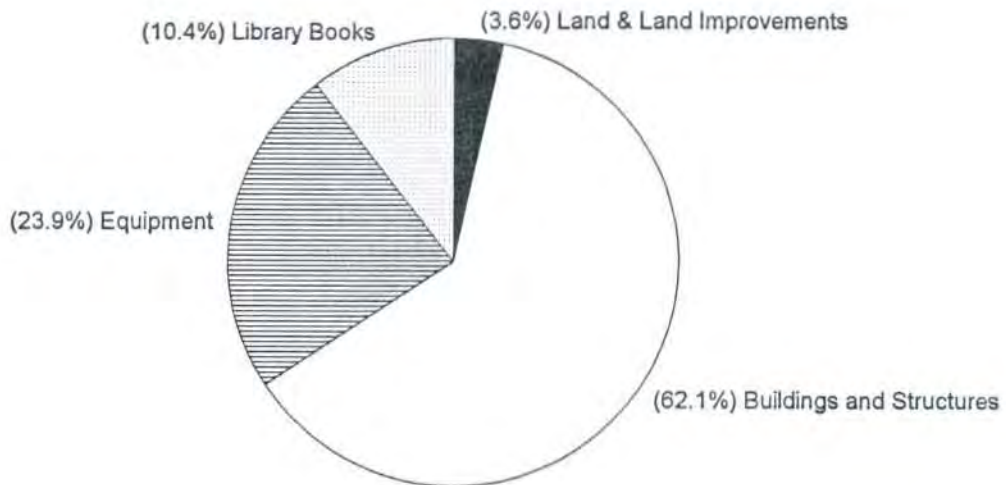

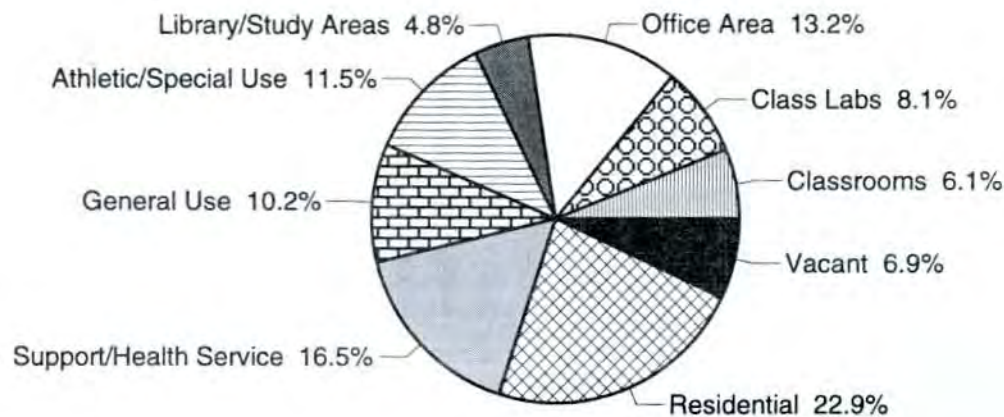

C.J. Martin was named Western Kentucky University's male Sun Belt Conference Medallion Winner - 1995-96.

Amy Delorenzo was named Western Kentucky University's female Sun Belt Conference Medallion winner - 1995-96.

Distance runner Christina Brown was named First-Team District IV GTE Academic All-American and Second-Team GTE Academic All-American.

Golfer Danielle Barker was named to the GTE Academic All-District Team.

Goalkeeper Lee Hunt was a second-team District IV GTE Academic All-American.

Jamie Ritterskamp was named to the District IV GTE Academic All-American Team.

Western had 92 student-athletes on the Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's All-Academic List. They all had minimum grade point averages of 3.0, either cumulative or in their major.

A total of 129 of Western's approximately 300 student athletes (43%) were recognized at the University's annual Scholar-Athlete Banquet for their excellent work in the classroom. These 129 athletes posted 1995-96 grade point averages of 3.0 or better and 13 of them posted perfect 4.0 marks.

The men's tennis team was recognized at the Academic Scholar-Athlete banquet as the WKU athletic team with the highest combined grade-point average.

WKU annually ranks among the top three schools in the Sun Belt Conference in the number of student-athletes who qualify for the league's Academic Honor Roll.

Baseball

The Hilltoppers headed into the 1996 season with the highest ranked recruiting class ever at WKU (29th--by *Collegiate Baseball*).

Stephen Stemle threw 22 consecutive innings without an earned run. He and Matt Idlett were named to the *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-American Team.

C.J. Martin hit safely in 18 straight games, improving his batting average at the time to .447 (enough to rank him among the top 25 in the nation). He was named to the ABCA All-South Team as well as to the All-Sun Belt Conference Team.

Matt Idlett was named Sun Belt Conference Freshman-of-the-Year.

Men's Basketball

The Hilltoppers have finished in the top four in the Sun Belt Conference regular season race each of the past seven years.

Chris Robinson was a *Basketball Weekly* All-American (honorable mention) in 1996. And, he was named to *Basketball Times*' All-Mideast Team and to NABC/Sears' All-District 7 Team.

Michael Fraliex ended his career on the Hill as the best three-point shooter in the school's history; his 84.4% accuracy at the free throw line as a senior (the best mark in the Sun Belt Conference in the '95-96 season) is a new school record.

Hilltopper basketball continues to rank among the top 10 NCAA schools in both all-time winning percentage and average wins per season.

Women's Basketball

The Lady Toppers made their 13th consecutive appearance in post-season play and finished the season as the most productive three-point shooting team in Lady Topper history, setting school records for threes made in a game (13) and in a season (173) while leading the Sun Belt in both three-point and free throw shooting.

Dawn Warner completed her career on the Hill in the Lady Toppers' all-time top four in eight statistical categories; she ranks among the Sun Belt Conference's all-time bests in both assists and steals.

Freshman Heather Mays hit 50.8% from three-point range--topping the old school season record by more than five percentage points.

Cross-Country

Defending Sun Belt Conference champion Nick Aliwell led the Hilltoppers to their second consecutive league championship in cross-country, WKU's ninth Sun Belt Conference title in men's cross-country in its 14-year association with the conference.

Dr. Curtiss Long was named the league's Coach-of-the-Year for the sixth time.

Football

The 1995 Hilltoppers once again ranked among the most potent offensive teams in the nation, finishing the year ranked second in the country in rushing offense and 23rd in total offense. The Toppers have ranked among the nation's Top 10 in rushing offense each of the past five seasons.

Three Western athletes earned All-America recognition: Senior center Brian Bixler, senior linebacker Dan McGrath and sophomore wide receiver Joey Stockton. Bixler was a Walter Camp Foundation All-American at center in recognition of his play on the field. Bixler was also a second-team Associated Press All-American and an honorable mention pick on the Football Gazette All-American Team.

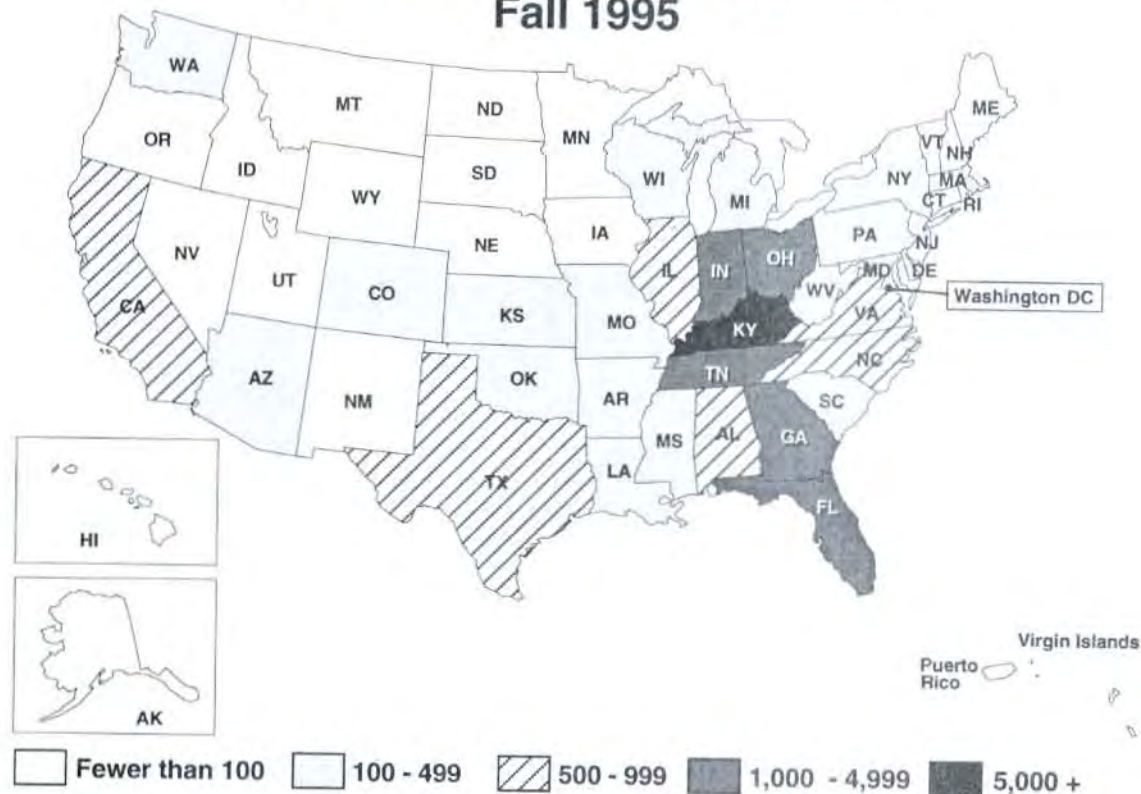

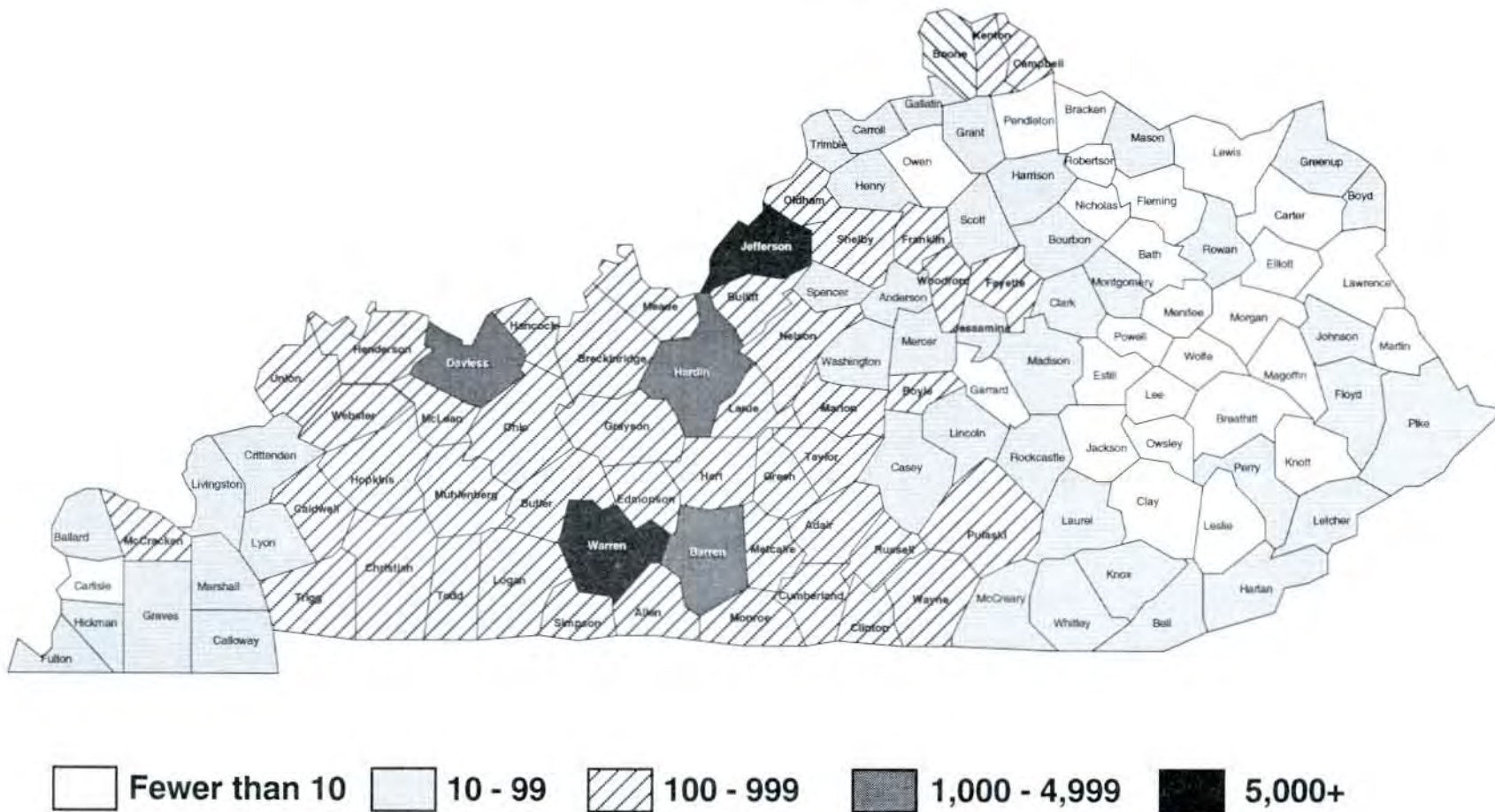
