Upon motion of Dr. Stickles, duly seconded and unanimously passed, it was agreed that the organization ^{should} draft a resolution expressing a sincere appreciation for the interest that Mr. Lorado Taft has manifested and that a copy of that resolution be sent to him. Mr. Whitmer appointed on the committee to draft these resolutions Dr. Stickles, Dr. Jones, Dr. Billings, Miss Woods, and Dr. Wilson.

Upon motion of Mr. Matthews, properly seconded and passed, the head of each department was asked to make a checking and ascertain if the members of his particular staff are not desirous of making their pledged payments before December 8. Mr. Matthews suggested that each member write an individual greeting for Christmas to Dr. Cherry,--a personal message, since the movement has progressed this far.

Mr. L. T. Smith introduced a motion which was duly seconded and passed that a committee be appointed by the ^{Chairman} president to continue the ^{pushing} project of the objective of the faculty which would be the raising of \$2500. The remainder of the full amount is to be raised by friends, alumni, and former students.

Resolved, That we, the faculty of the Western Kentucky State Teachers College, extend to Mr. Lorado Taft a note of sincere thanks for his most generous terms, relating, not only to extending our time and lessening our individual contributions through his own sacrifice, but even in offering to increase the length of the proposed statue of H. H. Cherry from eight to ten feet, by which means he has added greatly to the effectiveness of it at an increased financial cost to himself in both material and effort.

Be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent to Mr. Taft.
