ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

In February 1900, James E. Kuykendall (1874-1960), an African-American native of Butler County, Kentucky opened a funeral home at 819 State Street in Bowling Green, Kentucky. In 1905, he moved the business to Seventh and College Streets. Kuykendall entered into partnership with James A. Boyd, and after his retirement in 1954 the business became known as the James A. Boyd Funeral Chapel. Abel Brothers Funeral Home was established in the 1930s by brothers Richard C. Abel (1904-1970) and Francis S. Abel, originally at 312 E. Seventh Street in Bowling Green.

COLLECTION NOTE

This collection consists of records of the Kuykendall, Abel and Boyd funeral home businesses, photocopied in July 1983 from originals belonging to Gatewood and Sons Funeral Chapel, Bowling Green, Kentucky. The records in Box 1 (1900-1935) generally note only the deceased's name along with the funeral date and expenses. Records in Boxes 2-4 (1935-1970) are more detailed, with additions in many (but not all) cases of data such as birthdate, occupation, date and cause of death, parents' names, and place of interment. Also included (Box 4, Folder 3) is a listing (with index) of interments by section number in Mt. Moriah Cemetery, Bowling Green's African-American cemetery.
