BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

William Paul Hatcher was born 2 November 1929 to Maburn Clyde Hatcher (1882–1959) and Tempye Clay Sharer Hatcher (1887–1971); and he had an older sister, Edna Earl Hatcher (1909-1959). He fought in the Korean War as a member of the U.S. Army and achieved the rank of corporal. In 1955, he graduated with his bachelor of science degree from the Bowling Green College of Commerce, he also attended Western Kentucky University. He was a member of the Bowling Green-Warren County Jaycees and the Hilltopper Athletic Association, and he was also a member of the The Presbyterian Church. He was employed at the Swifty Oil Company which he later retired from. Hatcher died in 2003 and is interred in Bowling Green's Fairview Cemetery.

COLLECTION NOTE

This collection contains letters written to William Paul Hatcher by his family and friends throughout his service in the Korean War. The majority of the letters in this collection were written from Bowling Green, Kentucky, and contain town gossip, local news, weather, newspaper clippings, and photographs of relatives and friends. Box 3, Folder 6 contains newsletters from military units in which Hatcher served.
