Dr. Walter R. Courtenay, pastor of the First Presbyterian church of Nashville, Tennessee, will be Sunday's speaker. The final commencement program for the spring graduates is scheduled for Friday, May 31, with Dr. Logan Hall, pastor of the Meridian Street church, Indianapolis, slated to deliver the commencement address.
