***BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE***

Carlton L. Jackson, the son of Luther H. Jackson and Winnie (Forrester) Jackson, was born in Blount County, Alabama on 15 January 1933. During his tour in the U.S. Air Force (1951-1954), he studied in the overseas programs of New Mexico Western College (1951) and the University of Maryland (1952). Jackson received his B.A. (1957) and M.A. (1959) from Birmingham-Southern College, taught school in Birmingham, Alabama (1957-1959), and worked as a journalist. He received his Ph.D. (1963) from the University of Georgia, and did graduate work (1966) at Exeter College, Oxford. Jackson joined the faculty of Western Kentucky State College (now WKU) in 1961 as an assistant professor of history, becoming a full professor in 1967. In 1996, he was appointed WKU's first University Distinguished Professor. The author of numerous books, articles and reviews as well as novels and short stories, Jackson also held many visiting teaching posts in the U.S. and abroad, including Fulbright professorships in India, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Finland. In 1954 he married Patricia Ann Dow and they became the parents of four children.

Carlton Jackson took optional retirement from WKU in 2001, but continued to teach and write until his death on 10 February 2014. He was interred at the WKU Columbarium in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

***COLLECTION NOTE***

This collection consists chiefly of research, manuscript drafts, and in some cases page or galley proofs, for the following books by Carlton Jackson:

- a. *Presidential Vetoes, 1792-1945* (University of Georgia Press, 1967), a chronological survey of presidential vetoes, their uses, contexts and responses thereto;
- b. *Zane Grey* (Twayne Publishers, 1973, rev. ed. 1989), a literary study of this popular writer of Western novels; and *George Washington: Frontiersman*, by Zane Grey (University Press of Kentucky, 1994), an unfinished manuscript of Grey's, edited for publication by Carlton Jackson;
- c. *J. I. Rodale: Apostle of Nonconformity* (Pyramid Books, 1974), an assessment of the

life and work of this businessman, innovator, publisher, and self-described father of the “organic movement” in the United States;

d. *A Generation Remembers: Stories from the Flu, 1918* (unpublished, 1976), a retrospective on the influenza pandemic of 1918. Inspired by the 1976 swine flu outbreak in the United States, the project was initially planned as a book, then reimagined as a series of articles for the popular press, but was never completed;

e. *The Great Lili* (Strawberry Hill Press, 1979), a history of the song *Lili Marlene* and the attraction it held for soldiers on both sides of World War II;

f. *The Dreadful Month* (Bowling Green State University Popular Press, 1982), an account of the deaths of hundreds of coal miners in accidents in West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New Mexico and Alabama during December 1907;

g. *Hounds of the Road: A History of the Greyhound Bus Company* (Bowling Green State University Popular Press, 1984), written as a social rather than a corporate history of Greyhound;

h. *Who Will Take Our Children? The Story of the Evacuation in Britain, 1939-1945* (Methuen, 1985), an account of the evacuation of British children to safety in the countryside and overseas during World War II (a new edition was published as *Who Will Take Our Children? The British Evacuation Program of World War II* [McFarland, 2008]);

i. *Hattie: The Life of Hattie McDaniel* (Madison Books, 1990), a biography of the singer, radio performer and actress best remembered for her portrayal of “Mammy” in the 1939 movie *Gone With the Wind*. *The New York Times* listed the book as one of the 50 most notable books of 1989-1990;

j. *A Social History of the Scotch-Irish* (Madison Books, 1993);

k. *Picking Up the Tab: The Life and Movies of Martin Ritt* (Bowling Green State University Popular Press, 1994), an examination of this actor and director of “socially conscious” films such as *Souther*, *Norma Rae* and *The Front*, once blacklisted for his youthful Communist sympathies;

l. *Kentucky Outlaw Man: A Novel Based on the Life of George Al Edwards* (Iris Press, 1994), a fictionalized account of this Green County, Kentucky outlaw, written with the help of Edwards’s granddaughter Lucille Perkins;

m. *Befriending: The American Samaritans*, by Monica Dickens (Bowling Green State University Popular Press, 1996), the author’s story of her work founding a U.S. branch of the Samaritans, an organization of volunteers dedicated to the prevention of suicide. The manuscript was edited, with a preface, introduction and epilogue, by Jackson;

n. *Forgotten Tragedy: The Sinking of HMT Rohna* (Naval Institute Press, 1997), also published as *Allied Secret: The Sinking of HMT Rohna* (University of Oklahoma Press, 2002), an account of the 1943 sinking of this troopship by a newly developed German radio-guided missile. The resulting loss of 1,015 American lives is among the highest recorded for a single naval event;

o. *Joseph Gavi, Young Hero of the Minsk Ghetto* (Turner Publishing, 2000), the story of this Belorussian native’s experiences as a partisan fighter and Holocaust survivor after the Nazi invasion of the Soviet Union in 1941. Gavi and his family emigrated to Louisville, Kentucky in 1978; and

p. *Child of the Sit-Downs: The Revolutionary Life of Genora Dollinger* (Kent State University Press, 2008), a biography of this socialist, civil libertarian and feminist whose career

in labor union activism began with the 1936-1937 sit-down strikes at the General Motors plant in Flint, Michigan, where she led the Women's Emergency Brigade in defense of the strikers.

Jackson's research for his books generally consists of notes (variously handwritten, typed, or dictated onto cassette tapes, then transcribed); note cards (the number of which has not been included in the item count for this collection); correspondence with sources, manuscript readers and publishers; notes, photocopies and originals of secondary sources; photographs; and interviews (some recorded onto cassette tape and transcribed, others existing only on cassette tape or in note form). If available, only the most recent and/or complete book manuscript and page proofs or galleys have been retained.

The collection also includes miscellaneous manuscripts, private correspondence, biographical and genealogical material, book reviews, a memoir, and materials related to Jackson's teaching of history at Western Kentucky University.

An inventory is in Box 1, Folder 1.

Boxes 1-5 relate to Jackson's book *Presidential Vetoes 1792-1945*. Research includes note cards, notes on newspaper articles, and compiled lists of vetoes; also included is an unpublished paper based on Jackson's research. Material relating to the relevant U.S. president consists mostly of photocopies from secondary sources and from the *Congressional Globe* or the *Congressional Record*. Photostats made from *Messages and Papers of the Presidents* were of poor quality and have not been retained, as this source is readily available in print and online.

Boxes 6-8 relate to Jackson's biography, *Zane Grey*, and to Jackson's editing for publication of Grey's novel, *George Washington: Frontiersman*. Included is correspondence with Jackson's publisher and editor regarding the first and revised editions of the biography, and correspondence with Grey's children, especially his son Loren Grey. Jackson's research includes notes, copies of letters of Zane Grey and his wife, publications about Zane Grey, and correspondence with archivists, bibliographers, biographers, collectors and devotees of Grey's work.

Boxes 9-12 relate to Jackson's book *J. I. Rodale: Apostle of Nonconformity*. Research includes notes, queries about sources, correspondence with scientists, medical professionals and celebrities concerning Rodale's work, copies of Rodale's personal correspondence and other writings, Federal Trade Commission decisions involving the Rodale Press, and correspondence with Rodale's son Robert. Jackson also gathers details of Rodale's sudden collapse and death during his television appearance on *The Dick Cavett Show*.

Boxes 13-14 relate to Jackson's planned book, *A Generation Remembers: Stories of the Flu, 1918*. Research includes state statistics, articles and clippings, but is most notable for his solicitation of personal reminiscences of the 1918 influenza pandemic. Almost 450 people replied to his queries, placed in newspapers in the U.S. and abroad, with letters and narratives recalling the flu as it struck in 42 states and 9 foreign countries. Respondents wrote of their personal experiences or related stories told by parents or others; some also related their experience during military service overseas. A list of respondents, their locations and the location of their flu experience (where known) is in Box 13, Folder 8.

Boxes 15-16 relate to Jackson's book *The Great Lili*. Included are notes, queries about sources, data on *Lili Marlene's* U.S. copyright (seized during World War II but subsequently restored to its German owners), and details of the book's publication and marketing. Research correspondence (some in German) includes data from *Lili Marlene's* composer, Hans Leip, lyricist Tommie Connor, the family of German singer Lale Anderson, the British singer Anne

Shelton, and others connected with the history and performance of the song; one of its most famous interpreters, Marlene Dietrich, provides brief typewritten answers to Jackson's queries.

Boxes 17-18 relate to Jackson's book *The Dreadful Month*. Research includes correspondence with custodians of mine records, reports of mine disasters and relief programs, notes, clippings and photographs.

Boxes 19-21 relate to Jackson's book *Hounds of the Road: A History of the Greyhound Bus Company*. Included are queries about sources, research notes and interviews (in print and on cassette tape), correspondence documenting Greyhound's limited assistance in the project, corporate histories, reports, trade publications, publicity materials, reminiscences of bus drivers and other employees, copies of legal decisions involving Greyhound, articles, clippings, and photocopies of photographs. Entertainer Steve Allen provides some anecdotes about Greyhound's sponsorship of his 1950s television show.

Box 22 relates to Jackson's book *Who Will Take Our Children? The Story of the Evacuation in Britain, 1939-1945*. Included are research notes (in print and on cassette tape), correspondence, and photographs. Some material also relates to the new edition published in 2008.

Boxes 23-24 relate to Jackson's book *Hattie: The Life of Hattie McDaniel*. Included are Jackson's proposal for the book, articles, clippings, Jackson's notes taken during research in various film archives and private collections, and correspondence regarding sources and permissions. McDaniel's childhood friend Ruth Dermody and *Gone With the Wind* cast members Olivia de Havilland and Butterfly McQueen respond to Jackson's queries.

Box 25 relates to Jackson's book *A Social History of the Scotch-Irish*, but contains only the book manuscript and a set of page proofs.

Boxes 26-27 relate to Jackson's book *Picking Up the Tab: The Life and Movies of Martin Ritt*. Included are queries about sources, research notes, articles about Ritt and his movies, and interviews and correspondence with actors, filmmakers, critics and others who knew or worked with Ritt. Also included is the transcript of a 1977 American Film Institute seminar on Ritt's work, and materials relating to a 1984 film festival and appearance by Ritt at his *alma mater*, Elon College.

Box 28 relates to Jackson's novel *Kentucky Outlaw Man: A Novel Based on the Life of George Al Edwards*. Included with the manuscript and page proofs are clippings, notes, court records and biographical data about Edwards.

Box 29 relates to Monica Dickens' manuscript, edited and published by Jackson as *Befriending: The American Samaritans*. Included is a copy of the original manuscript by Dickens, Jackson's edited version, his contract with the author's estate, and typed notes about Dickens.

Boxes 30-33 relate to Jackson's book *Forgotten Tragedy: The Sinking of HMT Rohna*. Research includes a large volume of correspondence with survivors, families of *Rohna* victims, and witnesses to the sinking; their letters offer personal accounts and related material such as articles, clippings, reports, photographs, drawings, poems, and data on survivor reunions. Where possible, the correspondence has been arranged alphabetically by the name of the individual, whether a casualty, survivor or witness. Jackson also corresponded (in German) with Hans Dochtermann, the pilot of the German plane that attacked the ship. Other research includes official military documentation of the incident such as reports, casualty lists, and statements taken from survivors.

Box 34 relates to Jackson's book *Joseph Gavi, Young Hero of the Minsk Ghetto*. Research includes a transcript of a lengthy interview with Gavi, secondary sources on Soviet Jewry, and clippings regarding Gavi and his lectures about his wartime experiences.

Boxes 35-39 relate to Jackson's book *Child of the Sit-Downs: The Revolutionary Life of Genora Dollinger*. Research includes transcripts of several interviews and oral histories given by Genora and her husband Solomon Dollinger over their lives, Jackson's interviews and correspondence with Solomon Dollinger, the Dollingers' FBI files, and documentaries on videocassette. Solomon Dollinger's manuscript "Raise the Scarlet Standard High" covers much of his and Genora's lives and work.

Box 40 contains manuscripts of other books by Carlton Jackson: *Bittersweet Journey: Andrew Jackson's 1829 Inaugural Trip* (Acclaim Press, 2011); *Journey of Hope: An Historical Narrative*, and *Freedom's Way: From Slavery to Liberty* (Turner Publishing, 2005), two fictionalized treatments of the escape of slaves William and Ellen Craft from Georgia to Philadelphia in 1848; and two novels, *The American Club: A Novel of the Mid-East*, and *Window on the Wood: A Novel of Brazil* (Denlinger's Publishers, 2005).

Box 41 contains miscellaneous papers of Carlton Jackson. Included is personal and professional correspondence, portions of a memoir, miscellaneous writing, reviews and interviews, and some personal items relating to Jackson's lecturership at an Iranian university, interrupted by the Iranian Revolution of 1978-1979.
