September 5, 1857

ORGANIZATION:

Whereas the undersigned believe that the stated means of grace are indispensable to the happiness of the Christian and the promotion of the cause of religion and as these cannot be secured and enjoyed without a church organization.

Therefore Resolved that we organize ourselves into a society to be known as Lebanon Society of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and promise a cheerful compliance (sic) with the usage and regulations of the same dated September 8, 1857.

J. M. Helm then elected to attend the next stated meeting of Logan Presbytery and present a petition from the Society to be taken under the care of the said Presbytery and to procure the ministerial whereupon a subscription was raised for that purpose.

The church then proceeded to elect three trustees for the purpose of holding title to the church property at this place whereupon, Bros. R. A. Read, J. M. Helm and T. C. Carson were duly elected as said trustees.

On motion, Br. R. A. Read, J. M. Helm and T. C. Carson, Trustees of this church were then instructed to convey the upper room, or story of this house to the Sons of Temperance, now organized here and to the Ancient York, or Free Masons jointly.

The following people joined Lebanon Church in 1894. Their church, the First Point Pleasant C.P. Church, located in Little Bend in Butler County, had been destroyed by fire in the late 1880's. Their church was established in 1834 according to the Logan Presbytery minutes and from minutes of Little Muddy C.P. Church showing that their members had "joined the New Point Pleasant Society" in that year.

The first two pastors of First Point Pleasant were the Reverends Hugh Carr Reed and Nathaniel Porter. These people attended Lebanon Church until 1905, when they built the New Point Pleasant Cumberland Presbyterian Church that still exists today.

HAMPTONS OF BUTLER COUNTY, KY.

Though Lebanon Church is inactive, the records are in perfect condition in the safekeeping of Mr and Mrs Paul Hampton of Logansport Road, Morgantown, Kentucky.

While copying the church roster Mrs. Hampton gave me a printed tea napkin from the 1976 celebration of the 100th birthday of Mrs. Ella (Forsythe) Hampton, mother of Paul.

Ella was the d/o Alonzo L. <sup>b. @ 1844</sup> and Melvina (Render) Forsythe; Melvina Render was d/o Robert L., s/o Joshua and Mary (Jackson) Render of Ohio County, Ky.

Alonzo Forsythe was s/o Joel Davis and Irene (Harreld) Forsythe, both born in Butler, and grandson of William Forsythe and his 2nd wife, Elizabeth (Shepperson), widow of James Reed, s/o of Moses and Rachel (Porter) Reed.

Miss Ella Forsythe m/w. Owen Hampton, s/o Granville M. and Beuna Vista (Porter) Hampton. Granville M. was s/o Benjamin J. and Martha Jane (Wilson) Hampton, d/o Wm. N. Wilson and Mary (Martin), d/o John Martin b. 1765 and his wife Mary (Graham) b. 1778. Wm. N. Wilson was s/o George B. Wilson, b. 1764 and his wife Agnes (McFarland), b 1766.

The elder John and Mary Martin, George B. and Agnes Wilson are all buried in the Wilson Cemetery near Morgantown, along with many of their descendants.

According to Butler County Vital Statistics, cemetery head stones, Battle, Perrin, etc. History of Ky., 1885, Benjamin J. Hampton died July 6, 1852 and his parents, Thomas Hampton, Jr. and wife, Julia (Mitchell) Martin both died two days earlier on July 4, 1852.

Thomas Hampton, Jr. (1790-1852) is buried at the old Green River Church cemetery on the Morgantown-Beaver Dam Road northwest of Morgantown. I have failed to inquire about the interment of Thomas' wife, Julia and his son, Benjamin J. Hampton.

Benjamin J's sister, Nancy A. (Hampton) was the first wife of the Rev. Robert Alexander Reed, one of Lebanon's founders and the first minister.

Nancy (Hampton) Reed died and the Rev. R.A. Reed married as his second wife, Martha (Wilson), widow of Benjamin J. Hampton. There were no issue of either marriage.

Nancy and Benjamin's brother, Andrew J. Hampton was a charter member and one of the three elders who was the first to be elected at Lebanon on 8 Sept 1857.

Paul Hampton's grandchildren are the 8th generation to live in Butler Co.
