COLLECTION NOTE

This material was collected or produced by John Bryan “Jack” LeSieur for a project related to the Kyrock community in Edmonson County, Kentucky. The project focused on an archeological project at Kyrock concentrating on two sites: Sweet Springs and Kyrock Methodist Church. As an anthropology student, LeSieur’s topic broadened to include an interpretation of the Kyrock community’s landscape and culture. Kyrock was a planned industrial community that was home to asphalt mine workers. Although several companies eventually mined asphalt in the vicinity, the most significant was the Kentucky Rock Company or Kyrock.

The cornerstones of this project include the photos and other documentation related to the archaeological study (Folders 11 and 12) and the interviews conducted by LeSieur for the project (Folders 2 through 7). Transcriptions of the interviews were done for the all the interviews except the ones with the Focus Group (Folder 3) and Becky Goad (Folder 5). Those transcriptions have been posted in TopSCHOLAR and are accessible by clicking on the URLs embedded in this finding aid or by searching in TopSCHOLAR at <https://digitalcommons.wku.edu/>

The collection also includes two projects produced by other students. One was about childhood traditions in the Kyrock community by Matthew V. Wood (Folder 14). The other was an interview conducted by Dallas John Duvall with Larry Butch Carroll that dealt with Kyrock community history (Folder 13).
