**COLLECTION NOTE**

This collection consists of the US 31E Heritage Corridor Resource Inventory, 21 March 2003, prepared for the US 31E Heritage Corridor Committee and West Kentucky Corporation, Bowling Green, Kentucky by Mudpuppy & Waterdog, Inc., Versailles, Kentucky. The inventory surveys the historic resources of eight counties in Kentucky (Jefferson, Bullitt, Spencer, Nelson, LaRue, Hart, Barren, Allen) and one in Tennessee (Sumner) situated along US Highway 31E (the Jackson Turnpike). The goal of this project, funded through the Transportation Enhancement Program of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, was to identify sites of potential interest to the heritage tourist, with special attention to pedestrians and bicyclists, and to make recommendations for preservation, interpretation and marketing.

Included is the original project proposal and letters of support (Folder 2). The resource inventory itself (Folders 3-4) is organized by county and community and includes historical sketches, maps, illustrations, details of architectural, historic, commercial, tourist and scenic resources, recommendations, and a bibliography. Also included is a brochure about the project (Folder 5), details of a promotional bus tour in 2000, and a report on "The Homeplace on Green River," a proposal to develop a site in Taylor County, Kentucky for "agri-tourism" (Folder 6).
