BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Patrick C. Smith, the son of Holman Cavanaugh Smith and Adaline Moore "Addie" Ferguson, was born on 5 January 1886 in Woodbury, Butler County, Kentucky. He attended the Western Kentucky State Normal School (now WKU) as a member of the class of 1910, but did not graduate. While at the Normal School, Smith furnished illustrations for the student literary magazine *The Elevator*. After pursuing art studies in Washington, D.C. and Chicago, he worked for the engraving firm of Bush, Krebs and Company in Louisville, Kentucky, and as chief artist for the United States Foil Company. Smith subsequently opened his own office and worked as a commercial artist in Louisville. He died in Louisville on 14 February 1973.
