WKU, General Motors and Housing Authority Partnership

Dr. Theron Thompson, Assistant Professor of Elementary Education in the Collage of Education and Behavioral Sciences will direct a GM Foundation funded project for the City of Bowling Green to establish a Workforce Education and Training Project for public housing youth.

A press conference was held on March 25, 1999 in the Board Room of the Housing Authority of Bowling Green and announced a grant from the General Motor Foundation to the Housing Authority of Bowling Green and WKU.


