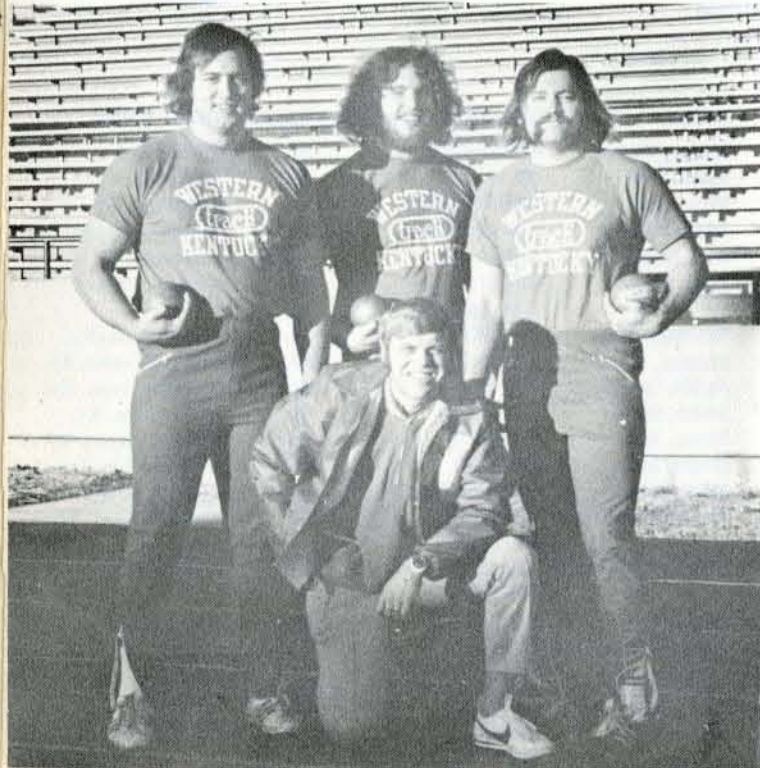

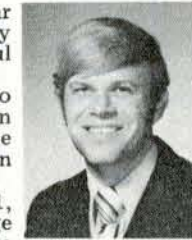

### JERRY BEAN Head Coach



Coach Jerry Bean enters his second year as head coach at Western Kentucky University after a tremendously successful first year.

His 1972 team at Western won the Ohio Valley Conference championship and Bean was elected OVC "Coach of the Year." He also developed a cross-country All-American in the 1972 cross-country season.

Before coming to Western in June, 1971, Bean was head coach at Hastings College (Neb.). During his tenure at Hastings, the Broncos broke all the school's indoor records and 21 of the existing 25 outdoor marks. His 440-yard relay team finished fourth in the 1970 NAIA national championships. He developed six College Division All-American tracksters for the Broncos.

A native of Red Cloud, Nebraska, Bean graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1960 and received his master's degree from the University of Northern Colorado in 1964. He is currently a candidate for the doctoral degree at Northern Colorado.

He held high school coaching positions at Ponca, Nebraska, and Sioux City, Iowa, from 1960 to 1965 and was Nebraska's high school "Coach of the Year" in 1963. He was head track coach at Coe College, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, from 1965 to 1967. He was head track coach at Hastings College from 1967 until he joined the Western staff in 1971.

He is married to the former Diana Kay Gazdik.

### ALAN LAUNDER Assistant Coach



Alan Launder joined the Hilltopper coaching staff as assistant track coach in 1969 after spending two years at Western, the first as a graduate assistant in physical education and the second as director of elementary physical education at the University's Laboratory School.

A native of Minister, England, Launder holds the B.A. degree from King Alfred's College and a diploma from Loughborough College. He received the M.A. degree from Western Kentucky University in 1968.

Launder, a veteran of the Royal Navy, served as head of the Physical Education Department at Wymondham Secondary School, Norfolk, England, from 1957 until 1960 and at Dr. Challoner's School, Amersham, England, from 1960 through 1967.

He coached many of Britain's leading field events athletes and was senior coach of the British A.A.A. in the shot, discus, javelin and middle distance running. He coached the England School's track team which traveled to Canada in 1967.

Launder holds the full coaching award from the English Football (Soccer) Association. He has also produced a series of teaching film loops on track for Macmillan and Sons; authored three chapters of the book, *Practical Track and Field for Schools*; and served as track and field lecturer at the famed Loughborough Summer School.



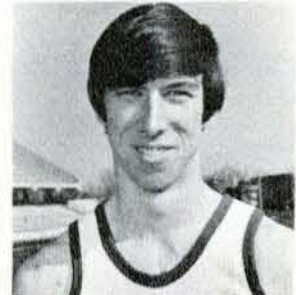

1973 OUTLOOK

Western Kentucky University opens the 1973 campaign in quest of an unprecedented tenth consecutive Ohio Valley Conference championship. Gone from last year's championship team is All-American Hector Ortiz. However, the Hilltoppers return OVC titlists in the mile (Nick Rose), triple jump (Emmett Briggs), shot and discus (Chuck Eneix), high jump (John Reed), and the 440-yard relay (Frank Walker, Clarence Jackson, Mike McCoy, and Waverly Thompson).

"We will be relying heavily on some new faces," Head Coach Jerry Bean remarked. "Some of these are proven transfers and others most promising freshmen," he continued. "We hope to have better quality than in the past, but not at the expense of quantity. Track and field is a team sport at Western and we need numbers and depth to continue a highly successful program."

Outstanding newcomers are highlighted by the Stuart brothers. Jesse and John have thrown 66'2" and 60'5", respectively, in the shot and will give added depth in the discus. Sophomore discus thrower Doug Langdon (159'7") and Eneix (58'4¾" in the shot and 180'10" in the discus) join the Stuarts to form what should be the best weight contingent in OVC track and field history. Talented Robert Ware (9.3, 20.7) and frosh Donald Thornton (21.6, 47.8) join McCoy (47.9), Thompson (9.6, 21.4), and Jackson (9.4, 21.2) to form a strong sprint corps.

Freshmen high jumpers Chuck Durrant and Craig Tonnemacher join Reed for added depth. Cross-country All-American Nick Rose (4:02.5), leads the distance runners and will get help from Ross Munro (4:13.2), Bob Moreno (14:09), Tim Harry (4:12.6), and freshmen Joe Feller, Ron Skillern, and Steve Smith.

Transfer Wayne Phipps (1:52.2), and freshmen David Jagers (1:53.0) and Joe Tinius (1:55.3) should improve the half-mile situation.

Senior John Rice (47.9), quarter-miler and (52.9) hurdler, will join transfer Harry Bartling (48.1), Thornton, and McCoy for mile relay duty. Mike Yates (53.5) and Joey Ammerman (14.2) combine with Rice for hurdling duties.

Footballers John Embree (23'9") and Audrey Johnson (22'8", 46'9") join Briggs in the jumping events. "Super Cecil" Ward is available for triple jumping duties (49'7") and leads the javelin throwers at 213'1½". He also has placed in the OVC discus for two years.

Pole vaulters Mark Norsworthy (15'3") and Bobby Sandidge (14'5") hope to strengthen that event.

This year's schedule is highlighted by a March 31 home meet with the University of Michigan. Home triangular meets with Arkansas State—Eastern Kentucky and Memphis State—Murray, plus the Indiana University dual (away), are also bright spots on this year's schedule.
