### JERRY BEAN Head Coach

Jerry Bean came to Western Kentucky University as head track coach in June, 1971, after four tremendously successful seasons as head coach at Hastings College (Neb.).

His 1971 team at Hastings won the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championship and the NAIA's District 11 title. At the same time, Bean was elected NAIA District 11 "Coach of the Year".

During his tenure at Hastings, the Broncos broke all the school's indoor records and 21 of the existing 25 outdoor marks. His 440-yard relay team finished fourth in the 1970 NAIA national championships. He developed six College Division All-American tracksters for the Broncos.

A native of Red Cloud, Nebraska, Bean graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1960 and received his master's degree from the University of Northern Colorado in 1964. He is currently a candidate for the doctoral degree at Northern Colorado.

He held high school coaching positions at Ponca, Nebraska, and Sioux City, Iowa, from 1960 to 1965 and was Nebraska's high school "Coach of the Year" in 1963. He was head track coach at Coe College, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, from 1965 until he joined the staff at Hastings in 1967.

He is married to the former Diana Kay Gazdik.



### ALAN LAUNDER Assistant Coach

Alan Launder joined the Hilltopper coaching staff as assistant track coach in 1969 after spending two years at Western, the first as a graduate assistant in physical education and the second as director of elementary physical education at the University's Training School.

A native of Minister, England, Launder holds the B.A. degree from King Alfred's College and a diploma from Loughborough College. He received the M.A. degree from Western Kentucky University in 1968.

Launder, a veteran of the Royal Navy, served as head of the Physical Education Department at Wymondham Secondary School, Norfolk, England, from 1957 until 1960 and at Dr. Challoner's School, Amersham, England, from 1960 through 1967.

He coached many of Britain's leading field event athletes and was senior coach of the British A.A.A. in the shot, discus, javelin and middle distance running. He coached the England School's track team which traveled to Canada in 1967.

Launder holds the full coaching award from the English Football (Soccer) Association. He has also produced a series of teaching film loops on track for Macmillan and Sons; authored three chapters of the book, *Practical Track and Field for Schools*; and served as track and field lecturer at the famed Loughborough Summer School.

## 1972 OUTLOOK

For the first time in five years, Western Kentucky University will have a new head of its track program. Jerry Bean replaces Dr. Burch Oglesby, who retired from active coaching with five consecutive OVC titles.

Graduation cuts deeply into the Hilltoppers' quest for their ninth consecutive title. "We will have to rely on a lot of new faces this year to supply depth," remarked Bean. "This depth is paramount to our success in view of the loss of five champions," he continued. "The race will be very competitive and the increasing number of quality athletes in the ranks of OVC opponents makes depth a must for us."

All-American Hector Ortiz in the mile and quarter-mile Tim Gray are the only seniors on this year's squad. Chuck Eneix and Joe Ellison shoulder the weight in the shot put. Versatile Cecil Ward and frosh Doug Landon join Eneix in the discus event. Larry Goodwin and Emmett Briggs back up Ward in the triple jump. Briggs and footballer John Embree will handle the long jump chores. Veteran John Reed and newcomer Roger Chapman head the high jump. The sprints and quarter-mile will be in the hands of Gray, Waverly Thompson, Frank Walker, Les Gerald, Gary Taylor, and footballers Clarence Jackson and Mike McCoy.

The middle distance and distance events will feature Swag Hartel, Ross Munro, Nick Rose, Tim Harry, John Rice and Ortiz.

Hurdlers Buzzy Boehm, Tom Turner, Mike Yates, Harold Spillman, and Mark Scott compete for needed quality and depth.

Cecil Ward and Glen Runcie in the javelin and valuters Ken Welsh and Mark Nonweiler round out the field events.

Five home meets spice this year's schedule and provide an opportunity to evaluate competitive quality in those events which will be run principally by inexperienced squad members.
