Bowling Green, Ky., Oct. 8...Guest artists Ruth Morton and Rodney Farrar will be presented in concert on the campus of Western Kentucky University in the coming week.

Farrar, a cellist and a member of the University of Kentucky music faculty, will play in room 103 of Western's Paul L. Garrett Student Center at 8 p.m., Oct. 11. Accompanying Farrar will be Mary Grace Phillips, a native of Bowling Green and a junior majoring in music at the University of Kentucky.

Farrar, a graduate of Oberlin College, was cellist with the Rochester Civic and Philharmonic Orchestras. He also studied cello at the Eastman School of Music.

On Oct. 15 at 8 p.m., Miss Morton, a mezzo soprano, will sing in recital in Grise Hall Auditorium. She is a protege of Vittorio Trevisan, Italian opera star, and also studied vocal production and technique with Alice Howland Edwards of the Julliard School of Music.

Miss Morton has appeared with the Oratorio Chorus of the Southern Baptist Seminary, The Louisville Choral Union, The Kentucky Opera Association and The Louisville Orchestra. Her performances for the coming year will include a recital at Carnegie Hall.
