NICK DENES — Physical Education Department



Mr. Denes is the head football coach and teaches in the Physical Education department. He came to Western from Louisville Male High School. One of Kentucky's most successful high school coaches, he was graduated from the University of Illinois in 1929 with the B. S. degree. He began his coaching career at Corbin, Kentucky, in 1929, and is the only high school coach in Kentucky ever to win state championships in three sports. He was awarded the M. A. degree by the University of Kentucky in 1937.

DR. T. O. HALL — English Department


Dr. Hall teaches halftime in the English department and devotes the remainder of his time to Western's guidance, counseling and testing program.

He was awarded the Ph. D. degree by the University of Kentucky in 1943. He was awarded the M. A. degree by George Peabody College for Teachers, Nashville, Tennessee, in 1930 and was graduated from Western in 1924 with the A. B. degree.

Dr. Hall was connected with the schools of Kentucky until 1943 when he joined the Veterans Administration as a counselor for disabled veterans. He came to Western from the Veterans Administration regional office at Indianapolis, Indiana.

CAPT. ROBERT E. RENNEBAUM — Military Science



Captain Rennebaum and his wife, Marian, reside on the Nashville Road with their two children, Robert Jr., 6, and Susan, 3.


JOHN STELLA — Art Department
