DR. ALLAN G. ANDERSON — Department of Mathematics



Dr. Anderson, widely known in the field of mathematics, came to Western from Akron, Ohio, where he was associated with the General Tire Company for the past three years. He was chairman of the Department of Mathematics at Dequesne University prior to entering the industrial field.

He was awarded the Ph. D. degree in mathematics by the University of Michigan in 1952. He was awarded the M.A. degree in 1950 by the University of Florida and the B.S. degree in 1946.

Dr. Anderson and his wife, Lucia, reside on the Smallhouse Road with their three children, Jeffrey, 11; Christine, 9; and Patricia, 2.

DR. LUCIA ANDERSON — Department of Biology



Dr. Anderson, wife of the head of the Department of Mathematics, was awarded the Ph. D. degree in biology by the University of Pittsburgh in 1946, the M.A. degree in 1944, and the B. S. degree in 1943.

Dr. Anderson served on the faculty of the University of Pittsburgh from 1949 until 1952. In 1953-54 she was an associate professor at Dequesne University and in 1955 served as research associate with the University of Pittsburgh Medical School.

DR. LUTHER W. BAXTER JR. — Department of Agriculture



Dr. Baxter is head of the Department of Agriculture. He came to Western from Clemson Agricultural College, where he was assistant plant pathologist. He has had extensive experience in industry as well as the teaching profession.

He was awarded the Ph. D. degree in plant pathology by Louisiana State University in 1954 and the M.A. degree in 1952. He was graduated from Eastern Kentucky State College in 1950 with the B.S. degree, majoring in agriculture.

DR. RAYMOND L. CRAVENS — Department of History
