Bowling Green, Kentucky, September 4, 1947--Living accommodations for approximately 200 single men are still available at Western Kentucky State Teachers College as plans for the opening of the fall term here on September 25 are being completed.

The accommodations are in metal barracks located in Veteran's Village and in three quonset units just being completed near the Western stadium.

Western's President Paul L. Garrett in making the announcement stated that a campaign is now underway to secure additional rooms in private homes in Bowling Green and that applications from single women are still being accepted by the college. A few rooms are still available in Potter Hall, but they are expected to be taken up within the next week.

Approximately three applications for every family unit in Veteran's Village are on file at the college which means that a long waiting list of married couples will be carried over for future registrations.

Registrar E. H. Cannon announced that all freshmen are to register at Western on Thursday, September 25. Upper-classmen will enroll on September 27, and classes will begin on September 29.
