The Board of Trustees of Ogden College met in Bowling Green, Kentucky, on Saturday, May 8, 1926, two o'clock P. M. Present: Max B. Nahm, John B. Rodes, William D. McElroy, Carl D. Herdman and R. C. P. Thomas.

Upon motion of Carl D. Herdman duly seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

That the Board of Trustees and the faculty of Ogden College will not grant any degrees, except such degrees as are merited in the college after the proper course of study required for said degree has been completed, and will not confer upon any other person any degree which by a course of study could be obtained in a reputable college of the United States. It reserves the right to confer upon other persons honorary degrees and even then only in such cases to former students of Ogden College and to such persons who have rendered some peculiar service to said College.

It was then moved and seconded that the degree of Doctor of Divinity be conferred upon Dr. J. E. Hampton, pastor of the First Baptist Church of the City of Bowling Green, said degree to be conferred at the annual commencement on June 8, 1926.

Upon motion duly seconded, the Board of Trustees extended an urgent invitation to Mr. and Mrs. C. Perry Snell of St. Petersburg, Florida, to attend the commencement exercises of the College, beginning the week of June 5, 1926, and the resolution was in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

"The Board of Trustees of Ogden College, appreciating the great service and help rendered Ogden College by C. Perry Snell and the impetus he has given said institution by his generosity to said institution, extends to him and his wife, Mrs. Snell, a cordial invitation to attend the 1926 Commencement Exercises of Ogden College, beginning the week of June 5, 1926."

Mr. Max B. Nahm, President of the Board of Trustees, stated a desire to give, annually, a medal for proficiency in science to the student who was the most proficient in science in the College and stated that he would make the presentation of this medal a permanent prize of the College. The Board, appreciating Mr. Nahm's offer, accepted same

and expressed their thanks for this contribution to the student body and to the institution.

The President of Ogden College, Robert A. Burton, stated that all the members of the present faculty would remain with the institution for the term beginning in September, 1926, and ending in June, 1927, and the President and faculty were thereupon re-elected for the coming year at the same salaries, to-wit:

President R. A. Burton, \$2500.00 per annum,
and the use of the residence on the
College grounds,
O. L. Minks, \$1800.00 per annum,
Alvin F. Lewis, \$1800.00 per annum,
J. B. Johnson, \$1900.00 per annum,
William C. Lee, \$1800.00 per annum,
C. E. Martin, \$1800.00 per annum.

The Board then adjourned.
