BIXEL MOVES INTO ASSISTANT COACH ROLE WITH WKU SOFTBALL

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – WKU Softball head coach Amy Tudor has promoted Kayla Bixel from the Hilltoppers' Director of Operations into an assistant coach for the program. Bixel joined the Hilltopper family prior to the 2015-16 campaign.

"I am excited to announce the promotion of Kayla Bixel," shared WKU head coach Amy Tudor. "Kayla is a very enthusiastic and driven person who will continue to bring that excitement to this program. She is a hard worker, loyal and has familiarity with this program. She will continue to serve some of her old duties while adding the coaching aspect to her position."

Bixel, a native of Bremen, Indiana, implemented the WKU Softball Pinch Hitter's Club in her first year on The Hill. The club is a donor program for fans to support the WKU Softball team and receive benefits in return. Additionally, Bixel oversaw the Hilltoppers' efforts in the classroom where the team combined for a spring GPA of 3.52, assisted with recruit visits and also held in-game and office responsibilities. In 2010, Bixel earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education from IPFW and went on to teach for five years in the East Allen Country School District in New Haven, Indiana. In addition to teaching, Bixel worked to receive a Master's degree in education from Ball State University. An assistant girls' basketball coach at Leo High School for six seasons, Bixel is now working towards her Master's degree in intercollegiate athletic administration from WKU and is on pace to complete the program in the spring of 2017.

A versatile athlete, Bixel was a three-sport competitor at the Bremen High School, earning 10 varsity letters across volleyball, basketball and softball. Bixel went on to play collegiate softball at Grace College following high school.

Bixel joins head coach Tudor and Jon Sanders on the 2016-17 WKU Softball coaching staff.

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – WKU Softball has announced its 2016 fall schedule that includes five chances for fans to catch the squad in intercollegiate action on The Hill. Head coach Amy Tudor and the Hilltoppers will play seven games in addition to a pair of intersquad Red and White Challenges this fall.

WKU fall play will open on Sunday, September 18, with a doubleheader against Ball State followed by Evansville in Westfield, Indiana. A week later, the Hilltoppers will face off in the Red and White Challenge I, which is slated for a 1 p.m. first pitch from the WKU Softball Complex. The scrimmage will open WKU's home schedule that includes the remainder of the fall games.

The following weekend, Campbellsville will come to town for a Saturday doubleheader with opening throws scheduled for noon and 2 p.m.

WKU's next contest will take place on Saturday, Oct. 15, against Volunteer State at 6:30 p.m. Kentucky comes to town the following day for another double header with 1 and 3 p.m. starts. Events that weekend will be a part of the team's Bark in the Park outing, which will be highlighted by local entrepreneur Abbi Broadway throwing out the opening pitch of the Kentucky doubleheader. At just nine years of age, Broadway has started her own business in hopes of raising money to afford a service dog she needs to help deal with life altering seizures. MATT WILHITE RETURNS TO THE HILL AS ASSISTANT SOFTBALL COACH

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – Former Hilltopper Baseball relief pitcher Matt Wilhite has returned to The Hill as an assistant coach with the WKU softball program, as announced by head coach Amy Tudor on Thursday.

“It is amazing to see how this door opened and it is with great pleasure and thankfulness to announce the hiring of Coach Wilhite,” Tudor shared. “Matt and his family are a great addition to our program and I’m excited they have decided to join WKU Softball. Coach Wilhite is a winner on and off the field and WKU Softball welcomes him and his family back to The Hill; it is a good day to be a Hilltopper.”

After earning All-American status following his senior campaign at WKU, Wilhite went on to an eight-year professional baseball career. The Franklin, Kentucky, native spent much of his professional career within the Angels’ organization before joining the Colorado Rockies’ system for a couple seasons. Wilhite finished with a career record of 28-20 while sporting a 4.68 ERA in 369 professional appearances. The right-handed pitcher also registered 23 saves and 341 strikeouts during his career. Since 2012 until his hire at WKU, Wilhite taught and coached at Franklin-Simpson High School, his former school. During that stretch, the Lady Wildcats softball squad recorded four-consecutive District 13 championships. Wilhite was named the Region 4 Coach of the Year following FSHS’s 22-12 season that included a perfect 8-0 mark in district play in 2014.

“I am thrilled at the opportunity Coach Tudor and WKU have provided me with being an assistant coach,” said Wilhite. “This school holds a special place in my heart as well as my family’s. I am excited to both work with this talented group of young ladies that we have on our softball team, and help bring another Conference USA championship to this program.”

“I believe Coach Tudor, Coach [Kayla] Bixel and myself can make this one of the premier softball programs in Conference USA, to give us a chance to compete for a championship and get us to those regional appearances with a chance to one day get to a College World Series,” Wilhite concluded. During his time as a student-athlete at WKU, Wilhite etched his name all over the baseball record book, ranking first in three different top-10 categories. Wilhite owns the record for single-season appearances with 37 games played during the 2003 season and ranks third on the same list with 33 appearances the season prior. Also during the 2003 campaign, Wilhite recorded 11 saves, which ranks second on the single-season top-10 list.

With 23 career saves from 2000-2003, Wilhite owns the WKU career record in the category. The four-year baseball letterwinner also continues to hold the top spot on the career appearances top-10 list with 110. Wilhite collected numerous accolades, including becoming the first relief pitcher to be named the Sun Belt Conference Pitcher of the Year in 2003 and an All-SBC First Team relief pitcher in both 2002 and 2003, also collecting All-South Central Region Team honors those seasons.

Franklin, Kentucky, continues to be called home by Wilhite, who resides there with his wife Dyan and daughters Ellyson (5) and Owenn (3).

TUDOR INKS SIX TO SIGNING CLASS OF 2017-18

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. — WKU Softball head coach Amy Tudor has announced that six future Hilltoppers have inked National Letters of Intent to join the program in the fall of 2017. This class of signees owns a decorated resume and includes five newcomers that account for eight all-state selections in their respective states. Coming to The Hill in the fall of 2017 are Madeline Bowlds (Utica, Ky.), Annabelle Brown (Rainsville, Ala.), Taylor Graven (Greene, Iowa), Shelby Nunn (Bowling Green, Ky.), Kendall Smith (Bowling Green, Ky.) and Jordan Thomas (Lebanon, Ky.).

“Talented, smart, and diverse is how I would describe this class,” said Tudor. “I believe each of these signees can have an immediate impact upon their arrival to WKU. I expect big things from this class.”

Madeline Bowlds | Utica, Ky. | Daviess County H.S. | First Base | L/L

Madeline Bowlds is a four-time all-district selection out of Utica, Kentucky, who opted to stay in-state and continue her softball career on The Hill. The Daviess County High School first baseman has played on the high school squad for seven seasons and most recently in 2016 guided the unit to a fourth place finish in the state tournament. Bowlds is also a two-time all-region selection and earned All-State Academic Honorable Mention during her junior campaign.

Coach Tudor on Bowlds: “I first was impressed with Maddie’s ability at camp and continued to follow her and eventually recruited her. Maddie can run, swing and slap; she is a lefty first baseman who also can play outfield. Her versatility both at the plate and in the field will fulfill a big need in our lineup.”

Annabelle Brown | Rainsville, Ala. | Plainview H.S. | Shortstop | R/R

Annabelle Brown is a five-time all-county tournament team selection in addition to being named to the Alabama Sports Writers Association (ASWA) All-State Team following her junior season. Most recently in 2016, Brown was named the all-county tournament MVP. The right-handed shortstop hails from Rainsville, Alabama, and was also an all-region selection for her efforts during her sophomore campaign.

Coach Tudor on Brown: “Annabelle Brown is an athlete who will play middle infield for us. She throws, runs and hits well. I am looking forward to the impact she will make both offensively and defensively.”

Taylor Graven | Greene, Iowa | North Butler H.S. | Pitcher | R/R

As Tudor signs her fourth class at the helm of the WKU Softball program, she also inked the fourth pitcher out of Iowa in as many classes in North Butler High School’s Taylor Graven. The Greene, Iowa, native is a two-time first-team all-state selection who was also tabbed as the 2016 Mason City Globe Gazette Player of the Year. Additionally, Graven was named her conference’s (Top of Iowa Conference) Player of the Year following her junior campaign. The three-time North Butler team MVP was also named a two-time unanimous first-team all-conference pitcher honoree.

Coach Tudor on Graven: “Gravin is a right-handed pitcher who will throw both up and down in the zone with a different change up than our returning pitchers. She will provide a different look and add depth to our young pitching staff. Taylor is used to winning and that mentality will help both her and this program.”

Shelby Nunn | Bowling Green, Ky. | South Warren H.S. | Utility | R/R

Despite sitting out during the 2016 season due to shoulder surgery, Shelby Nunn brings a resume full of both athletic and academic accolades to WKU. The South Warren High School utility player has elected to stay home in Bowling Green and play softball on The Hill. Nunn is a three-time first-team academic all-state honoree that was also tabbed as her region’s Preseason Top Player for the past three seasons. Following her most recent year of competition (2015), Nunn was named to the Kentucky Class 2A All-State Second Team. The righty is also a three-time all-district selection.

Coach Tudor on Nunn: “Shelby, like Kendall Smith, is a product of Bowling Green. Being local, she came to a lot of our camps before a shoulder surgery set her back a bit. However, her loyalty to me and to WKU is what impressed me in addition to her ability to swing and play multiple positions.”

Kendall Smith | Bowling Green, Ky. | Warren East H.S. | Catcher | R/R

Another local product in Kendall Smith has elected to stay close to home and head to The Hill to continue her softball career. Smith is a three-time all-state selection including two first-team nods in three years of prep softball. The right-handed catcher is the two-time defending Culvers’ Player of the Year and ranks 69th on Flo Softball’s top-100 in class of 2017 list. Smith was also named the 4th Region Player of the Year following her sophomore campaign.

Coach Tudor on Smith: “Smith was my first commitment in this class and I think she has the ability to do big things at the plate and behind the plate. She is a very strong and athletic kid who I believe has the potential to be a “wow” player.”

Jordan Thomas | Lebanon, Ky. | Bethlehem H.S. | Outfield | L/L

Jordan Thomas is a multi-sport athlete out of Lebanon, Kentucky, that will join WKU Softball as an outfielder in the fall of 2017. The lefty was a six-year varsity starter and is a three-time academic all-state selection entering her final prep season. Prior to her junior campaign, Thomas transferred from Marion County H.S. to Bethlehem H.S. where she was named a second-team all-state honoree following her junior campaign. She has also been named to the All-5th Region Team the past three seasons.

Coach Tudor on Thomas: “Jordan is a left-handed hitter with both power and speed. She is very athletic and a smart player who will provide speed in the outfield and on the bases. She will be a fun player to coach and watch.”

WKU SOFTBALL ANNOUNCES 55-GAME SPRING SLATE

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. — Head coach Amy Tudor and the WKU Softball program announced the squad's upcoming 2017 schedule on Friday. The challenging slate not only features the defending national champions (Oklahoma), but seven teams in total that made appearances in the 2016 NCAA Tournament and put together a combined record of 17-13 in NCAA postseason contests.

In total, the Hilltoppers have 55 games on their slate including four regular season tournaments, 11 doubleheaders and eight series against C-USA opponents.

WKU Softball will take on at least 31 different teams in 2017 with the potential for more based on results during tournament play. Of the 31 squads, 16 sported winning records with 14 going for 30 or more wins last season.

WKU will open the spring on the road at the Bulldog Kickoff in Starkville, Mississippi, where the Red and White will get five games in the books. The following two weekends, WKU Softball will host both the Hilltopper Classic and Hilltopper Spring Fling to combine for nine home tilts. The first of the home games (February 18) is against the reigning MAC champion, Miami (OH), that picked up a win in the NCAA Tournament a year ago.

Following two weekends in Bowling Green, the Hilltopper squad will head to Norman, Oklahoma, for five games in the Courtyard Marriott Tournament. WKU will get a crack at last season's NCAA national champions, the host Sooners, a squad that put together a 57-8 record and won the Big 12 Championship a year ago. The final two tilts in Oklahoma are against opposition based on play in the tournament.

With all four early season tournaments in the books, the WKU sluggers will return to The Hill for a doubleheader with Bowling Green (March 8) to open a stretch that includes 13 games in 15 days.

Hitting the road again, WKU Softball will head to Middle Tennessee to open Conference USA action. With 12 teams across two divisions, the Hilltoppers will play all five teams from the East Division and three random teams from the West Division each in three-game series.

Following the three-game series at Middle Tennessee, WKU will head to Samford (40-20) and Jacksonville State (43-17), a pair of teams that put together 40-plus wins in 2016 and made NCAA Tournament appearances. That weekend (March 18), the Hilltoppers return home and host the defending C-USA champions in Florida Atlantic (51-9), a squad that did not lose a game on the road in 2016 (14-0).

A doubleheader at Lipscomb, a series at Marshall and a tilt versus Murray State on The Hill will close out the action in March for the Hilltoppers.

WKU Softball will suit up 17 times in the month of April, opening the month at home against UAB, the second-best team in the West Division in 2016. Three days later, the Hilltoppers will head down the road to Lexington to take on Kentucky (46-14), a squad that took second in the SEC last season and put together a 3-2 record in NCAA Tournament games.

For the first time since February, WKU Softball will go nearly a week without competition, playing a series at UTEP on April 8-9 followed by hosting Charlotte for a series on April 14-15. The Hilltoppers will stay in the state for the midweek tilt at Louisville on April 19. The Cardinals put together a 35-17 record in 2016, finishing second in the ACC regular-season standings and earning an NCAA bid.

The final regular season games on The Hill during the 2017 slate will be when the West Division's top team in 2016, Southern Miss, comes to come from April 22-23. WKU will close conference play the following weekend at FIU before closing regular-season action May 3 with a double feature at Eastern Kentucky.
