LADY TOPPER TENNIS OPENS SPRING SEASON AT [RV] KENTUCKY

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – WKU women's tennis is set to open its spring campaign at 2018 NCAA Tournament team [RV] Kentucky on Friday. The match will begin at 2 p.m. CT at the Hilary J. Boone Tennis Complex in Lexington, Ky.

In 2018, Kentucky tied for seventh in the final SEC standings, finishing the season 14-11 overall and 6-7 in conference play. The SEC ended the last spring season with six schools in the ITA Top 25 rankings, with Kentucky sitting just outside at No. 26.

"Kentucky head coach Carlos Drada always puts a physical and athletically talented team on the court year in and year out," said WKU head coach Greg Davis on the Wildcats. "I believe he has a top twenty team and maybe better this year so we will have our hands full at our opening match but we are looking forward to the challenge."

WKU finished with a record of 9-8 in the 2018 spring season and earned the second-best conference tournament finish in program history. The Red and White were 3-2 on neutral courts and won by three or more points in six of its nine victories.

Junior Lisa Friess is WKU's only returning player, coming back to the Lady Toppers after playing at Eastern Kentucky in 2018. In her freshman year at WKU, Friess was 4-1 in the spring season, playing all five matches from the No. 6 spot.

Coach Davis will be making his WKU spring season debut along with the Lady Topper newcomers. "We are looking forward to the beginning of a new era this Friday at Kentucky," said Davis. "We have been working since the fall to establish a culture and build a strong foundation for years to come with the program. A foundation built on good decision making, fitness and competing at a high level from the start of the match till the end."

WKU FALLS TO [RV] KENTUCKY IN SPRING DEBUT

LEXINGTON, Ky. – Lady Topper Tennis opened its spring campaign on Friday at [RV] Kentucky. The 2018 NCAA Tournament contender proved to be too much for WKU as the Lady Toppers fell 6-0 at the Hilary J. Boone Tennis Center.

In the doubles round, the Lady Toppers played in pairs commonly seen during the fall season.

Sophomore Laura Bernardos and junior Lisa Friess played in the leading position while freshmen Zeniece Charles-Hall and Judit Gonzalez Agud competed in the No. 2 spot.

Both duos were able to pick up two games in their matches against the Wildcats. Kentucky defeated WKU 6-2 in each match, clinching the doubles point.

Moving to singles action, junior Lucia Diaz Saez finished her No. 3 match shortly followed by Gonzalez Agud in the fourth spot. Both Lady Toppers were defeated by Wildcats 6-0, 6-0.

Spanish native Bernardos led WKU in the top spot, winning a total of four games against her Kentucky opponent. The sophomore ultimately fell 6-1, 6-3.

Friess was defeated by a Wildcat in the second position, falling 6-1, 6-0. Charles-Hall wrapped up the match, winning four games in her 6-1, 6-3 defeat.

The Red and White will take a week off before returning to action at Austin Peay on Saturday, January 26.

LADY TOPPERS HEAD TO NKU LOOKING TO CONTINUE STRONG START

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. — WKU Tennis looks to build upon its strong start to the 2020 season, as the Lady Toppers hit the road to face Northern Kentucky on Saturday, Jan. 25 at 3:30 p.m. CT. With a win, WKU would start the season with a 4-0 record for the first time since 2010, but it won't be easy.

"Northern Kentucky is a very experienced and deep team. We had a very difficult match at NKU last year and they will be a very formidable opponent again," head coach Greg Davis said. "We're really stressing getting contributions from the whole team every match and feel that's the key for us to have success this year."

Reigning Conference USA Athlete of the Week Cora-Lynn von Dungern helped lead the Lady Toppers to an opening weekend sweep of Butler, Western Illinois and IUPUI in Indianapolis. She went 3-0 at the No. 1 singles position and 2-0 at No. 1 doubles with partner Lisa Friess.

Friess at No. 4 and Laura Bernardos at the No. 3 spot also went 3-0 in singles play, while Tristen Bryant-Otake, Zoe Wende and Laura Diaz Saez each contributed a singles victory over the weekend.

The Norse started their 2020 season last weekend with a 5-2 loss at Kentucky, followed by a 6-1 win at Dayton. The Lady Toppers have a 2-2 all-time head-to-head record against NKU, most recently a 6-1 loss on Feb. 22, 2019. WKU's most recent victory in the series was a 6-1 result on Feb. 13, 2013.

FRIESS STAYS UNDEFEATED, LADY TOPPERS DROP FIRST MATCH OF 2020 TO NKU

CRESTVIEW HILLS, Ky. — Senior Lisa Friess stayed undefeated in singles play this season, but WKU Tennis suffered its first team loss of 2020 by a score of 6-1 to Northern Kentucky on Saturday.

Friess defeated the Norse's Katja Dijanezevic by a score of 6-2, 6-3, as the Graz, Austria, native improved to 4-0 this season playing at the No. 4 spot. But that was the only team point for the Lady Toppers on the afternoon.

Junior Laura Bernardos won her first set by a score of 6-1 against NKU's Elizabeth Rozin at the No. 3 position, but fell in second and third set tiebreaks.

The Norse opened up by winning at No. 1 and No. 2 doubles to take a 1-0 lead, then secured three singles wins for the match-clinching fourth point before Friess put WKU on the board.

"It was a tough match against a very experienced team," head coach Greg Davis said. "They came out and played with tremendous energy against us and we never really recovered after doubles."

The Lady Toppers (3-1) will be back in action on Friday, Jan. 31 for a 2 p.m. neutral-site match against Ball State in Murfreesboro, Tenn. WKU then hosts its first match of the season on Saturday, Feb. 1 at 1 p.m. vs. Austin Peay at the WKU Tennis Complex.

LADY TOPS DEFEATED BY GOVS AT AUSTIN PEAY

CLARKSVILLE, Tenn. – WKU Tennis fell 7-0 in its match on Saturday to longtime rival Austin Peay at the Governors Tennis Center. The Lady Toppers were led by junior Lisa Friess who notched six game victories during her singles match.

In doubles action, the Lady Toppers freshmen duo, Zeniece Charles-Hall and Judit Gonzalez Agud, was defeated 6-1 against their Austin Peay opponent. The Governors won the No. 3 spot by default and were awarded the doubles point.

At the time Austin Peay clinched the doubles point, sophomore Laura Bernardos and Friess were leading the No. 1 doubles match 5-2.

LADY TOPPER TENNIS SET BACK BY BELMONT

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – WKU Tennis fell to the Belmont Bruins 7-0 on Saturday evening. WKU won its first doubles match of the season and multiple Lady Toppers won a set in singles action.

Sophomore Laura Bernardos and junior Lisa Friess notched their first victory of the spring season, defeating a pair of Bruins 6-1 in the No. 1 doubles spot. The Lady Topper duo notched two wins in the fall as well.

In a tough fought battle in the No. 2 doubles match, WKU's freshmen tandem of Zeniece Charles-Hall and Judit Gonzalez Agud fell 7-5. Belmont won the third match by default and clinched the doubles point.

WKU saw improvement in singles action this week with two Lady Toppers winning sets. Friess won the first set of her match, ultimately falling 6-2, 4-6, 0-1 (11-13). Charles-Hall was able to pick up a second set win and force a third. She was defeated by a Bruin 2-6, 6-2, 0-1 (4-10).

WEEKEND TRIP TO TEXAS SLATED FOR LADY TOPPER TENNIS

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – WKU Tennis heads to the Lone Star State this weekend to compete in two away matches. The Lady Toppers will play at UT Arlington on Friday followed by a midday matchup at Conference USA opponent North Texas on Saturday.

UT Arlington (4-0) is undefeated at home this season, having played all four of its matches at home thus far. The Mavericks defeated C-USA member UTEP 6-1 on Feb. 1. This will be the first ever competition between WKU and UT Arlington. Maverick Momoka Horiguchi is currently No. 113 on the ITA singles rankings.

North Texas (3-3, 1-0 C-USA) will be WKU's first conference opponent of the season. The Mean Green is 3-0 on its home court this season. The Red and White has only ever met North Texas one other time. The two squads played at the Sun Belt Conference Tournament on April 26, 2003 where the Lady Toppers fell to the Mean Green 4-0 in the opening round.

In the most recent ITA Rankings, North Texas' doubles pair Maria Kononova and Tamuna Kutubidze were named No. 19 in doubles. Kutubidze is also No. 69 on the singles rankings.

The Lady Toppers are making improvements through their first three matches of the season. In the most recent battle, WKU fell to Belmont overall, but won a doubles match and multiple singles sets.

WKU (0-3) will play the Mavericks of UT Arlington at 2 p.m. CT on Friday at the UTA Tennis Center. The Lady Toppers match against the North Texas Mean Green will begin at 12 p.m. CT on Saturday. The C-USA matchup will take place in Plano, Texas, at the Lifetime Fitness Center.

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – WKU Tennis is set to play at Lipscomb in Nashville, Tenn., on Friday evening before playing its first home match in almost two years on Saturday afternoon against UAB at the WKU Tennis Complex.

Lipscomb (4-2) has already played two opponents WKU will see this season. The Lady Bisons opened their season against Middle Tennessee and fell 5-2. Lipscomb also played Conference USA member UAB and won 4-3. The Lady Bisons hold an unbeaten 2-0 record at home this season.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – WKU Tennis felt another defeat on Friday evening after falling to the Lipscomb Lady Bisons 4-0 at the Whitworth Racquet Club.

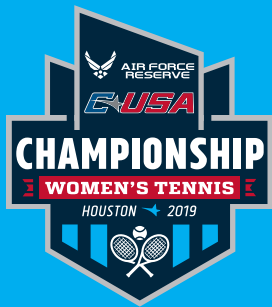

LADY TOPPERS KICK OFF C-USA CHAMPIONSHIP WITH SWEEP OF LADY TECHSTERS

NORFOLK, Va. – No. 7 WKU began with a bang at the 2018 C-USA Women's Tennis Championship, sweeping No. 10 Louisiana Tech 4-0 in the opening round of the tournament. This is just the second time in program history that the Lady Toppers have won in the first round of a conference tournament, the first being in 2017.

Doubles action began at 8 a.m. CT as freshman Moka Ito and sophomore Monica Malinen took to court one. 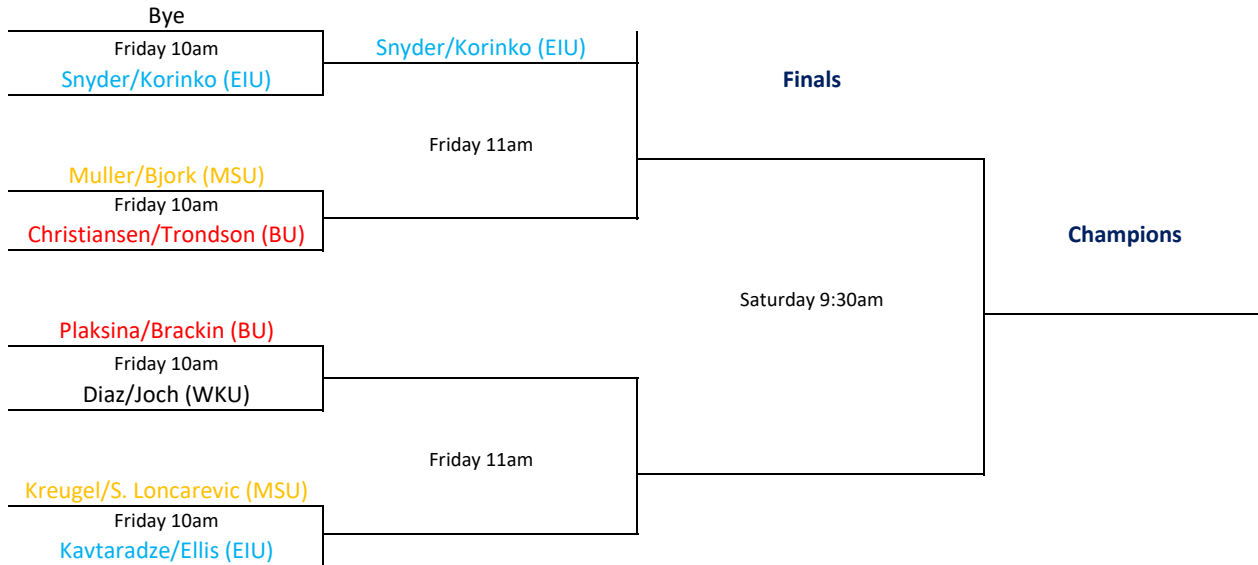

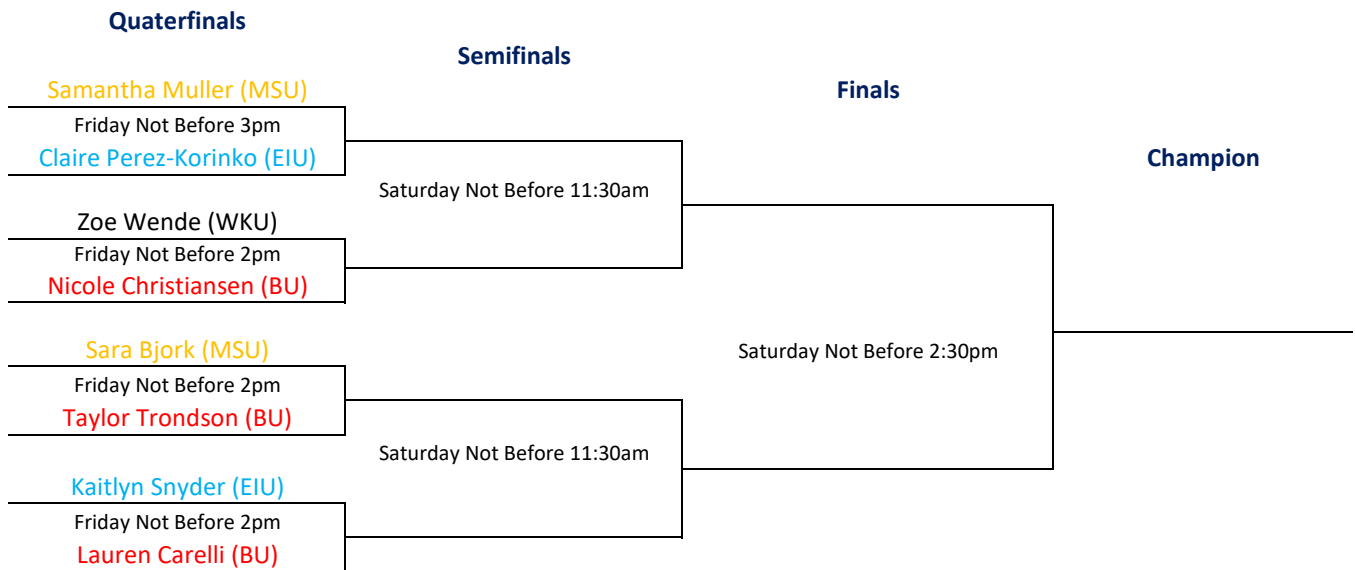

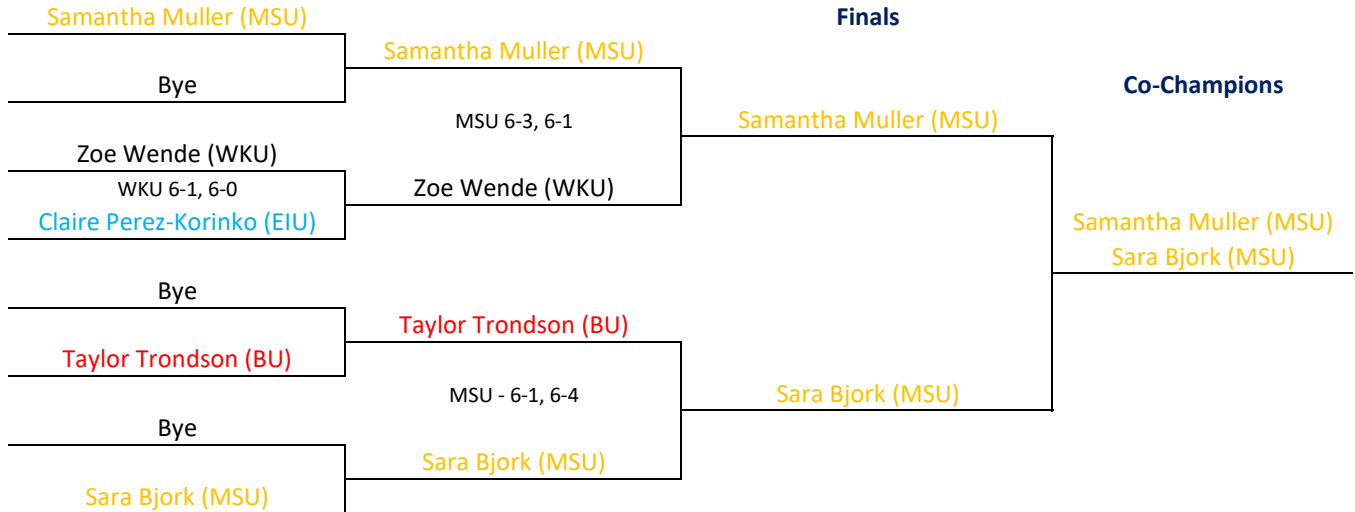

LADY TOPPERS SIGN A PAIR IN 2020 CLASS

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. — WKU Tennis head coach Greg Davis has announced a pair of signees for the Lady Toppers' Class of 2020. Adriana Subias of La Coruña, Spain, and Adrienne Vesely of Plano, Texas, will make their way to The Hill for the 2020 fall season.

ADRIANA SUBIAS

Subias comes to The Hill following a distinguished youth career in Spain. She came out victorious in three notable events over the past three years: The 2019 Babolat Circuit 2A Tournament, 2018 Val de Barcala Negreira Tennis Open and 2017 Babolat Circuit 1A Tournament.

Subias was also a finalist in the 2019 Conference Master Event (for the best eight players in the region), 2018 Gallego Absolute Regional Master Tennis Tournament and 2017 U17 Regional Championship. She has experience competing against some of the top-ranked Spanish amateurs, including players who have accepted scholarships to Oregon, Nevada and Lamar.

Davis on Subias: "I'm very excited to add Adriana to our team. She has been in the top 90 in Spain, she is very athletic and she is someone who will be able to come in and add to our program's depth."

ADRIENNE VESELY

Vesely comes to WKU from Gardner-Webb, where she competed during the 2019 spring season and a pair of tournaments this fall. She put together a team-best 13-3 singles record in the spring, which included a 7-2 record at No. 5, a 5-1 mark at No. 6 and a 1-0 tally at No. 4 for the Runnin' Bulldogs. In doubles play, she had a 6-7 record at the No. 3 pair with teammate Milica Panic.

Vesely earned praise from the Big South Conference when she was named the league's Freshman of the Week on Feb. 13 after a pair of singles wins vs. North Carolina A&T and Davidson in Gardner-Webb's two matches. This fall, Vesely earned three singles wins and five doubles victories combined in the Elon and Limestone Fall Invitationals.

Vesely attended Spring Creek Academy in Plano, Texas, for her prep career. She was a four-star recruit and ranked as high as No. 87 in the country during her junior year. She won the 2017 Florida Open Girls18 Championship and the 2016 National Closed Region Tournament.

Davis on Vesely: "Adrienne is a big pick up for our program. I feel like she can come in and help us immediately. She brings a great deal of experience having been ranked in the top 90 in the U.S. as a junior, as well as performing at a high level last year during her season."
