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## MEMORANDUM

1. The purpose of the Yeager, Ford & Warren Accountancy Award is to stimulate an interest in the study of accounting and related subjects and encourage the entrance of young men in the field of professional accounting. The Award is to be given at the end of the junior year to the one the college selects as most likely to succeed in the practice of public accounting.

2. If the institution has no one who proposes to enter the practice of public accounting, it is not our intention that the Award be made. For example, in one instance the Award was given at an institution to a man who had already contracted to go into government service. In another instance, an institution made the Award to an individual who was proposing to study law. At another, it was given to a young lady who had no intention of going into the practice of accounting. Of course, we realize no one can be sure, however, if a person has already indicated another field, the Award should not be given him.

3. In the event the Award is not made in a particular year, we would expect the institution to carry it over and give it in the second year or even the third year, if need be.
