





# HEAD COACH RICK STANSBURY

CAREER RECORD: 375-218 (19TH SEASON) RECORD AT WKU: 82-52 (FIFTH SEASON)

## **STANSBURY NOTES**

- Rick Stansbury's teams have been outstanding on their own turf, boasting a winning percentage at home of 78 percent overall and 86 percent in nonconference play during his 18 seasons at the helm at Mississippi State and WKU. Stansbury has won at least 10 home games in each of his 18 seasons as a head coach, and the Hilltoppers are 19-4 at home against nonconference opponents under Stansbury. Stansbury is 6-3 at home in postseason play.
- In Stansbury's four seasons as the Hilltoppers' head coach, WKU is 68-5 when leading with five minutes to play. The first such loss was against Utah in the 2018 NIT Semifinals, and the most recent was at North Texas on March 1 of last season.
- Winning the free-throw war has been a staple of Stansbury's coaching philosophy for his entire career. During his 18 seasons as a head coach, his teams have shot 2,803 more total free throws than their opponents and attempted more than their opponents in every single season.
- Jared Savage is the 10th outgoing WKU Basketball senior to sign a pro contract under Stansbury. In Stansbury's first three seasons, all nine outgoing seniors went on to play professionally.
- Stansbury's son, Noah, will be a freshman guard on this year's team. The Stansburys are one of 18 father-son/coach-player combos in Division I this season. Other notable fathers coaching their sons this year include Michigan State's Tom Izzo, Syracuse's Jim Boeheim, Illinois' Brad Underwood, Iowa's Frank McCaffery, UConn's Dan Hurley and Memphis' Penny Hardaway.
- WKU's victory over No. 15 Wisconsin on Dec. 29, 2018, was the 24th win over an AP ranked opponent in Stansbury's career. Fifteen of those wins over a ranked foe came on the road or at a neutral site.
- In Stansbury's 34 previous seasons as a head coach or assistant coach, his teams have gone to the postseason 19 times, with top-five seeds in the NCAA Tournament six times.
- Stansbury has signed seven top-20 recruiting classes during his time as a head coach, including his first two classes at WKU and five in his tenure at Mississippi State.

## **PROGRAM NOTES**

- Since the start of the 2017-18 season, WKU is 8-4 against Power Five teams and 3-2 vs. ranked Power Five teams. The Hilltoppers had seven total wins against teams from the Power Five conferences from 2007-08 to 2016-17. Among that 8-4 mark vs. the Power Five, 9 of 12 games have been away from Diddle Arena: three home games, five true road games and four neutral-site games.
- Since the start of the 2017-18 season, WKU has gone 3-4 against top-25 teams, including a 2-2 mark in the last two seasons. From 2010-11 to 2016-17, the Hilltoppers went 1-12 against ranked opponents.
- WKU claimed the 46th 20-win season in program history with a win at FIU in last year's season finale. Only Kentucky, North Carolina, Duke, Louisville, UCLA and Kansas have more 20-win seasons in NCAA history. It was also the 13th 20-win season in Rick Stansbury's 18 seasons as a head coach.
- WKU is one of 44 programs in the nation to have won at least 20 games in each of the last three seasons. The Hilltoppers' 67 total wins across the last three seasons are the most of any school in Conference USA.
- WKU has the fourth-longest streak in the nation of consecutive games with a made 3-pointer at 1,040. Only UNLV (1,103), Duke (1,091) and Arkansas (1,043) have longer streaks.
- WKU has advanced to at least the semifinals of its league tournament in 13 of the last 15 tournaments played. The team is 25-8 with four championships in the last 12 conference tournaments overall. The Hilltoppers' 23 NCAA Tournament appearances are six more than the next closest Conference USA school (UTEP, 17), and as many as the eight league schools with the fewest appearances combined.
- In Rick Stansbury's four seasons at the helm, WKU has shot 993 more total free throws than its opponents. The Hilltoppers made 136 more free throws in 2019-20 than their opponents even attempted, which led the country. Gonzaga and Hofstra were tied for second with 101 more made than opponent attempts.
- WKU is 47-12 (.797) at Diddle Arena under head coach Rick Stansbury. The Tops are 620-175 all-time at Diddle Arena for a .780 winning percentage.
- Entering the 2020-21 season, WKU ranks third in NCAA history in regular-season league titles (42), seventh in 20-win seasons (46), eighth in all-time winning percentage (.660) and 15th in all-time victories (1,815). WKU joins Kentucky, North Carolina, Kansas and UCLA as the only programs in the top 10 for both winning percentage and conference championships.

#### **PLAYER NOTES**

- WKU's 2020-21 roster represents six states Arkansas, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Tennessee and West Virginia as well as Nigeria and Canada.
- The Hilltoppers have six players on the 2020-21 roster from the state of Kentucky, which is the second-most among Division I teams in the state this season. WKU's 2019-20 roster featured seven Kentuckians, the program's most since 1980-81.
- The Hilltoppers have three former Kentucky Mr. Basketball winners on their roster for the second straight year **Carson Williams** (2016), **Taveion Hollingsworth** (2017) and **Dayvion McKnight** (2020). Four of the last six winners have played for WKU, including 2015 honoree Camron Justice. Before WKU the last two years, the only time in history that a team featured three Kentucky Mr. Basketball winners was the 1993-94 Louisville squad (Dwayne Morton, Tick Rogers, Jason Osborne). WKU previously didn't have a Mr. Basketball since 2007.
- WKU could reach five active 1,000-point scorers during the 2020-21 season. The Hilltoppers have eight returning players who have scored a combined 5,756 career Division I points, including five players with at least 648 points each.

- WKU returns 70.8 percent of its scoring, 59.2 percent of its rebounding, 75.7 percent of its assists, 66.4 percent of its blocks and 70.1 percent of its steals from 2019-20. The Hilltoppers return four players **Taveion Hollingsworth, Charles Bassey, Carson Williams** and **Josh Anderson** who averaged double figures in scoring last season.
- Junior center **Charles Bassey** is set to return from a season-ending leg injury suffered Dec. 7 of last season against Arkansas. The 2019-20 Preseason First-Team All-American suffered a tibial plateau fracture in his left leg that required season-ending surgery on Dec. 10 in Houston, Texas, with the team physicians for the NFL's Houston Texans and NBA's Houston Rockets the same physicians who performed surgery on Texans star JJ Watt when he suffered a similar injury in 2017. Bassey's rehab began immediately after surgery, and he was cleared to resume full contact activities in September.
- When the 2020-21 season begins, **Charles Bassey** will be the national leader in career rebounding average at 9.8 boards per game. He also ranks in the top 10 in career blocks average at 2.2 per game and in the top 15 in career field goal percentage (60.2 percent).

- Taveion Hollingsworth ranks 18th in WKU history with 1,494 career points. If he reached 2,000 points, he would join Jim McDaniels, Courtney Lee and Ralph Crosthwaite as the only Hilltoppers to accomplish the feat.
- Taveion Hollingsworth has started 102 consecutive games the most of any active player in the nation. Hollingsworth has started every game of his WKU career and has never missed a game for the Hilltoppers.
- Through his junior year, **Taveion Hollingsworth** has played 3,614 total minutes, the most ever by a Hilltopper over his first three years. Hollingsworth is now ranked eighth on WKU's all-time list for most minutes in a career. He needs just 344 minutes played for the most in Hilltopper history.
- In each of the last three years, WKU has placed a player on the Conference USA All-Freshman Team **Taveion Hollingsworth** (2018), **Charles Bassey** (2019) and **Jordan Rawls** (2020). They combined for 1,238 points and 13 C-USA Freshman of the Week awards in their first seasons, and Bassey also won C-USA Freshman of the Year.
- Senior **Josh Anderson** is no stranger to SportsCenter. His highlight-reel dunks have been featured on the SC Top 10 at least six times in his first three seasons. The Tops as a whole have been featured at least nine times in the last three years.
