Minutes for Faculty Meeting January 4, 1915.

After the usual routine business was transacted, a basket of fruit, the gift of Miss Bess Combest, was presented to the faculty. Dean A. J. Kinnaman was requested to write her and extend the thanks of all.

Mr. Burton was given the privilege of changing his text in Psychology.

January 11, 1915.

Upon motion duly seconded and passed, it was agreed to issued to Mr. J. H. Yarbrough the Life Certificate, as he has now fulfilled the conditions stated to him on last year.

A Committee with Miss Iva Scott as Chairman was appointed to take charge of the reception for the incoming students on January 25th, the opening of the Mid-Winter Term. February 1, 1915.

Motion made and passed that the Basket Ball Girls' Team be allowed to go to Russellville to play the team from the Logan Female College.

Notes of Faculty Meeting

April 26, 1915.

It was unamiously agreed that the plan of regulating the issuing of tickets to students and citizens for the Music Festival be left in the hands of Mr. Byrn and Professor Strahm.

It was moved and agreed that the annual boat trip be made this year on May 29th.

Motion was made and passed that whenever on the school days the base-ball games occur, the \checkmark class be dismissed at 3:45 in order to give the students time to get to the field at the opening of the game.

May 30th.

Unanimously agreed to invite Dr. Aquilla Webb, President of the Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Louisville, ν to deliver our Baccalaureate Sermon.

Also agreed to invite President R. L. Jones, State Normal School, Murfreesboro, Tennessee, to deliver the address to the graduating class.

June 1, 1915.

The Faculty unanimously voted to give a Banquet in honor of President H. H. Cherry, and in token of their appreciation of the action of the Board of Regents in re-electing him unanimously, on the evening of June 2nd. Miss Scott was appointed chairman of a committee to make the proper arrangements. Dean A. J. Kinnaman and Mr. O. G. Byrn were also appointed on the committee.

June 30, 1915.

At a called meetingof the Faculty, the advisability of a change in date for the opening of the Fall Session / was discussed. As the length of the rural school term will hereafter be seven months instea d of six it was thought by some that the opening dates for each term should be changed. Nothing definite was done, however. Inasmuch as the Western Kentucky State Normal School, with the view of advancing the educational interest of the student-body, has deemed it expedient to combine all lectures, musical programs, athletic events, etc. into one Lyceum Course, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that a nominal enrollment fee, such as that now pertaining, be universally collected from all enrolling students, the proceeds from which shall go to the support of the above named student activities and to the support of any other school interest the management of the Western Kentucky State Normal shall think proper.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be made a part of the permanent records of the Western Kentucky State Normal School.

This resolution was unanimously adopted by the student-body in Chapel assembled this, the 16th day of September, 1915.

September 20, 1915.

Faculty met in regular session in the office of the President.

Motion made, seconded and passed that certain faculty members, heads of the different depart-/ ments, be sent to a number of counties for extension work, the expense to be paid by the institution.

A committee consisting of the President and Dean of the institution and others they may γ select, was requested to work out a definite plan by which to elect the faculty member who would make the trip each week.

November 15, 1915.

The faculty decided that the school would close for the Thanksgiving Holidays at 4:00 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, November 24th. Begin work again the following Monday.

The date of the Christmas Holidays as follows:work of the school to close at noon Thursday, December 23rd and work will be resumed, Tuesday, January 4th at 7:30.

December 13, 1915.

When the question of Athletic Contests for the girls was \checkmark discussed, it was agreed that they should play one game with a team from another school during the season.

It was further agreed that hereafter no announcement at Chapel be made by other than the Dean. That all announcements should be written out and handed to him. If it seems best, he can refer any special one back to the author with the request that he make it himself.
