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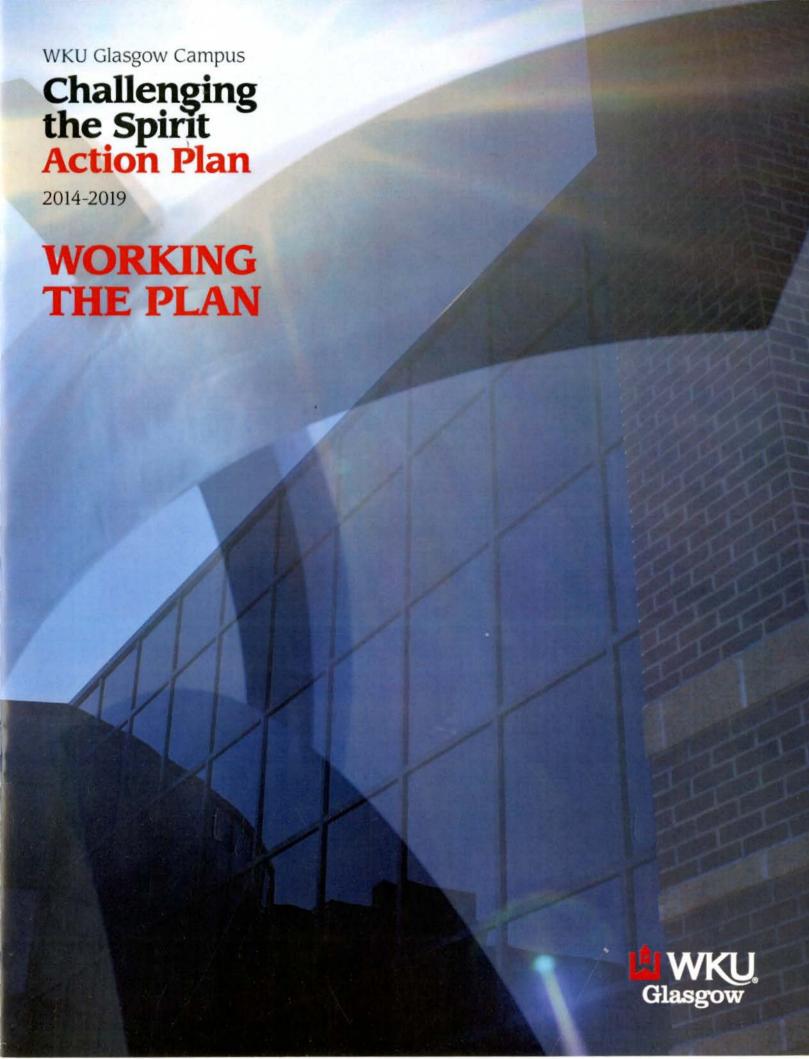

Strategies

- Convene regular Glasgow Campus-wide meetings each academic year
- Encourage regular academic department head visits to Glasgow Campus
- Convene semi-annual Glasgow faculty meetings for informational and planning purposes
- Offer professional faculty development opportunities on the Glasgow Campus to keep faculty and staff current on policies, pedagogy, and technology
- Develop, in collaboration with academic department heads, a faculty mentoring program for full-time Glasgow faculty

Strategies

- Reinstate Glasgow campus funding source and process to support WKU Glasgow faculty research, creative and scholarly activity
- Create incentives to encourage Glasgow student participation in research and presentations
- Schedule regular WKU Glasgow faculty scholarship and pedagogical campus presentations
- Develop a full-time Glasgow Faculty Mentoring Program with at least 50% of full time faculty participating on a regular basis
- Increase the number of WKU Glasgow judges at REACH Week by 5% and WKU Glasgow faculty general attendance by 10%
- · Increase WKU Glasgow student research presentations at WKU's REACH week student research fair

Strategies

- Provide and encourage increased academic and non-academic support for faculty, staff, and student involvement in diverse clubs, programs, and events
- Expand partnerships with local, regional, national, and international organizations that serve diverse populations
- · Increase campus recruitment efforts directed at diverse faculty, staff, and student populations
- Utilize current Glasgow faculty, staff, and students from diverse populations and experience to promote a diverse university community

Strategies

- · Establish a baseline to track WKU Glasgow student enrollment, retention and graduation
- · Work with IR to develop a baseline for Glasgow enrollment and retention
- · Prioritize consistent and expanded course offerings
- · Provide and support training opportunities for Glasgow faculty and staff with MAP-Works and QPR
- Prioritize and deliver accessible student services such as counseling services, disability services, career-counseling services, and academic and non-academic support services on campus
- Provide, promote, and support the WKU Glasgow START Center
- Increase consistency of faculty office hours on campus
- Develop Hilltopper Institute to address college readiness needs of at risk student populations

Create a baseline for all WKU Glasgow students and FTFTB cohort of average time to degree and decrease by 3%		
Increase the number of joint admission students with partnering KCTCS institutions by 10%		
Develop workforce education model that addresses student economic needs and business/industry challenges		

Strategies

- Develop a Campus Scholarship Committee comprised of WKU Glasgow faculty and staff for existing scholarship dollars for all terms
- · Maintain current rack cards with WKU Glasgow specific scholarship availability for enrolled students
- Increase partnerships with regional businesses and industry to provide educational financial assistance opportunities for students
- Increase winter and summer term offerings at Glasgow to facilitate degree completion
- Increase work-study opportunities for both Pell-eligible and non-Pell-eligible
- Participate in the larger University conversation regarding the economic challenges of developmental education for students

• Expand WKU's economic impact on the region through student, faculty, and staff engagement

Increase by 15% the number of Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics and Health Sciences (STEM+H) degrees produced			

Strategies

- · Emphasize KCTCS/WKU Glasgow dual enrollment program
- · Partner with SKYCTC pursue workforce education model
- Explore opportunities for cohort degree/certified programs with manufacturing, business, retail, and service industries
- · Conduct a needs assessment of the local region to determine degree and/or certificate program priorities
- Provide an "Open House" for students to explore career and postsecondary opportunities
- Increase the delivery of interdisciplinary degrees (tied to STEM+H disciplines)
- Engage students across STEM disciplines (and others) by using the natural landscape around the WKU Glasgow campus
 to showcase environmental sustainability projects (e.g., outdoor classroom, interpretive walking trail (with interpretive
 waysides), a wetlands, nature center, self-sufficient living quarters, solar/wind power)

• Enrich the cultural milieu and quality of life in the region

Increase by 10% the number of regional stewardship projects coordinated through the ALIVE Center and Institute for Citizenship and Social Responsibility		
Increase annual attendance by Glasgow students at arts and cultural events by 10%		
Increase Glasgow campus attendance at athletic events by 10%		

Strategies

- Develop a WKU Glasgow Regional Center for Community Development Service Learning Program
- Provide free transportation to/from WKU Bowling Green and/or continue IVS broadcasts of Cultural Enhancement Series events
- Explore the potential for child care services so students can attend events
- Host a "museum week" at the WKU Glasgow campus

• Generate enduring private support for infrastructure and institutional aspirations

Strategies

- Consolidate Glasgow funds which are similar in focus
- Establish a local development group of stakeholders within the region to lead this effort
- Create a focused campaign intended to raise funding specifically for Glasgow campus needs
- · Promote local scholarships throughout the WKU Glasgow Campus community

• Enhance efficiency and sustainability in campus services and operations

Targets	Completion Date	Revised Completion Date	
Decrease energy usage per square foot by 12%			
Increase the percentage of solid waste recycled or diverted by 150%			
Increase the percentage of surplus materials re-used by 35%			

Strategies

- Reinvest energy savings funds back into WKU Glasgow campus
- Engage Glasgow Greentoppers and other stakeholders in education and awareness about paper use and print conservation strategies
- Initiate program for recycling paper
- Recycle machining metal scraps
- Collect data on percentage of local food served on campus and promote the initiative as a sustainability best practice
- Promote the use of local food in the café on campus
