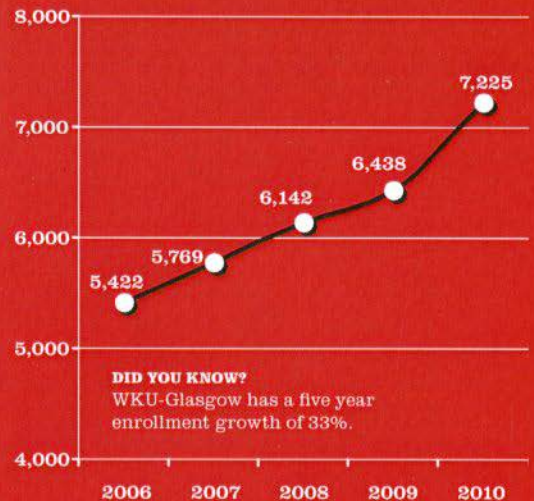

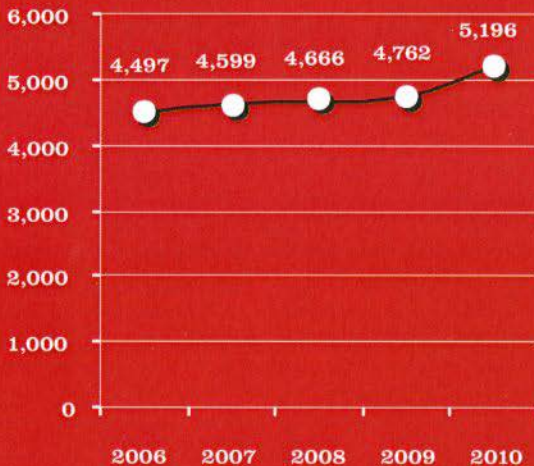
Course Enrollments



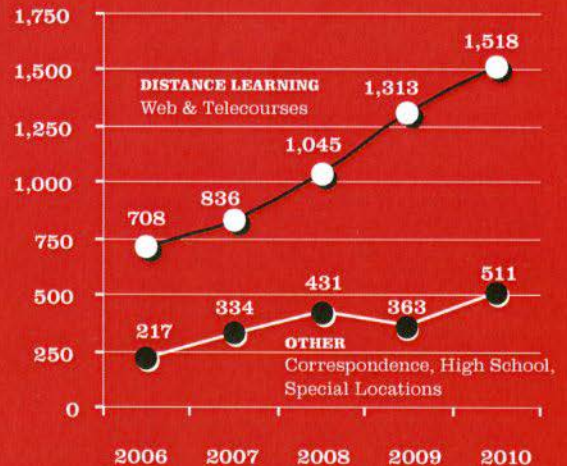

Student Services

Career Services

WKU Career Services staff visit the WKU-Glasgow Campus monthly to assist with resumé building, interviewing, and other skills.

Counseling & Testing

WKU's Counseling and Testing Center staff make regular visits to the WKU-Glasgow Campus to provide individual counseling and class presentations.

Financial Aid

A Financial Aid Outreach Counselor is available at the WKU-Glasgow Campus on Mondays and Thursdays each week.

Library

The WKU-Glasgow Campus Library offers reference books and leisure reading. Students have access to materials placed on reserve, as well as full access to electronic databases and journals.

Study Abroad

WKU-Glasgow students enjoy opportunities to study abroad. During the 2010-2011 Academic School Year, 28 students from the WKU-Glasgow Campus participated in the Study Abroad Program traveling to 8 countries including Czechoslovakia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, England, Germany, Panama, Egypt and Spain.

Resource Center

WKU-Glasgow students have open access to computers, instructional videos, specialized software and tutoring. The Resource Center serves as a proctor site for Independent Learning and web courses. WKU and BGTC ID cards are provided through the Center.

TRIO

The Federal TRIO Programs are Federal outreach and student services programs designed to identify and provide services for individuals from disadvantaged

backgrounds. Representatives are available from Student Support Services and Educational Opportunity Centers.
