SENATOR JOE BOWEN

Joe Bowen (R-Owensboro) was elected to the Kentucky State Senate in 2010, representing the 8th District, which encompasses Daviess, Hancock, and McLean Counties. Prior to his election to the Senate, Senator Bowen served in the Kentucky House of Representatives from 2005 until 2006.

Senator Bowen currently serves as the chair of the State and Local Government Committee. He also serves as co-chair of the State Employee Pension Oversight Board. Senator Bowen is on the Education Committee; the Health and Welfare Committee; and the Natural Resources and Energy Committee.

Senator Bowen has served as chairman for the Owensboro YMCA Board and the Kentucky State Parks Foundation Board. He has also been a board member of the Owensboro, Daviess County Hospital Inc. Currently the Senator serves on the Board of Visitors of Kentucky Wesleyan College.

After graduating from Daviess County High School in 1968 he attend the University of Kentucky and graduated with a degree in Business Administration in 1972. Senator Bowen has long been an advocate of youth sports serving as both a coach and administrator for several youth sports organizations.

Joe Bowen was a long time small business owner. He and his family operated Bowen Tire founded by his father in 1949. Senator Bowen resides in Owensboro with his wife, Vicki. He is the father of two children, Adam and Joy, and the grandfather of five grandchildren.

History of WKU Owensboro

Before Western Kentucky University was officially established in Owensboro, several classes were held the summer of 1969. There were 82 students enrolled in Education, Psychology, Sociology, Math, Economics, History, and Library Science classes. These classes were held on the Brescia University and Kentucky Wesleyan College campuses.


The WKU Owensboro campus was officially established on July 1, 1980. Graduate courses were offered on the Brescia and KWC campuses for approximately four years. Dr. George Overstreet was the campus director from 1980-1996. The WKU Owensboro offices moved to the Likens Building on Frederica Street.

The offices were then moved to the Longfellow Center, which was a converted elementary school. Classes were held at Owensboro High School for the next 23 years. A few classes were scheduled during these years at the Owensboro Community & Technical College main campus and downtown campus. Dr. Marilyn Brookman became the director in 1996 and retired in June 2007.

In March 2005, WKU and OCTC began an earnest partnership, which allowed area students to complete their associate degrees at OCTC and transfer easily to WKU Owensboro to complete their bachelor's degrees. WKU Owensboro moved to the OCTC campus, which made this partnership even more effective.

In July 2008, Dr. Gene Tice was appointed as the permanent director of the WKU Owensboro campus. In 2008, construction began on the first building of the new WKU Owensboro campus. For the first time in history, WKU Owensboro had its own facility. Daviess County bought the 28 acres on which WKU Owensboro resides. The building is 30,000 square feet containing 16 classrooms with the latest technology, an electronic library, computer lab, university book and apparel store, conference room, and a conference center.

The WKU Owensboro campus began with 82 students that met in only face-to-face classes. Today WKU Owensboro has more than 600 undergraduate and graduate students.
