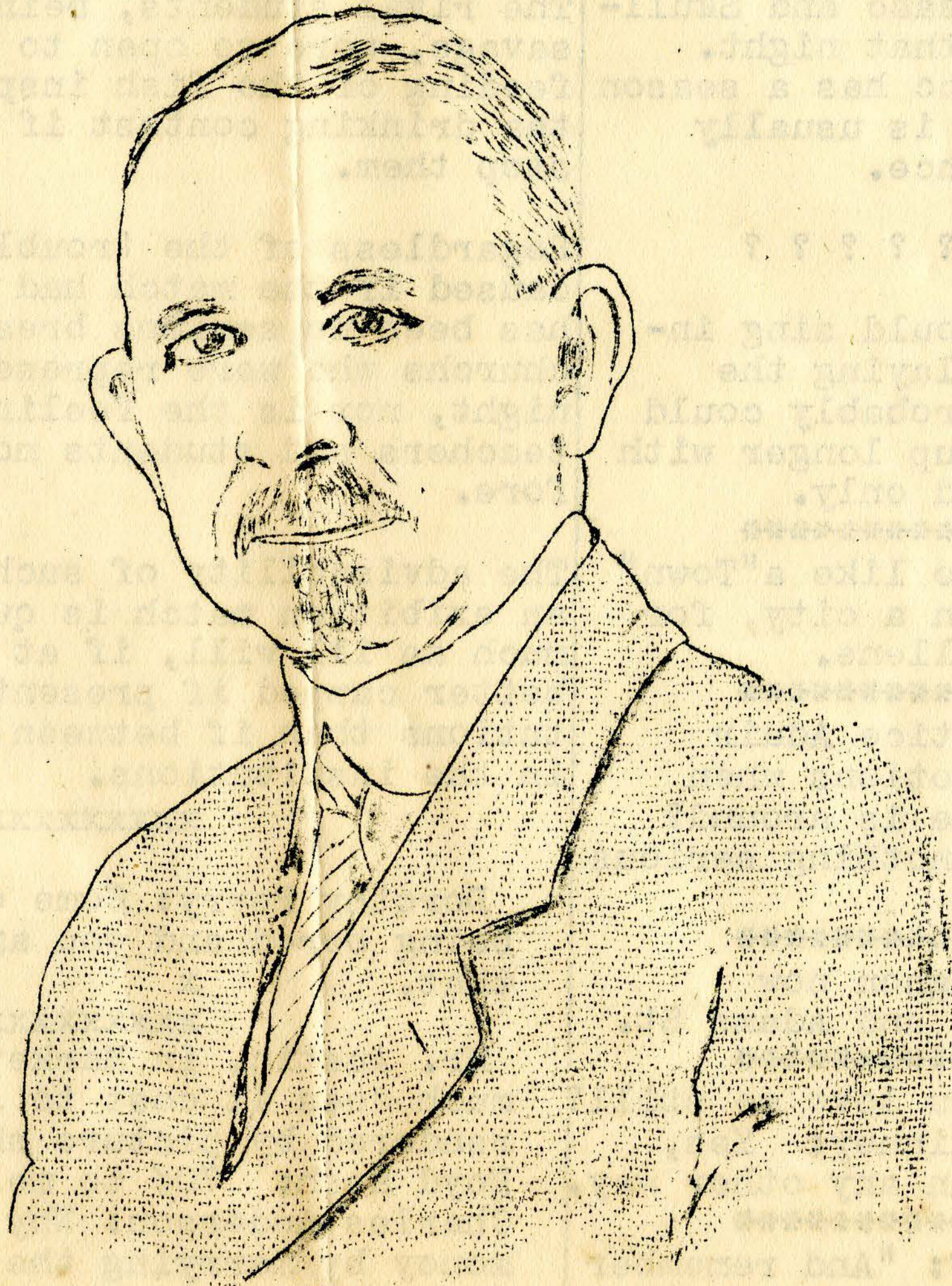

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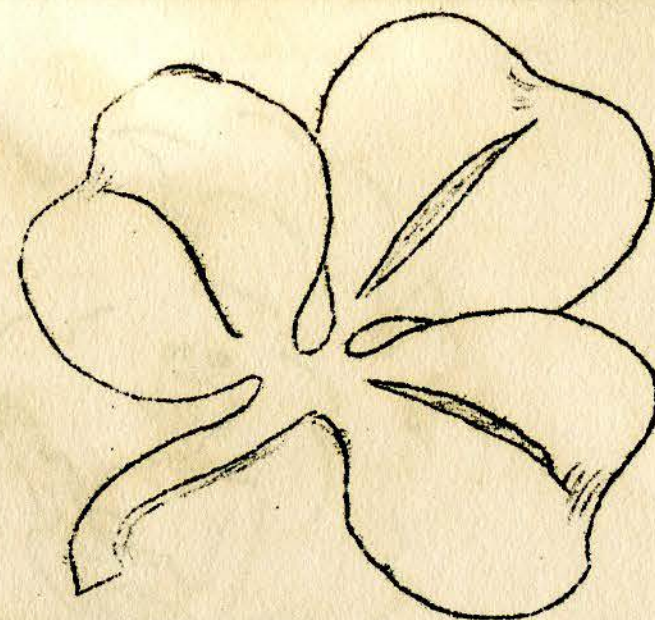
Those tracks on State Street last Friday were not made by Crusoe's Man Friday. It was Ruth Howell going home in her stocking feet.

Someone suggested that the Tri-State Club should carry on the idea started by the Mississippi Club and decorate their party with Coal, Steel and Corn.

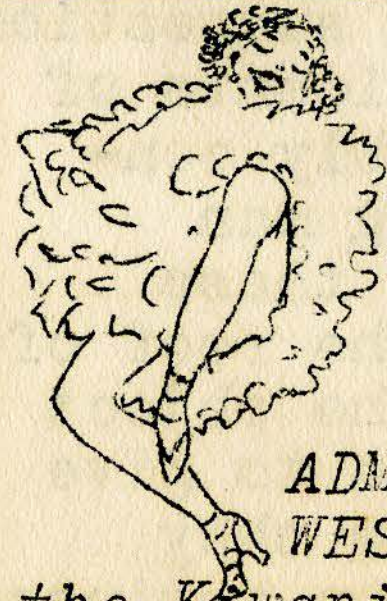

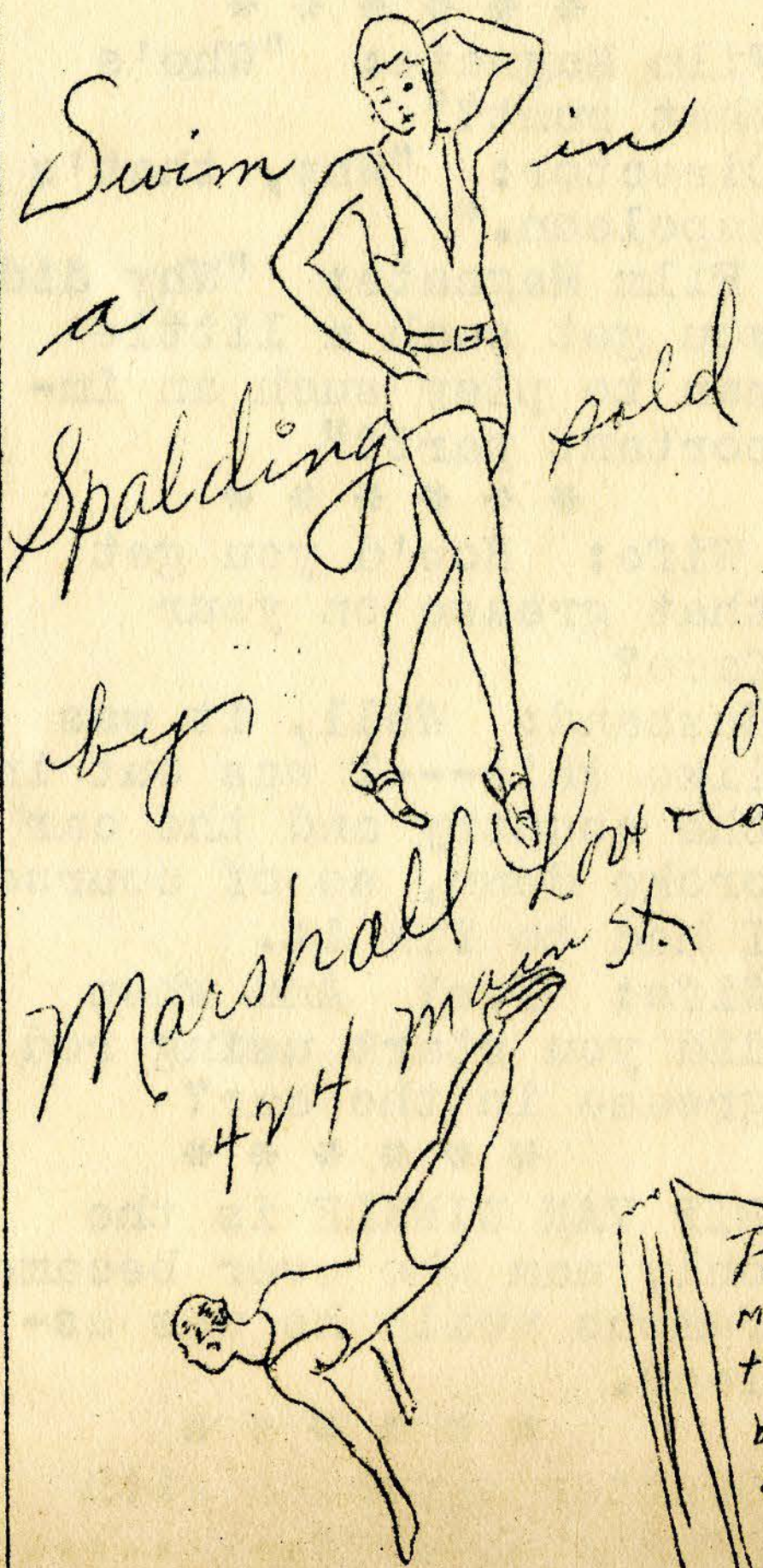

Mr. Hill (To Dr. Bowman, as he enters the office); What now?

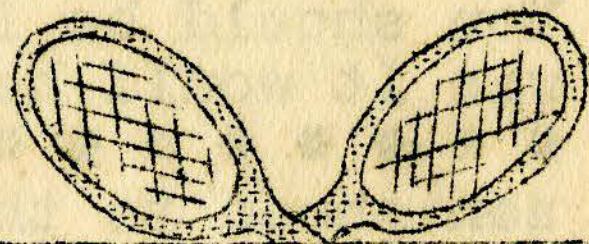
