MINUTES OF THE YELVINGTON BAPTIST CHURCH

Taken from the old faded and worn record book from June 30, 1813 to April 14, 1833 incl.

On the 30th of June, 1813, in Ohio County, Kentucky, the Panther Creek Baptist Church of Jesus Christ was constituted, near the Yellow Banks, by Rev. John Weldon and Rev. Benjamin Tolbert as presbytery on eleven members with their names undersigned.

- Sept. 7th, 1822. Bro. Richard Jett & wife received by letter. Bro. Lockett gave acknowledgments to the church on his own behalf and this continued. Delegates to ass'n -- Thomas Downs, William Downs, Daniel King. Minutes to be printed and paid for by church -- her own.
- October 1822. Complaint against black woman by pastor. Laid over until next meeting.
- November 7, 1822. James Wright and wife granted letters of dismission. Also William Lucas. Also William Pollet. Black woman excluded for immoral conduct.
- December 7, 1822. Bro. Lockett restored to fellowship.

MINUTES FOR 1823

- January 11, 1823. Question asked whether ~~thaxax~~ any member has a right to vote about the fellowship of another member when they are the accuser. Church said -- We think not. Elizabeth Kop or Kop given letter of dismission. Pastor brought in complaint against Sister Davies because she said she had no faith in young converts at the last revival and she denied it. This was continued. Sister Davies was excluded on Sunday morning.
- February 8, 1823. Bro. Wayne reported that there was a report against him and Bro. Downs and Bro. Bausom for going to Sister Davies at a late hour. The church agreed on their integrity and dismissed the matter as false.
- March 8th, 1823. Bro. Godby given a letter of dismission. .
- April 12, 1823. Mary Kimm received by baptism. Agreed to give the black people a certain part of the meeting house for their own accomodation. William Lucas received by letter. Bro. Collard and wife given letters of dismission.
- May 11, 1823. Five received by experience. All blacks. Fountain, Nancy, Aggie, Penny, and Judah.
- July 12, 1823. Bro. White brought charge against Bro. ~~Tanner~~, a black man, for trying to christen children or baptize them in some new form. Committee appointed to see him -- Thomas Downs and Henry White. Woman excluded for leaving the church and not taking a letter with her.

Sept 13, 1823.

Bro. Tom excludcd from the church. Christopher Jones and Henry Courtney received by experience. Thomas Downs, Henry White, and John Duncan. Associational letter read and approved.

November 11, 1823.

Brethren Sam, Rachel, and Biddy given letters of dismission. Blacks. Sister Amanda Hemingway excludcd for departing from the faith and rules of the Baptists.

December 13, 1823.

Committee to see several for non-attendance. Communion days set for Sunday in May and September each year. ajurned.

MINUTES FOR 1824

January 10, 1824.

Satisfaction given to the church by the non-attendant members. A woman before the church for adultery. Charge carried over till next meeting. Mary Kirkum was the lady. James Kennedy and William Hudson appointed to see her. Thomas Downs, wife, and daughters, Nancy, Becky, Sally, and Rebekah given letters of dismission, William Downs and wife given letters of dismission. Bro. John Snyder requested a certificate concerning the conduct of Bro. William Moxman since under he had been under their notice. This was done.

February 7, 1824.

Bro. Hudson saw Bro. Kennedy at YellowBanks in a state of intoxication and reported it to the church. Laid over until next meeting. Sister Kirkum again ordered to appear before the church.

March 13, 1824.

Sister Kirkum excludcd for adultery. Elizabeth Keith given letter of dismission. Restored James a servant of Bro. Whayne's to fellowship of church.

April 10, 1824.

Negro servant of Bro. Duncan's excludcd for swearing and striking Mrs. Duncan. Bro. Kennedy gave the church satisfaction. Bro. Goodin given letter of dismission.

May 8, 1824.

Brethren White and Courtney appointed to settle with the deacons and report at the next meeting.

June 12, 1824.

Church is Three dollars indebtcd to the deacons. \$4.21 received on this. Agreed to hold communion on Sunday and also wash one another's feet.

July 10, 1824.

Restored Mr. Hawes golly back to fellowship.

August 14, 1824.

Clerk appointed to write letter to association and report at next meeting. Brethren appointed to see a negro servant and his wife for non-attendance.

September 11, 1824.

Henry White, Isaac Whayne, and Christopher Jones delegates to the association. Query sent to the association -- What should be done to a member that is old and in their old age uses impious language and when called upon by the church will not give acknowledgments but doe s the same again and again.

October 12, 1824.

A negro servant excludcd for stealing from his master and a negro woman also for concealing the stolen goods. Mr. Hawes' servants John and Aggie.

November 1824.

Bro. Jesse Lockett was before the church for playing cards. He refused to come to church to answer the charges. Isaac Whayne and Henry Courtney appointed to see him. John Kennedy before the church again for intoxication. William Hudson and David Atterbury appointed to see him. Sarah Duncan given letter of dismission.

December 11, 1824. Bro. Locket's card playing laid over until next meeting. Received a servant of Bro. Whaynes, Henry, by experience. Hannah excluded.

MINUTES FOR 1825

January 8, 1825 Bro. Kennedy gave satisfaction for intoxication.. Restored Aggie to fellowship.

February 12, 1825. Bro. Locket excluded for playing cards. Appointed Brethren, Edmund and Millie and Henry to see Betty about her refusing to stop swearing in her old age.

March 12, 1825. Sister Betty excluded. Received a request from Tanner's Meeting House (Buck Creek Church, McLean County) for three of ~~their~~ our members to sit in council with them in their April meeting. Henry White, Isaac Whayne, and William ~~Bozcomb~~ Bozcomb.

May 1825. Bro. John Duncan stated that Millie a black woman deceived the church in giving satisfaction. Sister Millie appointed to see her.

June 12, 1825. Charge against Millie found to be false and she restored to fellowship.

July 7, 1825. Male members in class (Bible I suppose) to pay for communion expenses. William Bozcomb, Henry White, Isaac Whayne, Henry Courtney, Jeremiah King, John Duncan, William Innes, Leary Howard, Samuel Hemingway, William Hudson, John Kennedy, Christopher Jones, Richard Jett, James Rafferty, David Atterbury. Three black women received by letter.

August 13, 1825. Request from Panther Creek Church for helps. Agreed to send William Bozcomb, William Hudson, and Richard Jett. Received Mrs. Courtney by experience and Mr. Lee's Pompey.

September 10, 1825. Letter to association approved and Brethren Isaac Whayne, Christopher Jones, and Henry Courtney elected messengers. Agreed to have no correspondence with the Tract society.

October 8, 1825. Bro. Kennedy before church again for intoxication.

December 10, 1825. David Atterbury dismissed by letter. Negro woman before church for unchristian conduct. John appointed to see her.

MINUTES FOR 1826

January 7, 1826. Bro. Kennedy excluded for drunkenness. Bro. King excluded for card playing and drinking and swearing.

February 11, 1826. Judah excluded for immoral conduct. December reference.

April 8, 1826. Heard plan of brethren appointed to build a meeting house. Agreed to build a building of brick 34 feet long and 24 feet wide and 16 feet high.

May 13, 1826. Henry Courtney and wife given letters of dismission. Bro. Hudson ordered to appear before the church.

June 11, 1826. Negroes excluded for fighting among themselves.

July 8, 1826. Bro. Hudson's offense was a private one and he ordered to settle the matter privately.
