Camp Glenbrook Ky Feb. 1862

Dear Brother I now take this time to let you now that I am well our Regt left there old camp last Monday for here they left after I wrote part of the other letter they had gone when I sent it I stayed behind with some things and last came up last night we are 12 miles from our old camp on the pike up to Green River as far as we can go the Rebels here have burnt the Bridge they have built the Rail Road Bridge over the River and have crossed over there some 10 miles from here they say we are to guard the Bridge here while they are building it I have not heard from you in some time but I think I will soon I sent some things from the other camp to Rev. Shaver to be expressed to you you must let me know if you get them or not when you write they say here that they all have left Bowling Green and burnt the town but there is so many camp stories I don't believe it I have not heard from Ellen for a long time you must let me know if you hear from them

we have not been paid off yet  
and will have 4 months pay due as the  
last of the month and I hope that we  
will be paid soon you may look for some  
as soon as we are paid I have not drawned  
any on the Sutter and will get mine  
in money our bags that are here all full  
well we have the best of spring water  
here and I think we have a healthy  
camp we have had quite cool for the last  
three days but is better now I hope we  
can stay here till the weather gets  
settled for it is bad. Traveling this time  
of year when the ground is so wet and cold  
you must write all of the news and write  
of time and I will you must excuse this  
for there is now news here I am

you are wintering  
this winter and I  
how they do
