Louisville 6<sup>th</sup> Aug. 1813

We have finished the division of the land, valued last winter and have all of us that are of age conveyed by deed, our interest in the tracts allotted to John & George Clark. The tract I sold to the Shakers. I am bound by contract to execute a deed for - and am very anxious to have it in my power to do so - a deed to me from the other Heirs was forwarded to Mr. Britton in June for the purpose of getting it executed at the last County Court in Logan - but it appears that Mr. B. forgot it - The Shakers have made me a handsome payment - and I wish to avoid the risk attendant on delay - they are intitled to their

Deed from me. and I have to ask  
the favor of your friendly attention  
to the subject at your next County  
Court - Mr. Butcher has the papers  
necessary to enable you to understand  
the subject - at present I calcu-  
late on visiting Virginia in Sep:  
and shall feel grateful to you for  
aid in hastening the business of  
the deed so that I can make one  
to the Shakers before I go off -
