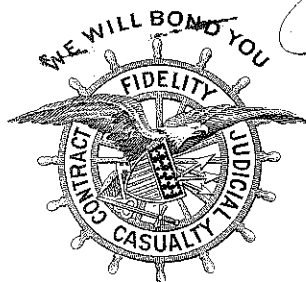

Dr. Ernest Rau Victim of Stroke at 88

Dr. Ernest Rau, 88, retired ear, eye and nose specialist here for 53 years, died Friday night at City-County Hospital. He was admitted to the hospital May 18 following a stroke suffered at his room at Helm Hotel.

Dr. Rau was born in Pontotoc, Miss., Feb. 22, 1874, the son of Ernest and May Stuart Reneau Rau. He was a graduate of the University of the South at Sewanee, Tenn., the University of Louisville Medical School, and did post graduate work at Vanderbilt Medical School.

He practiced medicine at Morningside Retreat, Nashville, and at Beechhurst Sanatorium, Louisville, before coming to Bowling Green in 1906.

Working with the late Dr. J.N. McCormack and his son, the Dr. Arthur T. McCormack, Dr. Rau helped to organize the State Board of Health which was located in Bowling Green for many years. He and the younger Dr. McCormack organized many of the county health departments in the state.

During World War I. Dr. Rau served as a captain with the U.S. Army Medical Corps in France and later with the Army of Occupation in Germany.

He had resided at the Helm Hotel since it was built in 1924 and before that lived at the old Morehead House.

The physician was a member of the Presbyterian Church, the Warren County Medical Society and Warren Post, No. 23, American Legion.

Surviving is a sister, Mrs. Luther Davis of Tucson, Ariz., who has been here with her brother since he was first stricken in September 1959.

No funeral services will be held. The body, which is at Burgess-Moody Funeral Home, will be cremated. The ashes will be buried in Tucson.
