Tuesday Nov 19th

1878.

Clear and cool in the morning, but warmer in the middle of the day. Maggie left Bowling Green for St Louis, and Miss Byrdie Rogers went to Chicago to spend the winter. I ate breakfast at six O'clock. Went to school, recited my lessons, did some shopping for Mama and then came home. After supper read several very nice little stories in St. Nicholas, studied a very little for tomorrow, and after writing a letter went to bed.

Wednesday Nov 20th

Clear and sunny in the morning but cloudy in the afternoon. I rose at half past six. As soon as I had finished my breakfast I went to school and unlocked the door. Then I went down to the Merchants Hotel to take Maggie's address to Mrs Higgins who was going to St Louis. She said she thanked me very much for she was anxious to see Mrs

Jonas and Maggie then went back to school and recited my literature, Rhetoric, and Mythology. In the evening I recited my Philosophy and History. I then went to pay the man for fixing the grate, bought Mamma some buttons and got some glass to go in the pit. After supper learned my Rhetoric for the next day.

Thursday 21st.

Dark and rainy all day. I went to school and recited my lessons much better than usual. On my way home I went to see Bangs but staid only a few minutes. When I got home I finished the paper which I have been making so very long. After supper studied my lessons, wrote a composition on "The Man with the Iron Mark," read some and then went to bed.

Friday Nov 22nd.

Cloudy in the morning and bright in the evening. Went to school as

usual. Mama received a letter from
Maggie saying she was back St. Louis and
found Mr Joe at the Depot waiting for
her.

Saturday Nov 23rd.

Clear and rather cold. Edith & I went
to the church and cleaned it up. After
that I went home with her and heard her
play her first piece she had taken. She
then went to the Post Office with me and
we decided to go down to see Annie Gar-
rison, remembering that she was going
away soon. We went but stood but a
little while. I then came home crocheted
some. After dinner I went up town
and did not get home till dark.
Read some after supper and looked
over my Sunday School lesson. Feeling
very tired I went to bed earlier than
usual.

1878.

Sunday Nov 24th

Bright in the morning but cloudy in the afternoon I went to Sunday School in the morning, after Sunday School went up to mail a letter to Meggie which Lida had written Saturday night. Then I ^{went} came back to church. Took a short nap after dinner, read some in a Sunday School book to Eddie. The first Sunday we have had no visitors for a good while.

Monday Nov 25th

Dark and rainy all day Lida being sick, Mary had to teach. Hanna received a ^{from Aunt Jennie} note saying that we must spend the day with her. Thanks giving bought me some zephyrs to make a table. After supper Hanna, Mary, Eddie and I went over to see Mrs. Wines but she had to leave the time on account of Ed's bad behavior.

Tuesday Nov 26th.

1878.

Cold and misty all day. Got some patterns out of the office. They were from Aunt Mattie for Mamma for applique work. After school I went to the store with Lida to get her a new dress. Went for the mail but it had not come. After supper I worked some in my tidy and studied my Rhetoric.

Wednesday Nov 27th.

Rained very hard in the morning and snowed late in the evening. After I had ^{come} home from school I read some "Italian Fairy Stories" in St. Nicholas. I liked them very much. After supper I read the third and fourth chapters of a continued story called A Jolly Fellowship. I finished to finish in my tidy and then thought I was ready for bed when I remembered that I had not written in my "Journal."

1878. Thursday Nov 28th.

Cold and clear in the morning and cloudy in the afternoon. I got up later than usual ~~and~~ wrote a composition for Friday and then got ready to go up to Aunt Jennie's. We got there at half past eleven. Aunt Sarah, Uncle Joe, Mr. Fuselli, Mr. McGordon, Mr. Woodward, and Cousin Mrs. Gosson, Lelia, ^{and} Lora were there. We had a very nice time. After dinner we went up to see Mr. Will Roddis he said he was very glad to see us as he got very lonesome staying in so long. He said that it would be six weeks before he could make and then it would be on crutches. Lelia received a letter from Miss Mary Jones inviting her to come and spend the Christmas holidays and as yet she thinks she will accept the invitation. She also received a letter from Maggie. After supper I finished my bed. And found

a quotation to take to class tomorrow.
After studying my Rhetoric I went to bed
quite tired out.

Friday Nov 29.

Clear and cold. I went to school and at
dinner time I went down town to mail a
letter for Lida to Maggie I went for the
mail which consisted of the Independent,
the New York Tribune, St Louis Globe Demo-
crat, New York World, and the Chicago Times.
I bought me some tidy cotton and then
came home.

Saturday Nov 30th.

Cold and rather cloudy. I staid at home
all the morning and went for Edith in the
evening to go to see Harriet Wright man
But Edith was not at home and so I
got Minnie. After supper I studied my
lessons.

Sunday Dec 1st.

Dark and rainy in the all day.

In the morning I went to Sunday School and church. In the evening John Kemp came down. There is to be a sacred concert to night at the Catholic Church for the benefit of the same Church.

Monday Dec. 2nd

Gold and cloudy in the morning but bright in the afternoon. I went to school as usual. After supper I studied over an hour in Literature and Rhetoric. I finished the tidying which I began Sunday night and started another one.

Tuesday Dec. 3rd

Very changeable, bright at one minute and raining the next. We had better lessons this morning than we have had for a good while. We (the girls & women) had the pleasure of seeing Master Hugh Campbell, Saml. Stunt, Emory Phillips and John Wells receive first class paddings. I studied my Rhetoric and Literature for over an hour and

read some of Holmes's Poems. After school I went down to see Lisa but she had not come home from school so I did not stay.

Wednesday Dec 4th.

Cold and windy. I went to school and from there to Miss Carrie Burnams to take Lida's dress. After school I went to Bangier. After supper I wrote a composition on "The Raven" and studied my Rhetoric and Literature.

Thursday Dec 5th.

Clear and cold. On my way to school I met Lida Gosson and she said she was to have a party Friday and I must be sure to come. Minnie told me I must stay all night with her and go. At dinner ^{time} I went down to Mrs. Burnams with Lida. After school I did some shopping. When I got home I crocheted some, and copied my composition and studied for tomorrow. Went to bed at about ten o'clock.

1878.

Friday Dec. 6th

Clear and cold in the morning and cloudy in the evening. Went to school. Stayed all night at Aunt Jennie's and went to Lilia and Cora's party. I had a very nice time. Came home at eleven o'clock and as it was Election day there was a great many people in the street.

Saturday Dec 7th.

Clear and cold. After dinner I went to see Lise Rogers. ~~We looked at "Fifties"~~ ^{stayed but a little while} ~~and then~~ decided to go up town but when we got there ~~there~~ we saw such crowds that we lost heart and started back. I never ~~and~~ heard such yells such as "Hurrah for Mallory". After the light was lit I studied my lessons for Monday and my Sunday School lesson.

Sunday Dec 8th 1878

Bright for a while but cloudy and raining the rest of the day. I went to Sunday School in the morning. Read to Eddie in the evening. Mama received a letter from Cousin Libbie Bogert.

Monday Dec 9th

Cold and rainy all day. Went to school and got home at three o'clock. Lydia received a letter from Mrs. Mary Jones. After supper I studied my lessons.

Tuesday Dec 10th

Snowed a very little last night. Mild and clear this morning but the sun came out this evening. Went to school before eight o'clock. When I got home from school I found Mrs. Mollie Watkins here. After supper I studied and read.

Wednesday Dec 11th

Clear and cold. I went to school. After I said some of my lessons I went to

the bank to get a check cashed. I went for the mail and after school I went home with Nettie Burnham and got home rather late. After supper I studied my lessons and read some.

Thursday Dec 12th.

Clear and cold. I went to school and after reciting ~~some~~ my lessons went down to Aunt Sarah's but she had gone to Emma's and Susie had gone to Louisville. I then went to Aunt Jennie to tell her that Lida would be there ~~to stay~~ all night as she wished to go up to Mrs Underwood's after tea. After that I went up to tell Mrs Underwood that Lida would not stay to tea as she had expected her to do. After school was over I went down to get Lida's dress from Mrs Burnham's and was quite tired and studied but a little.

Friday Dec 13th 1878
 Clear and cold in the morning and
 cloudy in the afternoon. The first thing
 I heard was that Emma had a little girl.
 And of course all the rest of the day I
 was crazy to see it. After supper I
 studied my lessons and finished
 me of my Thimble and began the other
 one.

Saturday Dec 14th
 Rainy in the morning but colder in
 the evening. After breakfast I cleaned up
 mamma's room and then took my bath. By
 that time dinner was ready. After dinner
 I went up to Aunt James to return some
 books on my way I met Aunt Sarah and
 she said that Emma had named the
 baby Elizabeth but would call it Bessie.
 Lida received a letter from Mag saying
 that she had the mumps. After supper
 I wrote a letter to Mag for the first time
 since she left. And after studying my

lessons for Monday and Sunday and
chochette some went to bed.

Sunday Dec 15th

Cold and cloudy all day. I went to
Sunday School and Church and heard
Mr. Wightman preach as Mr. Clarke
was not here. In the evening Uncle Joe
came down and brought us some
California pears.

Monday Dec 16th

Cold and cloudy. It tried to snow in
the morning but did not succeed.
I went to Bangs after supper but
he was not at home. Came home
and finished reading Crook Arden.
After supper Georgie's Strano came
and I went over to Mrs. Hines and
while there I read the last chapters
of "Half dozen Housekeepers". I studied
a bit and then went to bed.

Tuesday Dec 17th. 1878.

Cold and snowy. After school I went to the book store and got St Nicholas. I also went to the green house to get some flowers for Lida. On her way up to Aunt Sarah's on my way from the green house I got her a watch guard and a pair of gloves. I came home and found Miss Hollis Wilkins here and it was not long before Mr. Hooker came and he staid till five o'clock. After supper I read some in my magazine and studied.

Wednesday Dec 18th.

Clear and cold. After school I went to Bangies but found her very busy as she was having a dinner for the old men of Bowling Green. When I came home I found Mary & her self as Maria had gone out to see Emma. When she came home she brought me a lock of the wonderful baby's hair. After supper I studied me some

Thursday Dec 19th. 1878.

Cold and cloudy all day.

Friday Dec 20th.

Cold in the morning but warmer in the evening. It snowed from twelve clock until dark. I received a letter from May. Got me some zephyr and canvas and almost finished some mats. I went to bed at eleven o'clock. We are to have holiday all next week.

Saturday Dec 21st.

It rained last night and was quite wet this morning but turned colder and snowed more. I got up at half past seven and ate my breakfast and then cleared up mama's room and went up town and did some shopping for Lida and mama. After dinner I went up town and did not get back till dark. After supper I made a pair of mats and conducted my S.P. lesson

Sunday Dec 22nd. 1878.

Cold and windy all day. I went to Sunday School and church in the morning, after church I went home with Uncle Johnnie and staid to dinner. They were so very anxious that I should stay all night that I thought I would do so.

Monday Dec 23rd.

Snowing all day. I left Aunt Jennies as soon as I had eaten my breakfast. I went up to get Sallie to go to Mat the Burmanis but learning she was not at home we thought that we would go this evening so after doing some shopping I went home but staid only a few minutes before I was starting again. And this was not the last time Aunt Sallie and I guess we went to every store in town. I never had so much fun in the snow. The streets are so smooth that we could hardly walk.

After supper I made a pair of mats with the assistance of Yude. I read a very nice story called "The Slid-dum Day at St. Paul's."

Tuesday Dec 24th

Clear and cold. I went up town twice.

Wednesday Dec 25th

Clear and cold. I received the following presents: From Helen an apron beaded very nicely and some underclothes two pairs of stockings from Aunt Jennie, a gold pencil from Mrs. Fells, a bottle of perfume and a box of French candy from Annie Johnson, "Gray's Elegy in a Country Church Yard" from Aunt Sarah, ribbon blue on one side and black on the other from Susie, a handkerchief from Ed, and as many pairs of grapes oranges & candy as I could eat. I spent the day at Aunt Sarah's and had a

very nice time. Wrote a letter to Mag.

Thursday, Dec 24th/87.

Cold and snowy. Lenna Cox and Lise Riegers came up this morning. Lise brought her presents to show me. I went up town after dinner and did some shopping for mama and found a tip at the drug store which Mag had sent ~~there~~ to Ed. It had in it a beautiful card wishing him a happy Christmas. Under the card was some French candy. On my way home I met Mattie Burmann, Sallie Rooder, Minnie Gerver, and Edith Savage. They were going to Pro Kounberg's to a party which he was giving to his class. After supper I went to bed.

Friday, Dec 25th.

Cold and clear in the morning. I went up to see Sallie and Marie in the evening. Lida received a letter from

Cousin John and Cousin Pattie Woods visiting Lida, Mary, and myself to come and spend the rest of the holiday with them but as school begins Monday we can not go.

Saturday, Dec 28th.
Clear and cold. Went up town and got a dress for Lida and took it up to Mrs Kemp to be made. The train was an hour and five minutes behind hand as I did not get the mail. Lida spent the day at Grandma's day. After having a cold supper I studied my Sunday School lesson.

Sunday Dec 29th.
Snowing but not so cold. I went to Sunday school and church. After dinner I read some to Ed. Then Mrs. Moller came over and staid till dark. After supper I looked over my Sunday school lesson.

Warm in the morning but turned very cold in the evening. I went to school. After school I went with Edith and Anna to see Farmer Ferris. After supper I studied my lessons. Today Jess was 13 yrs old.

Tuesday Dec 31st.

Cloudy and cool. I went to school. Mary received a letter from Maag. We had a great deal of fun playing chess ball at school. Mrs. Dyer is very sick but is a little better this afternoon. After I ate my supper I studied my lessons.

Wednesday Jan 1st, 1879.

Cool and misty all day. I went up town in the morning and met Mr. Underwood and he asked me to go out and spend the day with Emma. I went and had a very nice time. I received a letter from Maag this morning and answered it after supper. Then I studied my lessons.

Thursday Jan 2nd 1879

Clear and cold I went to school

Friday Jan 3d

Clear and cold I went to school. After school I went up to get Linda's dress from Mrs. Kemp. I intended going to Edith's to a pound party but did not on account of the cold.

Saturday Jan 4th

Cold and bright. I went up town in the morning and came home and finished my book. After dinner I went up town again and Aunt Minerva sent Mama some preserved figs. After supper I studied my lessons.

Sunday Jan 5th

Clear and cold. The weather is the subject of discourse now. I went to Sunday school and church in the morning. In the evening I read some of Bible.

Monday Jan 6th 1879

Clear and cold I went to school. After I came home I read "The Tempest" A Midsummer Night's Dream and A Winter Tale. Aunt Bella came up and brought us some sweet cakes and nuts. After supper I studied some.

Tuesday Jan 7th

Cold and cloudy in the morning and snowed in the evening. I went to school. The streets are so slippery that the people have to take the roads. I fell down once to day. After I came home I read, "Are You Like It," Much ado about nothing. I studied on my Rhetoric for an hour but not so long on my Literature.

Wednesday Jan 8th

Snowing all day. I went to school. After I came home I read The Merchant of Venice and Two Gentlemen of Verona.

Thursday Jan 24 1879

The snow was a foot deep when we got up and it was still snowing. After breakfast I made up mama's and my bed and swept a path from the front door to the gate. I read Cymeline, King Lear, Macbeth, All's Well That Ends Well, Twelfth Night. After dinner I went up and with the expectation of getting a letter from Mary but learned that the train had been delayed in account of the snow. Ed-die wrote her first letter to Mary today. We did not have any school today.

Friday Jan 25th

In the morning it was very cold but in the evening warmer. Went up to school. After school we had a great deal of fun playing in the snow with a sled. Ed-die received

a letter from Miss Ella Thompson. Emma came in town with the baby and staid all day at Aunt Sarah's. Read Measure for Measure, Comedy of Errors, and began Simon of Athens.

Saturday Jan 11th.

Warmer and cloudy I helped Mama clear up her room. After dinner Mary and I went up town. Mama received a letter from Uncle James Yanny who is over eighty years old.

Sunday Jan 12th.

Cloudy. I went to Sunday school and church. I went home to dinner with Uncle Johnnie.

Monday Jan 13th.

Cloudy and warm in the morning but clear in the afternoon. I went to school. After supper I studied my literature and home.

Tuesday Jan 14th 1879.

Cloudy and warm. I went to school. After supper I studied Literature for one hour. Then I finished reading Simon of Athens and read Romeo & Juliet.

Wednesday Jan 15th.

Warmer than it has been for a long time. The snow and ice is melting off. The pavement is melting very rapidly. I went to school and got home rather late because I waited for the mail to come in. After supper I studied a very little and went to bed early.

Thursday Jan 16th.

Cloudy and warm in the morning but freezing in the evening. I went to school.

Friday Jan 17th.

Rainy all day. I went to school. After school I went up river again. ^{did not} it was raining very hard and I got home until dark. After supper I finished writing my composition.

Saturday Jan 18th 1878.

Clear and rather warm. I helped
Mamma clear up her room. Lusia came
down just before dinner but did
not stay long. After dinner Miss Han-
nie Hankins was here and just as she
left Miss Billie Underwood and
Emma came. Lise and I went up to
Mamma received a letter from Aunt
Nattie. After supper I studied my
Literature and Sunday School lessons.

Sunday Jan 19th

Windy, clear, and cold. I went to Sun-
day school and church.

Monday Jan 20th

Clear and not very cold. I went to school.
Mamma Wrightman was ten years old to-
day. I studied two hours in my Liter-
ature after supper. We are to be examined
on it Friday. Mary wrote a letter to
Mag today.

Tuesday Jan 21st 1879

Clear and warm. I went to school in my way I found at the office a letter for me from Mae Cabert. telling me that she had a little blue eyed sister that came in last Friday. After school I went to the office to mail a letter for Lida. Then I went to Bangs and Aunt Sarah's. Lise came up for a moment. After supper I studied my Mythology and Literature.

Wednesday ~~Thursday~~ Jan 22nd.

Clear and very pleasant in the morning but cloudy in the afternoon. I went to school. I went to see Emma and Bessie. Bessie gets prettier every day. I mailed three letters for Mamma, got a pair of shoes for Lida, and some zephyr for Mary. Uncle Joe and Aunt Sarah came down this evening. After supper I studied my Literature.

Thursday Jan 23d. 1879.
Clear and warm. Went to school.

Friday Jan 24th.
Foggy in the morning but bright in the afternoon. We were examined in Latin. Mrs. Roder, Miss Shellie, Mrs. Nightman, Mrs. Bard, Mr. Dodge, and Elgie Weston were present. We got along better than we expected. After supper I read several stories in St. Nicholas.

Cloudy and damp. Windy cold in the evening. After school I went down to Giris. After supper I read Orthodoxy and some in St. Nicholas.

Thursday Jan 30th.

Clear and a little colder. I went to school after school I took a note up to Mrs. Widdowood. Mrs. Widdowood received a letter from Mary and Miss Mary Jones.

Friday Jan 31st 1879.

Saturday Feb 1st

Clear and cooler than it has been.
Lutie Western came down in the morning.
In the evening Mary and I went up
town. After supper I studied my Sun-
day school lesson.

Sunday Feb 2nd.

Cool and bright. I went to Church &
Sunday school. Mama received a let-
ter from Uncle Whit telling us that
little Helen died Friday night and
he would take her to Cave Hill Mon-
day.

Monday Feb 3d.

I went to school. After school I went
up home with Lissie. After supper
I read and studied.

Tuesday Feb 4th.

Cloudy and cool. I went to school.
After school I went up to see how

Sallie and John were they both
have the measles. Lida received a
letter from Miss Lettie Hamlet this
morning and one from Mag this after
noon. Wednesday Feb 5th 1879.
Cool and windy.

Thursday Feb 6th
Cloudy and windy. I went to the theater
with Charlie Kemp last night.
Friday Feb 7th.

Saturday Feb 8th
Cloudy and not very cool. I went to
school. Yesterday I went home with
Uncle Johnnie to see Minnie. She
is sick in bed. They think she is
getting the measles.

Sunday Feb 9th
Windy and cloudy. I went to school.
Monday Feb 10th
Wednesday Feb 12th

Thursday Feb 13th 1879.

It snowed some last night and is very cold to-day. I went to school. Lida is sick so Mary taught. Lida was twenty three years old day before yesterday and Susie was seventeen yesterday. Lida received some poetry from Mag for her scrap book.

Friday Feb 14th.

Clear and cold. I went to school. I received four valentines. I went up to see how Sallie Roder was.

Saturday Feb 15th

Clear and cold. I went up town with Lise and mailed a valentine for Ed & me for my self. In the evening I went up town again with Lise to have her tooth pulled but when she got there she could not get up the courage to have it done.

Sunday Feb 16th 1879.
Cold and sunny. Mr. Nightman
preached as Mr. Wrike was absent I
went to Sunday school and church.
After dinner Susie came down.

Monday Feb 17th
Damp and snowy I went to school. Ma-
ma received a letter from Auntie Klyn.

Tuesday Feb 18th
Cold and slippery I went to school.
After school I went up to see Susie
but she was not at home.

Wednesday Feb 19th
Cold and damp. I went to school.
After supper I finished reading The
Tender Recollections of Jane Macgilli-
cuddy. Last Saturday night I read a
real sweet little book called Daisy
Miller. I began The Marble Faun but
don't think I shall finish it.

Bright and pleasant. I went to school, after school I played authors. At dinner time I went to the Book-Store to get St Nicholas. After supper I read in it till nearly nine o'clock.

Friday Feb 21st.

Saturday Feb 22nd.

Sunday Feb 23d

Clear and very pleasant. I went to Sunday school and church in the morning. After dinner Lucy Weston came for me to go walking with her. Soon after I got home Uncle Joe & Aunt Sarah came down.

Monday Feb 24th.

Very pleasant. I went to school. At school I walked out to see Lelia Potter. I went to the hall with Mr Underwood and Emma to the Quintette Club from Boston. I liked

it very much.

Tuesday Feb 25th 1879.
Very warm and like Spring. I went
 to school. Lida went up to the so-
 ciable at Aunt Sarah's.

Wednesday Feb 26th.
 Clear and cold. It was very warm
 last night and we had a real thunder
 storm. I went to school. Mama received
 a letter from Aunt Mattie enclosed
 was a letter from her to me. We
 got a letter from Mary written to
 the family.

Thursday Feb 27th
 Cold and bright. I went to
 school. After school I went to the
 grain house to get some flour
 for Lida she is going to the reading
 club at Mr Underwood's.

Friday Feb 28th.

Saturday Albion 1st 1879.

Warm and very pleasant. I went to an auction.

Sunday March 2nd.

Cloudy and cool. I went to Sunday school and church. After church I went home with Uncle Johnnie and Minnie. In the afternoon we went to the first church to hear a lecture delivered by a Chinese missionary.

Monday March 3d.

Cool and cloudy. I went to school.

Tuesday, March 4th.

I went to school. Last night Lida went up to Aunt Jennie's to a music club. This afternoon Miss Bessie Terri came down to school to hear us recite. After supper I studied Botany & read some stories from Ancient History.

Wednesday March 5th 79
 Very pleasant. I went to school. Aunt
 Sarah is going to Louisville in the
 morning. Lida went down to Mrs. Rogers
 and Mary over to Mr. Hines' after
 supper. I stayed at home with my
 mother and entertained her by read-
 ing aloud to her but she said that
 it was very curious reading.

Thursday March 6th 1879.
 I went to school. After school Sallie
 Lantz and my self walked out to
 the toll gate and were quite tired
 when we got back. Lida went
 to the reading club. I wrote a letter
 to Mary and played two games
 of Log machy after supper.

Friday March 7th 79.
 Warm and pleasant. I went to school.
 After supper I went down to see
 Lise. I took my cards and had

a very nice time. Johnnie came home from Chicago day before yesterday.

Saturday March 8th 1879.

This morning "High School" began and Mattie and I began studying in earnest. Yesterday Leggie and I walked out to "Drake's Pond" ridge which is said to be 5 miles from town. We are having splendid weather for walking.

Thursday Sep 16th 1880

This morning Lizzie Corning and I walked out past Mr John Gerdie's which is nearly three miles. I am becoming fonder of walking every day. Harriet and Mary went cutting this afternoon and Lida is out up on the Hill so I have been keeping house. I read "Maud" today for the second time I think it is beautiful.

Friday, Sep 17th 1880

This morning Mattie was chosen and we read a part of the "Princess". This evening I received a letter from Miss Anne Sunday begging me to come up to Louisville. Frank Strong came this evening to inform me that "Buck" Duncan would call to take me to the Club but he is either playing a joke or Mr Duncan has been misled on the way. I don't know which.

Monday, Sep. 27th, 1880.

It has been raining nearly all day. Last night I stayed up to Aunt Jimmie's. This afternoon I have been waiting Arabian Knights to Eddie. Thursday, Sep. 30th. Yesterday I went to the woods to get wild grapes and didn't go up town all day. This evening I went down

Tuesday Oct 5th 1880.

One of the hardest days of my life. Lida and I had to cook dinner and such an awful time we did have. As I went up the viscents after setting them tell our arms were aching and every thing went wrong. This morning Mr and Mrs Gibson came down and Helen stayed all day with us. For child I think Mary and Mamma were welcomed more cordially this afternoon than ever before. Thursday Oct 7th 1880.

This morning I went down to see Edith and Mattie. This afternoon I took my walk up on the hill but did not see any. Before I reached the reservoir I heard the fire alarm soon after I saw that the asphalt factory was burning and since they were unable to get water any way even if I went to the ground, naturally Lizzie and I went

Mama and Mary spent the day at Mrs. Roden. I wrote a letter to Addie this morning. This afternoon I went to the woods and got hickory nuts. Lise came up this evening for the first time since school began. I was very glad to see her. Mr. Gibson leaves tomorrow.

Friday, Oct. 13th 1880.

This morning I went to see Hattie and she seemed to be delighted to see me. This afternoon I received a letter from Mr. Hupander. I heard that Dr. Cottrell was to be here another year and I am very glad for I like him so much. I wrote a little letter to Ethel Bostick. I have begun the second volume of "Marble Faun". I went up to Aunt Sarah's this morning. Joseph is getting to be a charming young gentleman.

Thursday, Oct 14th, 1880

We have had April weather today.

This morning Lloyd came up for me to take a walk. We got in sight of the bridge when it began pouring down rain and we had to stop in a house and spend several hours. Lida and I made an X & out of flowers for the Hay.

Friday, Oct 15th

It has been pouring down all day. The Club met here tonight and such a time as we had. Harry, Lizzie and Buckner and Frank were the only ones here and we could not read any. Saturday Oct 16th

This afternoon we all went to the woods, when we started our games consisted of seven but three of them became muddled and useless. The pleasant part of it all was riding in a big horse wagon with

Wednesday, Oct. 20th, 1880.

To day has been very pleasant. This morning I had Mr. Bapst build a canopy over the road where we had finished it, so we were very comfortable for it to rain immediately. Then afternoon, mamma and I went down to see Mrs. Agatha, she walk to us from the wonderful "Journal" Agatha's letters to I have heard a great deal about it. I was not disappointed in the least. Master Frank refused to show him self because he was not dressed in "his best". That reminds me I read a very short little story in the Atlantic called "His Best". I read a biography of "Mary Queen of Scots" and could hardly keep from crying. Mamma has gone to Mrs. Tracy's.

Thursday Oct 26th 1840.

Just went to Louisville this morning and Mrs Byrd and went to the town to see her. After dinner I went up in the river with Lida and Mrs Byrd. Lida read to us. I received a letter from Mr Alexander. Saturday Oct 30th. It has been raining all this week. This afternoon Mrs Byrd and I dressed up in our gowns and went around peddling for a fair which we did not meet with much success. Mrs Byrd's name was "Mrs Parker" and I was her daughter "Maria". She acted her part to perfection. I have not been up town today.

Sunday Oct 31st

Nov 16th 1888. It seems almost impossible that two weeks have slipped by and I have not even opened my dear old journal. We had our first snow fall day before yesterday and a very pretty ^{paper} fall. It was in the morning on the brick road and yellow chestnut leaves. This morning Mattie came down to work.
