

This Indenture made this first day of January 1833.  
between Cyrus W. Wilson and Nancy W. his wife of the State of  
Kentucky and County of Logan of the first part and Samuel Arnold  
of the second part, witnesses, that the said Cyrus W. and  
Nancy W. for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to them  
in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have  
bargained, sold and conveyed, and doth by these presents bargain  
sell, and convey to the said Samuel Arnold and his heirs &c  
for ever a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County &  
State above mentioned and bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning  
at an Elm and two Whitesaks an easterly corner of a survey made  
in the name of Alexander Bailey running thence with his line  
N 14 E 150 poles to two Elms and a Sugar tree corner to S. Bailey  
on a line of a 200 acres survey in the name of O. Dewit, thence  
with his line S 40 E 70 poles to a Sugar tree and Whitesak his  
corner, thence N 44 E 110 poles to a Whitesak and dead Black  
Oak corner to said Dewit, on S. M. Crackins line thence S 40 E  
60 poles to a Post oak corner to M. Crackin and R. Wilson thence  
South 100 poles to a Poplar and Sugar tree corner to Wilson, thence  
East 90 poles to a Whitesak and Elm corner to a 200 acres survey  
in the name of the Newton Academy, thence with a line off  
that survey S 10 E 180 poles to a White Oak on Pollards line corner  
to a 108 acres survey in the name of P. Kennerly, thence N 15 W 150  
poles to a Hickory and Post oak, corner to Kennerly, thence West  
54 poles to a Sugar tree thence S 56 W 110 poles to an Ash and Post  
Oak, thence N 65 W 66 poles to an Ash, Sugar tree and Post oak  
thence S 38 W 78 poles to a Whitesak on a line of a 200 acres  
survey in the name of John Hughes, thence with his line N  
55 W 80 poles to the Beginning, containing 250 acres, lying on the  
waters of the Elklick fork of muddy river, and being the land  
Patented to Thomas E. Wilson bearing date November 11<sup>th</sup> 1824.

Do Have and to hold the before described tract or parcel of,  
land with its appurtenances to the said Samuel Arnold his heirs  
and assigns forever, and the said Cyrus W. Wilson and wife, covenant  
to and with the said Saml. Arnold that they have an indefea-  
sible estate in the simple in and to the before described tract or  
parcel of land, and that they will warrant and forever defend the  
title thereof to the said Samuel Arnold and his heirs and assigns  
forever, free from the claims of the said Cyrus W. and wife and  
free from the claims or claims of all and every person or persons  
whatsoever, in testimony of which the said Cyrus W. & wife have  
unto set their names and seals the date first written.
