This agreement between Adams Shulock and
J R Cobb of Logan County Ky.

The said Cobb agrees for the
consideration hereinafter expressed that he will work the
farm of said Shulock from January 1870 to January
1871 under the direction of said Shulock that he will
work faithfully and constantly at any and all kinds of
work usually performed upon a farm that may be required
by said Shulock, giving his whole and undivided attention
to the business, attend closely to and take especial care
of the work stock and other live stock on said farm pro-
tect from injury the improvements, orchards, and farming imple-
ments & tools be careful to keep the fences up and in repair &
keep the stock out of the yard garden & orchard, burn no rails
and use no wood for fuel except from dead & fallen timber
and tops of trees and to use fire wood Economically, and to cut

look on the 1st day of January 1871, pleasantly and with
out notice with the fences, riders on the fences, House
yards, Barns, Gardens, Orchards &c in good order, glass in
the windows and all in as good repair as at present the
usual wear & tear Excluded.

Said Whelock to compensate the said Cobb for the labor
of said Agnes to furnish him with and permit him and
his family to live in the House on said farm. The rooms to be
occupied being the "family room", "dining room" and the "little
room" at the end of and adjoining the dining room, the bal-
ance of the House is reserved and Cobb is also to have
the use of the "kitchen".

Said Whelock is to furnish work stock and farming imple-

forfeiting all his rights under this Contract. And further it is understood that if said Cobb should not conduct himself soberly, pleasantly and industriously and should not attend closely to business, giving it his undivided attention, he is to vacate the premises and said Winlock for any such cause has a full right to the possession of his house & premises, and the said Cobb agrees to give the same up to him at any time he may demand them being reason for such demand.

It is also distinctly understood that the Enter Farm is to be under the control of said Winlock and is to be conducted by said Cobb, according to the instructions of him the sd Winlock.

The said J. R. Cobb agrees to pay to the said Winlock for the services of Dan, a mulatto boy, the sum of 12 ^{50th mo} for first six months and 10⁰⁰ for mo for the last 6 mo. being One hundred & thirty five Dollars per annum to be taken out of the crop, a lien being retained to secure the payment thereof. But if anything should occur to prevent sd Winlock from furnishing sd Boy, Cobb is to make arrangements for other labor.

The Hogs are to be fed by Winlock & Cobb as a partnership stock. Each furnishing an equal quantity of feed but Cobb to attend to the same.
