

of Three years during all which turn the
apprentice his said master shall observe his secrets
His lawful commands every where readily
obey he shall do no damage to his said
master nor see it done by others without
letting or giving notice to his said master he
shall not waist his said masters goods nor
lend them unlawfully to any man he shall
not absent himself from his said master service

but in all things behave as a faithful
 apprentice ought to do during the said turn
 and the said master shall use the utmost of his
 endeavors to teach or cause to be taught or instructed
 for the trade or mistry of a saddler and procure
 for him sufficient meet drink apperrel
