Miss Baldy and Mrs Coleman to work together and to overlap and smingle their duties as they find needful for the best interest of the business in emergency or such times as they may deem it advisable.

Strictest economy to be considered in all expenses, with immediate curtailment of every unnecessary expense of any kind, where and when possible.

Careful discussion of estimates and refusal of orders that are unsafe and refusal of credit favor to unknown or unsafe customers is urged and insisted.

Reports as outlined to Miss Baldy to be regularly sent Mrs Beckwith as to various details of the business, management, progress, volume, etc.

Working details given verbally to Miss Baldy & Mrs Coleman, repeating Mrs Coleman to employ her help for work room. Miss Baldy to



entire charge of Julia and the upstairs room. To be to be on duty generally as always and Miss Baily to supply extra help or a boy as needed at her discretion but to try and keep the expense at less than half or not more than half Joe D's wage if possible.

Miss Baily and Mrs Coleman to have Indre and milk at cost.

Ora to have her clerk's 10% reduction from regular retail prices. No one in store to serve themselves but be served by others in same manner any customer is served. A double check system in store & throughout the billing and bookkeeping as near as possible.

No one else to have discounts or cut rates except as may be deemed advisable to Miss Baily and Mrs Coleman, jointly considered for the best interest of the business.

H. Saylor (B. Saylor) and has not at all taken the full prerogative he has taken, and which might have proven the better plan had he used his own judgment without bias.

He wishes to record the fact
