 for the Reception of members 2<sup>nd</sup> Our  
 Pastor declining to serve us any longer  
 we agreed to postpone the election of  
 another until our next meeting  
 3<sup>rd</sup> Agreed to set apart the Friday  
 before the first Saturday in next month  
 as a day of prayer & fasting, also to  
 meet and attend to any <sup>business</sup> that may come  
 before the Church. Signed by Order

The Church met on the 1<sup>st</sup> Friday  
 in August 1848 and after worship  
 proceeded to business 1<sup>st</sup> Opened a  
 door for the reception of members  
 2<sup>nd</sup> Read the rules of Decorum  
 3<sup>rd</sup> Invited Br. & Sis. of sister Churches  
 to seats with us. 4<sup>th</sup> The church proceeded  
 to elect a pastor and thereupon Br. John  
 Miller was chosen who declines accepting  
 the call; but will preach and act in  
 the capacity of a pastor for the Church  
 when present. 5<sup>th</sup> The church proceeded to  
 appoint the Br. clerk to write a letter of conference  
 to the <sup>next</sup> association, and also to appoint  
 Brethren John Miller David Miller  
 Wm Howell Jacob J. Miller and Jefferson  
 Miller to read the same and <sup>assist</sup> in  
 course: which will be at Brush Cr

accepted the call 5<sup>th</sup> appointed Bro.  
Geo S Miller & Geo W Ferris  
to present subscriptions to the  
church and congregation for the  
Benefit of Eld John Miller and  
report the amount at the next
