ry of all and singular the goods Chattels & Credits of the s<sup>d</sup>  
decd<sup>d</sup> which hereafter shall come to the hands possession or know-  
ledge of the s<sup>d</sup> John Caldwell or into the hands possession  
or knowledge of any other person or persons for him and the  
same so made do exhibit into the County Court afores<sup>d</sup>  
when required by s<sup>d</sup> Court And such goods Chattels & Cre-  
dits do well and truly administer according to law And  
further do make a just and true account of his doings  
and doing ther on when required by said Court and all  
the rest of said goods Chattels & Credits which shall be  
found remaining on the account of s<sup>d</sup> do administer the  
same being first examined and allowed by s<sup>d</sup> Court for  
the time being shall deliver and pay to such persons  
Respectively as are intitled to the same by law And if it  
shall here after appear that any trust well and true tes-  
tament was made by the s<sup>d</sup> decd<sup>d</sup> And the same be proved in
