One Hundred and Fifty Dollars, to be paid to the said  
Banner Council, No. 7, or its successors  
and assigns, to which payment we are well and truly bound, as also are  
our heirs, executors and administrators.

The conditions of this obligation are such that, WHEREAS the above  
bounden, Val Fry, has been duly elected and in-  
stalled as Treasurer of the said  
Banner Council, No. 7 for a term of Eighteen  
months from the Fifth day of April, 1898, and as  
such officer has charge of certain funds, books and property belonging
