Thank you for your interesting letter of January 31 in which you refer to my schooldays at Bowling Green. I attended school there at the old Southern Normal School and Business College from September 1886 to June 1887. Prof. A. W. Mell was President and Prof. J. Tom Williams was at the head of the business college. The main hall was on the righthand side of the street leading west from the post office and court house. My brother and I roomed over the Turner drug store on the southwest corner of the Park.

Prof. J. R. Alexander, who recently died, was one of my teachers. Prof. Edward Norris, who later became Governor of Montana, and who is now dead, was another teacher of mine. I spent a most enjoyable and profitable ten months at this school.


