

# Minutes

Executive Committee

Logan Presbyterial

February 22<sup>nd</sup> 1927

Logan Presbyterial Executive Board met in regular session, Feb. 22<sup>nd</sup> 1927, with the Woodburn Auxiliary, at the home of Mrs Carl Chaney. Meeting was called to order at 10:30 by the President.

Mrs. Leodell Temple, Secretary for Hospital Work, lead the devotional reading for Scripture lesson 13<sup>th</sup> chapter Cor. I

The objects for that date listed in Year Book of Prayer were remembered in prayer by Mrs. Goodnight and Mr. Roller.

Minutes were read and approved.

Executive <sup>were</sup> F. H. Goodnight Franklin and

Le. B. Carpenter Bowling Green, were invited to seat as corresponding members. with power to vote.

Two letters of resignation were read: One from Mr John S. Ray Auburn Ky, Secretary for Senior Young People; the other from Miss Gertrude Mc Kinney Adairville Ky. Secretary for Stewardship. With much regret both resignations were accepted and the secretary instructed to write each of them expressing the deep regret of the Presbytery for the great loss <sup>sustained</sup> in releasing them from office.

The President suggested that the names of Mrs. J. A. Book and Mrs. Le. B. Carpenter be submitted to the nominating committee to fill these two vacant offices: Mrs. Book for Stewardship, and Mrs. Carpenter for Sec. of Senior Young People. The report of nominating committee to be made at the annual meeting. The suggestion was unanimously approved.

Apportionment committee reported the work done and with a few very slight changes suggested by the Treasurer, who could not be present when the assignment was made, the report was adopted.

Treasurer reported a deficit in Auxiliary apportionments which if not met would result in a heavy

deficit for Logan Presbyterial at the end of the year.

Secretary for Hospital Work reported that five Auxiliaries had contributed supplies amounting in value to \$61.

Secretary for ~~Stewardship~~ Literature reported that the local blanks had been returned and the figures failed to show the desired increase in study classes and subscriptions.

Junior and Intermediate Secretaries for Young People reported their blanks just received from the Boards and would be mailed out to local organizations immediately.

Appreciation committee was appointed and at this juncture the meeting was adjourned for the noon recess, at which time a dainty and delicious luncheon was exquisitely served by Mrs. Carl and Mrs. Hoyt Chaney.

At 1:30 P.M. business was resumed and Mrs. Goodnight reported that the time for the meeting of Logan Presbyterial had been set for April 5<sup>th</sup>. Mrs. Goodnight also reported that Mr. Mitchell could not be present as speaker for Presbyterial but that a lady would come instead.

Under the head of "new business" Mrs. Temple spoke to the question of delegates to Young People's Conference. She said that as trained leaders were a prime essential to success in the work, she would suggest that the three Y. P. S. be sent to



to the conference at Danville in June, and offered a resolution to that effect, including also a provision that if the Synodical fund were not sufficient, local auxiliaries be asked to make up the deficit. The resolution was adopted by Executive; to be read as a recommendation to Presbyterial.

A motion was made and carried that the printed programs for Presbyterial bear the names of local auxiliaries which had met their apportionment and ~~and~~ the amount.

Following a discussion of the Presbyterial program, a motion carried that the pageant-play, 'America Grows Up' be given as part of the evening program.

Mrs. Goodnight made an earnest plea that the lack of properly qualified candidates for missionaries be remembered as a special object of prayer and intercession.

She also called attention to the Tithes League and urged that the office of Stewardship be given greater emphasis in the local society and that tithing and proportionate giving be stressed by Stewardship programs.

Following this her brief talk on the strengthening of the spiritual life by systematic and

generous giving, was very impressive

A very characteristic letter from Miss Benfer principal of the school at Mt Vernon, was read by Mrs Goodnight. The wonderful work of Langdon Memorial was described, and the earnest plea for prayer could not go unheeded.

Having finished all other business, the Executive studied the annual report blanks and filled them out.

After a word of appreciation by the committee the meeting adjourned with the Missions benediction, to meet at Franklin April 6<sup>th</sup>
