Robert Craddock of *Hermitage* in the County of *Warren* in the State of *Kentucky* has applied to the Secretary of the Treasury for the benefits of the act, entitled "An Act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the Revolution," approved on the 15th of May, 1828. He states that he was as an officer on the Continental line, and served as such *to the end of the War*

at which period he was a *Lieutenant* in the *fourth* regiment of the *Virginia* line; and that he received commutation certificates for the five years full pay granted by the resolve of 22 March, 1783; and, further, that he has received as a pensioner since the 3d of March, 1826, *nothing*, ~~dollars, paid to him by the agent~~ in the State of

The Third Auditor is requested to report how far these several statements are corroborated by the records in his office.

It appears by the records in this office, that final settlement certificates have been issued for the commutation of five years full pay to *Robert Craddock* *Lieutenant* in the *Virginia* line, amounting to *Sixteen Hundred* dollars.

It further appears that *Robert Craddock* is now on the pension list of the *any* agency, and has been since the 3rd of March 1826 ~~at the rate of~~ *per month*

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of an act, entitled
"an act, for the relief of Certain Surviving Officers and
Soldiers of the army of the Revolution" Approved on the
15th. day of May 1828; I, Robert Craddock of the Hermitage,
in the county of Warren, in the State of Kentucky do
hereby declare that I was an officer in the Continental
line of the army of the Revolution, and served as such
to the end of the war. at which period I was a Lieutenant
in the 4th. Regiment of Infantry of the Virginia line,
having been arranged thereto, during my captivity at
Charlestown. and having been in Dec. 1781, ordered by Col.
Febigar to take Command in a Battalion forming and destined
for Georgia; to which we marched the same winter. and,
I also declare, that I afterwards received a certificate (com-
monly called a commutative certificate) for a sum equal
to the amount of five years full pay; which sum was
offered by the resolve of Congress of the 22^d. of March 1783.
instead of the half pay for life. To which I was entitled,
under the resolve of the 21st. of October 1780.
