

This Indenture made this Eighteenth day of February in the year of
 our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty five between
Benjamin Logan of the county of Sumner and State of Virginia
 the one part and Richard Jackson of the county and State of Virginia
 the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Logan for and in
 consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds current money of Virginia
 to him in hand paid by the said Richard Jackson the receipt whereof he
 hath hereby acknowledged. All the said Benjamin Logan hath granted, conveyed,
 sold, aliened and confirmed, and by these presents hath given, conveyed, sold,
 aliened and confirmed unto the said Richard Jackson certain tract or
 parcel of land lying and being in the county aforesaid and is
 bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at two Dutch trees, the Northeast
 corner of said Benjamin Logan's plantation. Thence thence with a line of
 the same South twenty two degrees East one hundred and sixty poles to a
 white oak and ash, thence South sixty eight degrees West one hundred poles
 to two quarters of a clover corner, thence North twenty two degrees West
 one hundred and sixty poles to a white oak & hickory. Thence North 68° 100
 poles to the beginning being part of the Benjamin Logan plantation containing one hundred acres
 and all the balance, right, title, interest claim, and demand of him the said
Benjamin Logan of in and to the said land and premises, and all goods,
 chattels and writings touching or in any wise concerning the same;
 to have and to hold, the said land and premises hereby conveyed and
 sold with the appurtenances, to him the said Richard Jackson his heirs and
 assigns for ever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said
Jackson and of his heirs and assigns for ever. And the said Benjamin
Logan hath hereby conveyed and given to and with the said Richard
Jackson his heirs Executors Administrators, and assigns, that he the said
Benjamin Logan his heirs Executors and Administrators, shall and will
 warrant and for ever defend the land and premises with the appurtenances
 hereby conveyed and sold, to him the said Richard Jackson his heirs
 Executors and assigns against the claim of all and every other person,
 or persons whatsoever who might pretend the said Benjamin Logan
 hath conveyed it to his hands and seals the Day and year first above written
 sealed and delivered
