I have this day at the office of Geo C Rogers in Bowling Green heard the evidence in relation to the facts stated in the petition of Joel S Perkins A whom Wm B Thompson was in 1862 regularly bound as an apprentice by the Warren County Court, said evidence being heard in the presence of Major Callahan & others including the said Thompson I am of opinion from the proof that said Thompson was at the time of his enlistment in 34<sup>th</sup> Ky Volunteers and yet is under the age of Eighteen years and of course his enlistment without the consent of sd Perkins A whom he was bound was illegal and he should be and it is ordered that he is hereby discharged from further service in the army of the United States under his present enlistment and that he be returned to said Joel S Perkins

I was able for the Invalid Corps  
 & the Surgeon of course was now gone  
 away well rather than go in to that  
 I preferred some duty near to the  
 Commander of the post ordered me  
 to report to Maj. Mattingly Comdg  
 fortifications for duty who placed  
 me Supt of the works on fortifications  
 which duty I discharged until I  
 was taken down sick again on the  
 28th of Feb last. Since that time  
 I have not been able to do any  
 duty & the Surgeon attending me  
 Certifies that I am not able for  
 Service in neither the regular or  
 Invalid Corps  
 now the discharge Regt is in our  
 place under order for one's change &  
 I <sup>am</sup> ~~am~~ sick & no chance to have  
 any discharge made out in the usual  
 way that I wish you to ask the  
 favour granted me of a discharge  
 by the Sec<sup>y</sup> of War  
 That as I did discharge the duty of

an officer from Nov 1<sup>st</sup> 61 to  
Apr 1<sup>st</sup> 62 that I drew no cation  
from the govt until April 62  
that I clothed me self & I  
was to a quite an expense in  
clothing & caring for my @ &  
that I had a considerable  
account to do with my Co in  
many instances of which I had too  
of receipt in to considerable  
expense while the army  
was on the move from Leosith  
to Battosack we was ordered  
to have all our belts & Blankets  
but one change of clothes & one  
blanket & all of mine I had  
bought my self & I left & have  
never got them over \$100. worth  
of clothes all the clothing I have  
had from the govt amounts to  
only \$38.13 - I have since I  
went into Genl Vanpleins staff  
been on duty every day Sundays  
not except being in close proximity.

to the enemy until I was taken  
sick ~~last~~ & left that department  
last summer  
had I of been Commissioner  
I could not of done any more  
than I have done & should of  
drawn over a hundred Dollars  
a month. Now I have only draw  
\$13- per month not one cent of  
extra pay now is it too much to  
ask to be honorably discharged  
when my health has become so  
poor that I am not able to serve  
any longer. That I may try &  
regain it to some extent by such  
means as I could present too by  
being at liberty so to do
