To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

Whereas *John Hollenbeck of Ripley County Indiana*
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at *Petersburg in the State of*
Indiana whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *John Hollenbeck*
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
Fractional Section numbered Three and Four in Township Nine (north) of Range Thirteen (east) in the State of Indiana
Containing Six hundred and Sixty one acres and Seventy nine hundredths of an Acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been
purchased by the said *John Hollenbeck*

Now Know Ye, that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in
such case made and provided, have Given and Granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said *John Hollenbeck*
the said tract above described; To have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of
whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *John Hollenbeck*
and *his* heirs and assigns forever.
