KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of a certificate N^o 2364 (the State Price paid without interest granted by the Commissioners in 1798) agreeably to an act of assembly for encouraging and granting relief to settlers

there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto

Edward Word a son of Samuel Coker who was a son of Andrew Mc^e Radin who was a son of William Williams

a certain TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, containing two hundred acres by survey bearing date the 17th day of September 1801 lying and being in the County of Warren on the North side of Pigg's Run running on the North Eastwardly side of the Six Mile Creek on Timber and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning on two post oaks Samuel R. Coker's a son of Jesse Hughes and William Moore's a son of John Mc^e Neil who was a son of Benjamin Hamptons corner running with said Moore's line N⁴¹° East 110 poles to a stake in the said Coker's line passing said Moore's corner a stake, at 108 poles thence with said Coker's line N⁷²° East 132 poles to his corner on Jones's Military Survey 4 post oaks thence with said Jones's line N⁴⁵° East 177 poles to a stake, on said line thence S⁸⁶° East 150 poles to a stake, in the open Warrens thence S⁴° West 170 poles to a stake, on the old William Moore's line thence with his line N⁸⁶° West 123 poles to two Hickories the apex of Samuel R. Coker's corner on said line of Moore's thence with said line of Coker's line S¹⁵° West 106 poles to the Beginning
